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### 1. Introduction

#### Purpose of this document

- 1.1.1 This document, the Environmental Management Plan (EMP) Change Log Deadline 3, sets out and explains the changes to the Environmental Management Plan that have been made in the first revision of the EMP when compared to the version of the EMP that was submitted as part of the Development Consent Order (DCO) application for the A66 Northern Trans-Pennine Project (the Project).
- 1.1.2 The DCO application (the Application) was submitted by National Highways (the Applicant), to the Secretary of State through the Planning Inspectorate on 21 June 2022 and was accepted for examination on 19 July 2022.
- 1.1.3 A number of stakeholders and interested parties have made comments about the content of the EMP through Relevant Representations, Written Representations and Local Impact Reports. A number of amendments have been proposed to the EMP (and its annexes) to address some of these comments and these are reflected in revision 1 of the EMP submitted at Deadline 3.
- 1.1.4 This Change Log sets out each substantive change made to the EMP (including its supporting Annexes), the source of that change (the Relevant Representation that it was raised in for example), and an explanation of why the change has been made. Where minor changes have been made to deal with clarity or correcting typographical errors, these are not noted in the Change Log.
- 1.1.5 This Change Log does not make reference to comments that have been raised by a third party where a change has not been made to the EMP in response to it. This has either been explained in our direct responses to Relevant Representations, Written Representations or Local Impact Reports, or engagement is ongoing.
- 1.1.6 This Change Log should be read alongside the updated version of the Environmental Management Plan (Rev 2) (Document Reference 2.7) and is correct as of Deadline 3 of the Examination.
