8.3 Accompanied Site Inspection Itinerary

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1 Introduction

1.1 Purpose of this document

- 1.1.1 This document has been prepared in response to the letter from the Planning Inspectorate titled 'Planning Act 2008 Section 88 and 89 and The Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 Rule 6 and 8, dated 2 May 2023 and 25 May 2023 respectively.
- 1.1.2 Annex B to the Rule 8 letter sets out the Examination Timetable for the Development Consent Order (DCO) application by the Examining Authority (ExA). Item 4 states that at Deadline 1 (D1) the Applicant should submit a draft itinerary for the Accompanied Site Inspection (ASI).
- 1.1.3 The Examining Authority (ExA) will undertake an Accompanied Site Inspection on Monday 10 July 2023.
- 1.1.4 As per Item 4 in the Rule 8 letter, the draft itinerary is to allow all parties to comment on the draft itinerary and propose additional locations, with supporting justification, by Deadline 2 (Tuesday 15 June 2023).
- 1.1.5 The ExA will publish the final itinerary for the ASI on 22 June 2023.
- 1.1.6 This itinerary has been prepared in response to these requirements and has taken into consideration the Examining Authority's Unaccompanied Site Inspections (USI) on 9 March 2023 (EV-001) and 28 April 2023 (EV-002), and information contained within the Rule 8 letter.
- 1.1.7 This document sets out a suggested itinerary prepared by National Highways (the Applicant) for an ASI to be carried out by the ExA during the Examination of the M3 Junction 9 Improvement Scheme.



2 Suggested Itinerary

2.1.1 The suggested itinerary and stopping points are set out in Table 1.1. This is accompanied by a map representing the route and the stops in section 2.10. Some of the locations would not be visible on the Location Plan (2.1, APP-005). The map in Figure 1 provided in section 2.10 depicts the route with a location plan below in order to aid orientation and understanding of the proposed route.

2.2 Start and Finish Points

- 2.2.1 The site inspection will start at the Colebrook Street Car Park (Colebrook St, Winchester SO23 3SD), adjacent to the Mercure Winchester Wessex Hotel and will act as the meeting point.
- 2.2.2 The inspection will finish at the Colebrook Street Car Park, following the penultimate stop M 'Existing junction including underpasses'.

2.3 Attendance at the ASI

- 2.3.1 The final itinerary for the ASI will be published on the project page of the National Infrastructure Planning website at least a week before the ASI. The Applicant notes that ASIs are not an opportunity for any party to make any oral representations to the ExA about the Proposed Development, but the Examining Authority may invite participants to indicate specific features or sites of interest.
- 2.3.2 It may be necessary to limit the numbers of persons who accompany the ExA for logistical and safety reasons, but it should be possible for arrangements to be made for Interested Parties (or their representatives) to join the inspection at specified locations within the itinerary.
- 2.3.3 Those planning to attend should notify the Planning Inspectorate Case Team if they wish to be considered for joining for the whole day or meet the inspection at a specific location within the itinerary, or at a new location. Those joining for the whole day are referred to hereafter as the Core Attendees.
- 2.3.4 Parties wishing to attend the site visit should:
 - provide a contact mobile number to the Planning Inspectorate's Case Team for the day,
 - notify the Planning Inspectorate's Case Team if there are any changes in attendance, and
 - ensure the Planning Inspectorate's Case Team is made aware of any special access requirements for any participants.



2.4 Transport

- 2.4.1 The Applicant will provide a minibus for the site visit. This approach has been proposed to minimise transport emissions and disruption along the local road network and due to parking availability.
- 2.4.2 The vehicle(s) will be used to transport Core Attendees for the entire ASI. Any Interested Parties planning to join for part of the visit along the route will be expected to arrange their own mode of transport, but have regard to the itinerary timings, and locations stated within this document.

2.5 Joining the ASI on the day

- 2.5.1 For those joining the Core Attendees, these participants will start the visit from Colebrook Street Car Park. All Core Attendees are asked to arrive and report to the Applicant no later than 08:45am. This is to allow for a Health and Safety briefing and allocation of people to the transport provided. The Applicant will be at the venue by 08:30am to welcome participants.
- 2.5.2 The Health and Safety briefing will start promptly at 09:00am. We are not able to wait or delay the briefing so as to enable the site visit to start promptly with the departure of vehicles from the venue at 09:30am; any parties who are not present at the requested time or arrive late cannot be accommodated.
- 2.5.3 It is not possible to predict precisely how long each part of the inspection will last. For those Interested Parties wishing to join at an alternative location, the Applicant will use their mobile contact number to keep those Interested Parties notified of progress and expected arrival times where they are due to meet.

2.5.4 Safety, Clothing and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- 2.5.5 Some of the locations will be observed on foot, possibly on uneven ground and accessed via local roads with narrow or no footway provision.
- 2.5.6 Attendees are advised to wear appropriate clothing, including sturdy footwear appropriate for walking. The weather is likely to be warm so appropriate items to protect from the sun such as hats, suncream, and appropriate clothing in the heat is advised. Waterproof clothing should be brought in the event of inclement weather forecast.
- 2.5.7 National Highways will provide high-visibility jackets to be worn by attendees. High visibility vests will be provided for attendees and must be worn at all times when out of the vehicle. When stopping on a live road, a mini-briefing will be provided before attendees exit the vehicle, which will include where to stand and how to remain safe. All attendees:
 - Must follow instructions given to them by the Health and Safety staff representative and provided by the risk assessment.



 Are responsible for their own safety and must never act in a manner that might reduce the safety of themselves or others.

2.6 Lunch and Comfort breaks

- 2.6.1 Please note refreshments and lunch will not be provided. A lunch break has been included in the itinerary at Tesco Extra in Winnall which also has comfort facilities.
- 2.6.2 Further welfare facilities will be available at the Keir National Highways Depot (Location L) and at the start and end point.

2.7 Land Access and Private Land

2.7.1 The Applicant will arrange visits to private land, however, access onto private land is at all times by the permission of the person controlling it; householders, occupiers and landowners may refuse to allow some persons accompanying the ExA onto their land. Under those circumstances, the ExA will decide whether or not to proceed with that part of the inspection and may ask those refused access to wait outside.

2.8 First Aid Facilities

2.8.1 There are no first aid facilities on site, and it is assumed, in the worst-case scenario that no intended attendees from National Highways are a qualified First Aider. The nearest hospital with Accident and Emergency facilities is Royal Hampshire County Hospital, Romsey Rd, Winchester SO22 5DG.

2.9 Key Site Hazards

- 2.9.1 A safety briefing will be provided by the Applicant. All attendees must follow safety instructions given by National Highways. All attendees are responsible for their own safety and must never act in a manner that might reduce the safety of themselves or others.
- 2.9.2 The following key hazards have been identified:
 - Uneven terrain whilst crossing farmland
 - Roadside hazards
 - High speed travel of passing cars when parked near M3 for various stops
 - Narrow roads and hedgerows reducing visibility
 - Potential for livestock / deer / and other wildlife to be present
 - Crossing of two-lane roads



2.10 Draft Itinerary for ASI

2.10.1 The times are approximate and whilst we will endeavour to meet persons along the route, the timings cannot be guaranteed. A site inspection pack will be provided on the day containing a copy of **Table 1.1** and **Figure 1**

NOTE: Timings and travel / parking locations and travel guidance will be confirmed in the final issue of this document.


