A46 Newark Bypass - Targeted Consultation

We're undertaking a targeted consultation on updates to our proposals on the A46 Newark Bypass scheme that have occurred since our statutory consultation. The targeted consultation will run until 11.59pm on the 16 April 2023.

Updates to our proposals

As you're aware, we recently carried out our statutory consultation from 26 October 2022 to 12 December 2022. Since then, we've considered feedback received and updated our proposals to accommodate updates in six areas of our scheme.

These updates relate to additional land requirements and a design change at Winthorpe roundabout. We're continuing to develop our design and carry out assessments on the scheme. The proposed updates are:

1) Langford Hall access road

Following consultation feedback relating to impacted access routes, the proposed scheme boundary (also referred to as the 'draft Order Limits' or 'red line boundary') has been altered near to Langford Hall. The design of the proposed access route is still in development, however additional land requirements have been identified.

This proposed update can be seen at location 1 in the enclosed **Revised Draft Order Limits Plan**.

2) Winthorpe roundabout

Following consultation feedback and ongoing stakeholder engagement, the Winthorpe roundabout layout has been amended. To improve flows, the A46 traffic would be directed around the roundabout, with the northbound traffic from the Friendly Farmer roundabout passing through the middle. A signalised walking and cycling route would be provided across the junction between the A1133 and Drove Lane.

This proposed update can be seen at location 2 in the enclosed **Revised Draft Order Limits Plan.**

3) Hargon Lane

Following consultation feedback, the proposed scheme boundary has been altered along part of Hargon Lane. This would enable any works and/or rights required to connect the

current footpath on Hargon Lane with a new walking and cycling route proposed across Winthorpe roundabout between the A1133 and Drove Lane.

This proposed update can be seen at location 3 in the enclosed **Revised Draft Order Limits Plan.**

4) Kelham/Averham floodplain compensation area

Following further design development and engagement with local stakeholders, the proposed scheme boundary has been altered to include new land parcels identified for use as floodplain compensation areas, including land within the Kelham Conservation Area.

This proposed update can be seen at location 4 in the enclosed **Revised Draft Order Limits Plan.**

5) Farndon bridleway (BW2) temporary diversion

Following consultation feedback, the proposed scheme boundary has been altered to enable an alternative route to be used as a temporary bridleway diversion during construction.

This proposed update can be seen at location 5 in the enclosed **Revised Draft Order Limits Plan.**

6) Farndon temporary construction holding area

Following feedback from local stakeholders, the proposed scheme boundary has been altered to include additional land for temporary use as a vehicle holding area during construction.

This proposed update can be seen at location 6 in the enclosed **Revised Draft Order Limits Plan**.

Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA)

The above updates will be assessed as part of our ongoing EIA process and will be reported within the Environmental Statement that will be submitted as part of the Development Consent Order (DCO) application.

Initial assessments indicate that the works in the Kelham Conservation Area, both during and after construction, are unlikely to result in any significant adverse effects to the character and appearance of the Conservation Area. This is due to the temporary nature of the construction works, and the reinstatement of the field to arable use once works are complete.

We're writing you because we believe that you may/might be entitled to make a relevant claim due to the effects of construction and/or operation of the new road if the DCO for the proposed scheme were to be made and implemented.

You may be able to claim compensation under Section 152 of the Planning Act 2008, under Section 10 of the Compulsory Purchase Act 1965 or under Part I of the Land Compensation Act 1973.

A relevant claim is one which either relates to:

- a right that you may have is interfered with by the scheme such as a right of way;
- a reduction in the value of your property which is adjacent to the scheme and where no rights are affected but because of physical factors arising from the scheme such as noise or lighting – often referred to as Part 1 Claims; or
- where a claim in nuisance may arise.

This is part of a precautionary approach that we're taking to potential interests in land or property in the area of the scheme. Any claims relating to these interests will need to be made and substantiated (but only after the scheme if consented is constructed).

It's important to note that being consulted under this category does not confirm entitlement to a future claim. Entitlement to compensation is assessed by our professional valuers at the time that a claim is made. We recommend that you take professional advice before making any claim.



A46 Newark Bypass – Statutory Consultation

We've recently written to you seeking your views on proposed updates to the A46 Newark Bypass scheme, as part of a targeted consultation. This is because you have recently been identified as a person with an interest in land that is within the updated scheme boundary (also referred to as the 'draft Order Limits' or 'red line boundary').

Why we are writing to you

This letter provides information relating to a statutory consultation that we previously carried out on the scheme.

The statutory consultation period ran from 26 October 2022 to 12 December 2022 and presented proposals to widen 6.5km of the existing single carriageway to a dual carriageway, to provide two lanes in each direction between Farndon and Winthorpe roundabouts near Newark-on-Trent.

Your data, your rights

A46 Newark Bypass – Statutory Consultation

We've recently written to you seeking your views on proposed updates to the A46 Newark Bypass scheme, as part of a targeted consultation. This is because you have recently been identified as a person with an interest in land that is within the updated scheme boundary (also referred to as the 'draft Order Limits' or 'red line boundary').

A copy of the targeted consultation letter and enclosures have been included again for your convenience.

Why we are writing to you

This letter provides information relating to a statutory consultation that we previously carried out on the scheme.

The statutory consultation period ran from 26 October 2022 to 12 December 2022 and presented proposals to widen 6.5km of the existing single carriageway to a dual carriageway, to provide two lanes in each direction between Farndon and Winthorpe roundabouts near Newark-on-Trent.

As you have recently been identified as having an interest in land within the updated scheme boundary, we would like to give you the opportunity to comment on the scheme as a whole, as you may not have had the opportunity to do so last year.

It is an important opportunity for you to share your views on our proposals and will enable us to take your views into account when developing and refining our proposals before we submit our Development Consent Order (DCO) application for the scheme.

Please refer to our consultation materials and use the contact details below to provide us with a response to our statutory consultation. When providing feedback please also consider the updates included as part of the targeted consultation.

Why we are consulting with you

During the pre-application process, we must consult with a variety of persons and organisations about our proposed application in accordance with the requirements of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended) (the 2008 Act).

We're writing you because we believe that you may/might be entitled to make a relevant claim due to the effects of construction and/or operation of the new road if the DCO for the proposed scheme were to be made and implemented.

You may be able to claim compensation under Section 152 of the Planning Act 2008, under Section 10 of the Compulsory Purchase Act 1965 or under Part I of the Land Compensation Act 1973. A relevant claim is one which either relates to:

- a right that you may have is interfered with by the scheme such as a right of way;
- a reduction in the value of your property which is adjacent to the scheme and where no rights are affected but because of physical factors arising from the scheme such as noise or lighting often referred to as Part 1 Claims; or
- where a claim in nuisance may arise.

This is part of a precautionary approach that we're taking to potential interests in land or property in the area of the scheme. Any claims relating to these interests will need to be made and substantiated (but only after the scheme if consented is constructed).

It's important to note that being consulted under this category does not confirm entitlement to a future claim. Entitlement to compensation is assessed by our professional valuers at the time that a claim is made. We recommend that you take professional advice before making any claim.

We've enclosed a copy of our statutory consultation brochure, which provides information on the design for the scheme, as it was presented during the consultation held between October and December 2022.

Please note that the above materials are from the statutory consultation and as such do not reflect the updates set out in the targeted consultation. However, we've also provided a copy of the targeted consultation materials which includes a plan showing the updated proposed scheme boundary and a specific plan showing where we believe your land interest is.

We want to use this consultation to allow you to tell us about the potential impacts that our proposed scheme may have on your land / interest in land. We also want to work with you to identify ways in which the proposed scheme could reduce these impacts as far as reasonably possible.

We can do that more effectively if we fully understand how you use the land and how our scheme will affect that use. You may also wish to consider whether your interests in any surrounding land not acquired / used by the scheme will be affected.

Please refer to the enclosed consultation documents relevant to you personally, as well as our other consultation materials, and use the contact details provided near the end of this letter to provide us with a response to our consultation.

As the project is an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (the EIA Regulations) we've prepared a PEI Report to help you understand the likely effects of our proposals. We will also submit an Environmental Statement with the application.
