**The Planning Act 2008 - Section 89 and The Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 - Rule 8 etc.**  
**Application by Norfolk County Council for an Order Granting Development Consent for the Great Yarmouth Third River Crossing**

We are instructed by Great Yarmouth Port Company Limited (GYPC) and Great Yarmouth Port Authority (GYPA). We wish to respond to the Examining Authorities Rule 8 letter.

In line with the Rule 8 letter we believe that it would advantageous for the Examining Authority to see the following areas on the accompanied site visit programmed for the week of 18 November:-

Initially our clients think the Examining Authority should see the Outer Harbour and thereafter the Inner Harbour along the River Yare from the sea right up to Haven Bridge. You will, no doubt, be encouraged also to visit the specific areas where the proposed bridge is to be constructed and, as far as it is within our clients' control, we will seek to make the areas available for a safe and secure visit. If the Examining Authority felt it convenient to start the tour from the Outer Harbour there are facilities such as Car Parking at the offices of our clients, Vanguard House, South Beach Parade, NR30 3GY, which could be made available for the few who will wish/need to accompany the Examining Authority on the site visit.

Additionally we would recommend that a representative of GYPC and GYPA are in attendance on the site visit.

We also wish to notify the Examining Authority that our clients will wish to speak and be represented at the issue specific hearing in relation to Port matters. Those attending are likely to include Gary Doyle, Harbour Master, Richard Goffin, Port Director, Bryan Forrest, Senior Manager Marine Operations and Nicholas Brown of this firm. It may also be necessary for Mr Brown to speak at the DCO Hearing.
