The Government is due to respond to the Climate Change Committee's 2023 Progress Report to Parliament on 31 October 2023. This is relevant to the Development Consent Order decision for the A1 in Northumberland – Morpeth to Ellingham (TR010059).

How long can Interested Parties (IPs) have to make representations to the Secretary of State after the publication of the Government response to the Climate Change Committee's 2023 Progress Report? IPs need to have sight of this response followed by a reasonable time period (for example two weeks) to consider what will be a large report, including carrying out quantitative analysis, and the chance to ask clarifying questions, in order to produce an informed response.
