## PLANNING ACT 2008 SECTION 46: DUTY TO NOTIFY SECRETARY OF STATE OF PROPOSED APPLICATION

I am hereby notifying you under section 46 of the Planning Act 2008 ("the 2008 Act") that Highways England ("the applicant") intends to apply under Section 37 of the 2008 Act for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") for the A66 Northern Trans-Pennine project, which involves dualling the remaining single carriageway sections of the A66 between the M6 junction 40 at Penrith and the A1(M) junction 53 at Scotch Corner ("the project").
