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1 Introduction

1.1 Purpose of this document

- 1.1.1 This Statement of Common Ground ('SoCG') has been prepared in respect of an application for a Development Consent Order ('the Application') under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 ('PA 2008') for the proposed M54 to M6 Link Road ('the Scheme') made by Highways England Company Limited ('Highways England') to the Secretary of State for Transport ('Secretary of State').
- 1.1.2 This SoCG does not seek to replicate information that is available elsewhere within the Application documents. All documents are available on the Planning Inspectorate website.
- 1.1.3 This SoCG has been produced to confirm to the Examining Authority where agreement has been reached between the parties and where agreement has not (yet) been reached. SoCG are an established means in the planning process of allowing all parties to identify and focus on specific issues that may need to be addressed during the Examination.
- 1.1.4 This SoCG has been drafted by Highways England based on correspondence with Four Ashes Limited during the development of the Scheme and records the matters agreed and not agreed.
- 1.1.5 The draft was provided to Four Ashes Limited on 23 October 2020, with comments received on 28 October 2020 and incorporated. We are in discussion with Four Ashes to resolve the remaining issues. Highways England will continue to work to finalise the contents of this SoCG at the earliest opportunity as the Application proceeds through the Examination process.

1.2 Parties to this Statement of Common Ground

- 1.2.1 This SoCG has been prepared by Highways England as the applicant and Four Ashes Limited.
- 1.2.2 Highways England became the Government-owned Strategic Highways Company on 1 April 2015. It is the highway authority in England for the strategic road network and has the necessary powers and duties to operate, manage, maintain and enhance the network. Regulatory powers remain with the Secretary of State. The legislation establishing Highways England made provision for all legal rights and obligations of the Highways Agency, including in respect of the Application, to be conferred upon or assumed by Highways England.
- 1.2.3 Four Ashes Limited are the promoters of the West Midlands Interchange (WMI) Strategic Rail Freight Interchange ('SRFI') which was consented pursuant to The West Midlands Rail Freight Interchange Order 2020 on 4 May 2020. The site is west of M6 J12 and is bound by the A449 to the west and the A5 to the north.

1.3 Terminology

- 1.3.1 In the tables in the Issues chapter of this SoCG, 'Not Agreed' indicates a final position. 'Under discussion' indicates where these points will be the subject of ongoing discussion wherever possible to resolve, or refine, the extent of disagreement between the parties. 'Agreed' indicates where the issue has been resolved.
- 1.3.2 It can be taken that any matters not specifically referred to in the Issues chapter of this SoCG are not of material interest or relevance to Four Ashes Limited, and therefore have



not been the subject of any discussions between the parties. As such, those matters can be read as agreed, only to the extent that they are either not of material interest or relevance to Four Ashes Limited.





2 Record of Engagement

Proposed M54 J1 closure and diversion route	Four Ashes Limited require further discussion with Highways England in regard to minimising the impact of the proposed M54 J1 closure on the WMI development, both during construction and operation. FAL notes that the Outline Traffic Management Plan prepared by the Applicant states that final Construction Traffic Management Plans (CTMP) will be prepared in consultation with the local planning and highway authority and other organisations such as local business. The CTMP is secured by a suitable Requirement of the Development Consent Order. FAL would expect to be consulted as part of this approval process however, as drafted, Requirement 10 does not require the Applicant to consult with any other organisation other than the local planning and highway authority. FAL awaits details of how the Applicant will commit to communicate the updates to any Traffic Management proposals and the	Highways England will continue to engage with Four Ashes Limited with regard to plans for the M54 J1 works and proposed A449/A5 diversion route, including consulting Four Ashes Limited on the detail of the Construction Traffic Management Plan. 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construction of the Proposed Development if approved. Four Ashes Limited (FAL) have raised concerns in regard to ensuring the traffic modelling for the diversion includes the interim level of floor area occupied at WMI, without the A449 / A5 link road in place. As of 12 February 2021, FAL awaits details of this assessment. FAL reserves its rights to comment further on suitable requirements that may be required to be included within the DCO. Until further information is provided by HE to FAL on the assumptions included in their modelling of the WMI traffic volumes it is difficult to form an opinion of the impact of the construction phase of the M54-M6 NSIP on an already approved NSIP at West Midlands Interchange. Further delays in providing this information would mean that FAL reserve their right to propose amendments to the

	FAL supports the principle of the M54 / M6 link road Project, but wishes to ensure the WMI DCO can be delivered as planned during the construction of the Applicant's Proposed Development.
