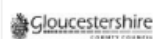

Gloucestershire County Council is proposing to improve M5 Junction 10 to create an all-movements junction. The Scheme will reduce existing pressure on M5 Junction 11 and enable the planned development and economic growth around Cheltenham, Gloucester and Tewkesbury. The Scheme includes the following key elements:

- Construction of a new all-movements roundabout junction over the M5, centred either side of the existing overbridge, which is to be demolished;
- Construction of a new link road with a segregated cycle track and footway, from the B4634 to the A4019, towards land safeguarded for key housing and employment allocations in West Cheltenham; and
- Widening of the A4019 for motorised traffic and the provision of a segregated, dedicated cycle track and footway for non-motorised traffic.

Development Consent Order

The Scheme is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project. As a result, Gloucestershire County Council intends to make an application ("the application") for a Development Consent Order (DCO) under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 to the Secretary of State for Transport to authorise the construction and operation of the Scheme. We anticipate that our DCO application will be submitted in late 2022, with construction starting in 2024 if our application is successful.

Due to its nature and size, the project is an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (EIA) Regulations 2017. It will therefore require an Environmental Impact Assessment under the EIA regulations and an Environmental Statement (ES) will accompany the application for a DCO.

Statement of Community Consultation

Before submitting the DCO application, in accordance with Section 47 of the Planning Act 2008, we must publish a document called a Statement of Community Consultation ("SoCC"). This sets out how we will consult with the local community about the Scheme. 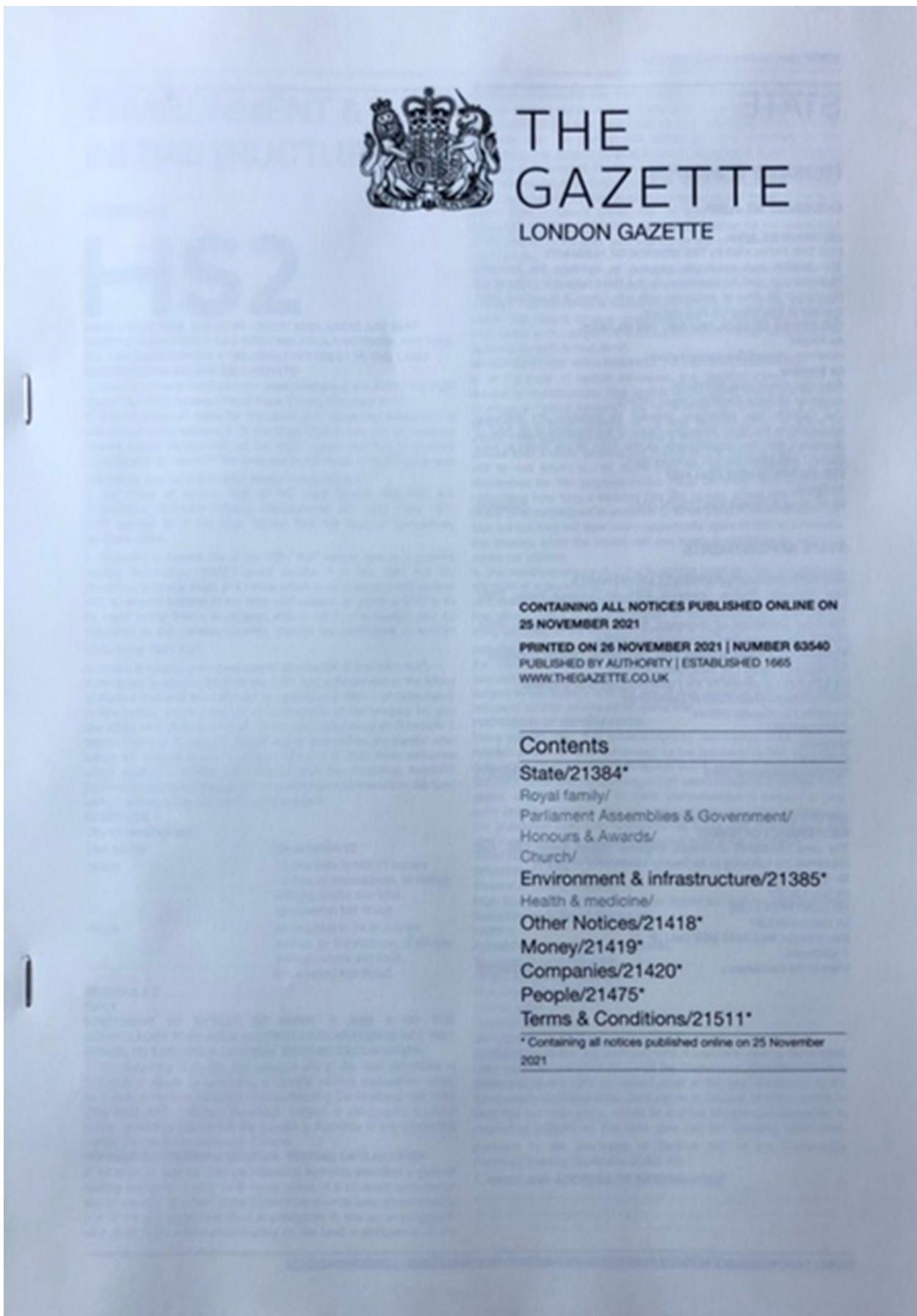

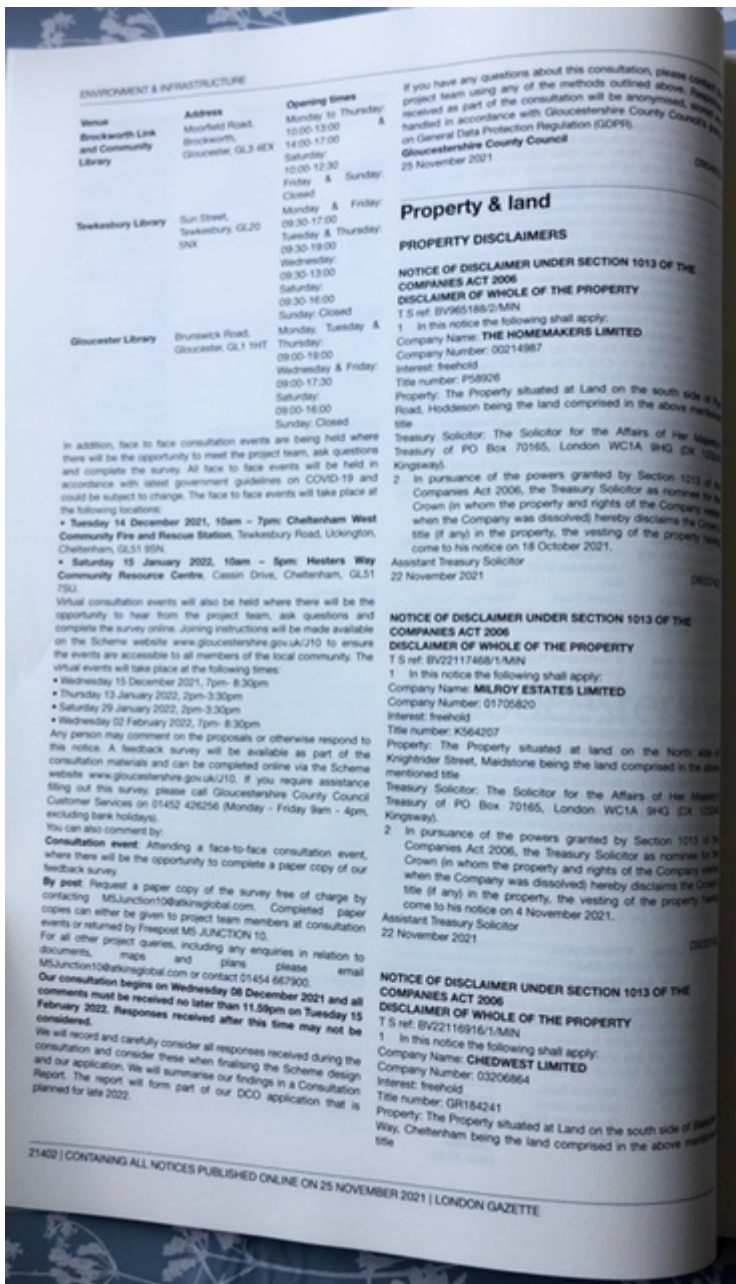

Duchess goes back to class to help parents of the future

Young teenagers are being taught about early brain development in babies to make them better parents when they grow up in an initiative developed by Oxford academics.

The Duchess of Cambridge visited a school to lend her support to the idea, which has involved 4,000 pupils so far. She launched the Royal Foundation Centre for Early Childhood in the summer to improve awareness of the impact of early years development.

The duchess joined a Year 8 science lesson on neuroscience and early child development at Tower Hill High School in Harrow, northwest London. The programme was commissioned by Kindred, an early years advocacy charity that teaches 11 to 14-year-olds how baby development and care have a long-term impact on adult health.

A total of 21 schools are taking part in the scheme, which started this year, with thousands of pupils being taught the basics of brain development. Pupils are taught that interactions between parents and babies have an impact on their future "qualifications and earning potential".

Research suggests that only a quarter of adults recognise the importance of the first five years on lifelong physical and mental health. The impact of early experiences. Scientists from the University of Oxford have been testing specially developed science lessons which they say have dramatically improved pupils' understanding and behaviour.

Felicity Gilgus, director of Kindred, said: "The most significant finding that's needed in the country is to rethink our perception of early years."

"A child's development at 22 months serves as a strong predictor of educational outcomes at age 26. Most of the human brain is developed before we can even talk and in the first year of life, the brain literally doubles in size."

"Working with 11 to 14-year-olds to transform their understanding early enough in their lives means that we are not leaving these lessons too late."

Dr Elizabeth Kippa, a senior scientist at Oxford's psychiatry department, said: "This groundbreaking project could improve the lives of children for generations. In the same way that we teach children about the risks of smoking or poor diet, children also need to know about why experience in their early years are so important for later health."

Kingsington Palace said the focus of the research aligned strongly with the duchess and her work on early childhood, and its influence on an individual's future health and potential.

The duchess visited the school in Harrow after it emerged that she and the Duke of Cambridge had snubbed the BBC by choosing ITV as the channel to screen their Westminster Abbey Christmas card concert.

The decision comes during a worsening of relations between the BBC and the royals after the broadcast of a two-part documentary examining the relationship between the royal family and the media.

Man charged with murders

A 34-year-old man has been charged with the murders of a couple who were stabbed to death at their home in a Somerset village.

Colin Reeves, of Norton Fitzwarren, will appear at Taunton magistrates' court today in connection with the deaths of Jennifer, 33, and Stephen Chapple, 36, who lived in the same road as him. They were killed as their children slept upstairs at about 9.45pm on Sunday.

Avon and Somerset police said post-mortem examinations had shown that both died from multiple stab wounds.

Detective Inspector Neil Meade, of the major crime investigation team, said: "Specialist officers are providing support to Jennifer and Stephen's families and our thoughts remain with them."

"We've been keeping them fully updated on the progress of our investigation and they're aware of this latest development."

"It is undoubtedly an extremely difficult time for them and I'd ask their privacy is respected as they continue to come to terms with what has happened."

He added: "I'd like to remind both the media and the public that criminal proceedings are now active and Colin Reeves has a right to a fair trial. It is extremely important there should be no reporting, commentary or sharing of information online which could in any way prejudice these proceedings."

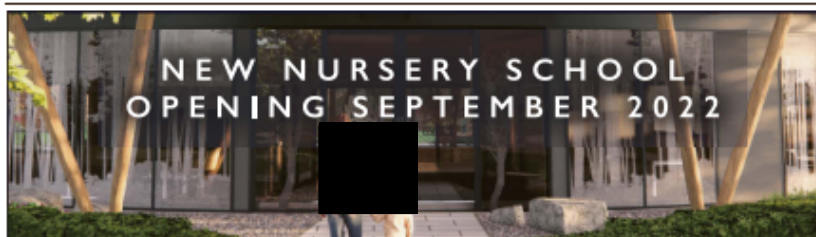
