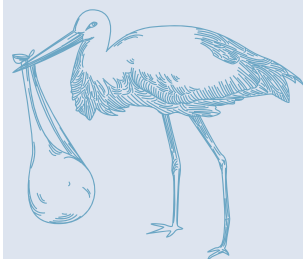

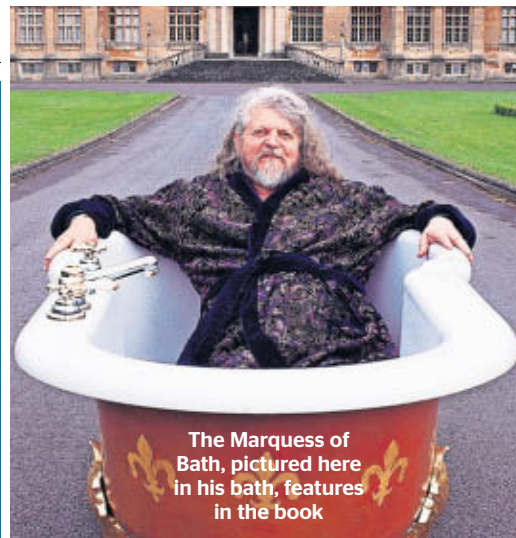

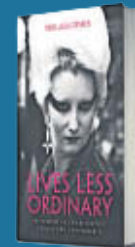

**THE Manchester Jewish community may be booming, but one section has been neglected for too long — those aged between 25 and 50.**

Now, a new charity, J-Hub, aims to bring people together from this age bracket regardless of their level of Jewish observance, and will provide them with a place to connect with their heritage and meet other Jews.

Founded by Rabbi Eliezer Wolfson, J-Hub will launch with a Friday night dinner and social on February 24, specifically aimed at Jewish singles.

Former Bury South MP Ivan Lewis, and J-Hub trustee, told the *Jewish Telegraph*: "Manchester is now the fastest growing Jewish community in Europe.

"However, there are thousands of Jews who are disconnected from the community with little or no involvement.

"J-Hub is for them — our mission is to create a programme of inspirational events which touch people's lives and support all Jews in Manchester to feel welcome and at ease in our community.

"We are launching J-Hub with a special singles Friday night because so many people tell us they are fed up of only being able to meet fellow singles online.  
"We hope this will be the first of many singles events in the future."

Meanwhile Rabbi Wolfson, who founded J-Hub last year, said: "What we keep hearing is that many young Jewish people leave college or university and go on to the world of work with little or no contact with Jewish

life. "As a result, increasing numbers are marrying out or simply losing the opportunity to connect with their heritage and meet other Jews.

"J-Hub aims to address this with a programme of events and opportunities which will provide a place for Jewish people to meet new faces and at the same time connect and explore their Judaism — at any level — in a lively, relaxed and welcoming environment."  
J-Hub will also run classes on a range of

subjects, including well-being, Israel education, Jewish history and even a crash course in Hebrew reading, as well as hosting events to coincide with Jewish festivals.

Regular Shabbatons will also provide 'the whole Shabbat experience', complete with great food, great company and inspirational activities.

Rabbi Wolfson said: "For too long there has been a vacuum for Jewish people over 25. We truly believe that J-Hub will fill that gap."
