Dear Sirs,

My Wife and I have registered and will be attending the meeting at Witham Public Hall on Thursday 12th January, however we do believe that this meeting is taking place prior to any satisfactory

communications from National Highways regarding how the major impact of this scheme will be satisfactorily handled regarding our unique location— [REDACTED].

As a family we have over the past 3 years tried to engage with Highways England/National Highways regarding the effects already encountered and detrimental [REDACTED]

However although meeting several times and very many e-mails and telephone calls to executives including [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] all we have received in response has been platitudes and a request to work with them, but no accurate or helpful information in all that time. The family have suffered abuse from workers, the invasion of privacy, inappropriate photography of children, noise pollution and interference of the home office/recording studio [REDACTED], making this inoperable.

Most recently we have been advised that the information regarding the new A12 position of only 11 metres from our property was incorrect and that the policy of not sufficient cost justification for sound proofing was also wrong leads us to believe that the Highways England staff are not in control of this highly important and costly project and to date we have received no satisfactory information as to how our single point of access will be maintained?

Early in December we were made aware that our property was to be completely surrounded by an Eco Mitigation area and that National Highways had applied to Colchester City Council for planning consent however upon trying to lodge our objections to this, have been advised that Colchester have no authority to contest this, therefore we have no way of making our objections to this further invasion of our privacy deliberated on by our local Council.

Whilst we accept that for the common good this road scheme needs to be undertaken our family at [REDACTED] have been made to feel homeless and for the past 3 years have not been able to consider their future which [REDACTED] would be disturbing, to our family it has put our whole life on hold with [REDACTED] to us all caused by the inappropriate handling of this scheme of Highways England.

We would ask that our plight could be considered at an appropriate time so that our family can be allowed to live in peace and harmony, plan for a future without the anxiety and trauma that has been foisted upon us---

If an Englishman's home is still considered to be his castle---We have been under siege for over two years without any meaningful consideration from society!

Your consideration to the above would be greatly appreciated.
