

BUS SHELTER AT BARROW WAKE The Clerk read considerable correspondence with regard to a request from the Birdlip Radio Station that the Parish

Council provide a new shelter for use of the Radio Station staff. As a result of his observations on the matter, sent with the authority of the Chairman, this request had been amended to a request for the future maintenance of the existing structure after it has been moved to a new position by the County Surveyor. Mr. Johnstone drew the attention of the Meeting to the fact that the Radio Station were the largest ratepayers in the Parish, although their contribution was by voluntary grant, and for this reason the Parish Council must seek to serve their needs.

After discussion, the action of the Clerk and Chairman in objection to the provision of a new shelter was upheld, and it was agreed to accept responsibility of future maintenance provided the structure was erected of durable material with a permanent (not thatched) roof.

The Clerk was instructed to have this structure included on the Insurance Policy for impact damage and third party protection as soon as rebuilding is completed.
