Brough Hill Fair – Statement of Truth

2. Since my childhood I have been aware of the annual horse fair known as Brough Hill Fair, or just 'Brough Hill'. I first attended Brough Hill Fair in the year .1962
3. I attended Brough Hill Fair regularly from .1962 (year) to .2022 (year)
4. The Fair is held over the last weekend in September, and is an important date in our annual calendar, attended by many Gypsy people, who would meet up with friends and family to buy and sell horses and equipment, vehicles and harness, and to catch up on news.
5. Brough Hill was once a large event, being much larger than Appleby Fair at one time. There were many horsedrawn and motorised caravans, and many trade
6. stalls including food and drink, clothing, and hardware.
7. I believe that the fair is held by right, granted by a Royal Charter.
8. I can state with certainty that in all the time I have attended the Fair, it has been held without secrecy or deception of any kind, but openly and in plain view.
9. Access to the fair has never been gained by use of force or by threats but with the full co-operation of local residents, local council, (who provide toilets free of charge) police and the landowner, (who provides the land, free of any charge.)
10. I believe that the current landowner is the Warcop Training Camp. They have never required any payment or tenancy agreement, and at no time has it been suggested that their permission has been required before we can hold the Fair.
11. The site of the Fair is normally grazed by sheep and cattle for most of the year, and the farmer has always removed his livestock before the Fair starts. The access gate is normally secured with a lock and chain, which is always unlocked on the morning of the first day of the Fair.
12. The numbers attending the Fair have decreased significantly in recent years particularly when the Covid pandemic restrictions were in place, but the numbers attending will always vary up and down over time, and the Fair remains a significant event in the Gypsy and Traveller calendar.
