1. Introduction

- 1.1 We are publishing this Statement of Community Consultation in connection with proposed improvements to the A46 Newark Bypass between Farndon and Winthorpe junctions (referred to throughout this document as 'the scheme').
- 1.2 The purpose of this document is to set out how we will consult the local community about our proposal. It outlines the details of our statutory consultation, including where you can find information and how to respond. The document also provides background to the scheme and how the application to build it will progress.
- 1.3 This document will be available to view and download via the scheme webpage at this address <u>www.nationalhighways.co.uk/a46-newark-bypass</u> after the launch of the public consultation and paper copies will be available on request.
- 1.4 To make sure we approach our consultation in the best way for the local community, we have consulted with Newark and Sherwood District Council and Nottinghamshire County Council on this document. These are the local authorities at district and county level in the area in which the scheme is proposed to be built.



2. The application

- 2.1 The scheme is being developed under the Planning Act 2008 and we are publishing this statement under Section 47 (Duty to consult the local community) of that Act.
- 2.2 Under the Planning Act 2008, we are required to make an application to the Secretary of State for Transport through the Planning Inspectorate for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to build and operate the proposed scheme. The Planning Inspectorate will examine our application and the Secretary of State for Transport will decide whether the proposed scheme should go ahead based on a recommendation made by the Planning Inspectorate.
- 2.3 A key consideration for the Planning Inspectorate and the Secretary of State for Transport when assessing our DCO application is the National Policy Statement for National Networks (NPS NN), which was published in 2014. The NPS NN policy sets out the need and Government policies for nationally significant infrastructure rail and road projects for England and is the policy against which decisions on major road projects are made. - 2.4 When we submit our application, the Planning Inspectorate must consider whether our public consultation, required by the Planning Act 2008, has been adequate.
- 2.5 The best way to provide feedback to inform our final design on this proposed scheme is by taking part in this consultation.
- 2.6 We anticipate that our DCO application for the proposed scheme will be submitted in summer 2023.

3. The scheme

- 3.1 In March 2020, the Government's second Road Investment Strategy (RIS2) included a commitment for National Highways to improve the A46 'Trans-Midlands Trade Corridor' between the M5 and the Humber Ports, through the creation of a continuous dual carriageway from Lincoln to Warwick.
- 3.2 The A46 Newark Bypass is part of the strategic A46 route connecting the Midlands, running from Lincoln to Gloucestershire via Leicester and Coventry. Much of this road is already high-quality dual carriageway, and by filling in key sections it would be possible to create a coast-to-coast highway without the need for major new road building across open countryside.
- 3.3 The single greatest gap in this route is the A46 at Newark. An upgraded dual carriageway opened in 2012, but which stopped three miles short of the A1. We now propose to fill in this gap, eliminating regular traffic jams and creating a consistently good connection from the A1 at Newark to the M1 at Leicester.
- 3.4 The objectives of the proposed scheme are to:
 - Improve safety of the A46 and its junctions, reducing the frequency and severity of incidents along the A46.
 - Reduce congestion along the A46 and its junctions.
 - Improve links to the A1 by removing A46 through-traffic from the A1/A46 junction.
 - Improve journey times and journey time reliability along the A46 and its junctions between Farndon and Winthorpe.
 - supporting the movement of Goods and Access to Transport Hubs along the A46 corridor including the Humber ports and East Midlands Airport.
 - Improving accessibility to Newark-on-Trent and the local area
 - enabling economic growth and development in Newark-on-Trent, Nottinghamshire, and Lincolnshire.
 - Increase resilience of the A46 by providing two lanes in each direction separated by a central reserve barrier.
 - Increase resilience of the wider strategic road network (e.g., A1 and M1) by providing a more suitable alternative route when incidents occur
 - Seek to improve noise levels in Noise Important Areas ('noise hotspots') affected by improvements to the A46.
 - Deliver better environmental outcomes through mitigation, protection and enhancement, and contribute to biodiversity.



- Improve the customer experience and satisfaction of all customers affected by the scheme.
- Maintain and improve facilities for cyclists, walkers and horse riders where existing facilities are affected.
- 3.5 As required by the Planning Act 2008, we are publishing a Preliminary Environmental Information (PEI) Report and a Non-Technical Summary (NTS) of the PEI Report, as part of our consultation material.
- 3.6 The purpose of the PEI Report and the associated NTS is to help consultees to develop an informed view of the project as part of the statutory pre-application consultation by providing sufficient information about the likely environmental effects of the project. The PEI Report and NTS will be available to view online at the deposit locations listed in Section 6 of this document.
- 3.7 The PEI Report is a statutory requirement for projects that require an Environmental Statement in accordance with the Infrastructure Planning (EIA) Regulations 2017. The PEI Report will document the knowledge to date regarding the environmental baseline and provide an indication of the likely environmental effects and potential mitigation.
- 3.8 Additional information about the proposed scheme will be included in our public consultation brochure. Copies of the brochure will be available at the deposit locations, listed in Section 6 of this document, during the consultation period and also on our scheme webpage at this address: www.nationalhighways.co.uk/a46-newark-bypass



4. Previous community engagement

- 4.1 We have previously carried out one stage of consultation, from December 2020 to February 2021, when we consulted on two different options for the scheme design, through an options consultation.
- 4.2 The options consultation sought opinions from the local community on which option was preferred and why. Public consultation materials provided information on the options and included a response form, which included both 'closed' questions and 'open' questions.
- 4.3 Following the options consultation, a Preferred Route Announcement (PRA) was made in February 2022 which announced Option 2 Modified as the preferred route for the scheme. Option 2 Modified now forms the basis for our plans as we are developing the preliminary design for statutory consultation.
- 4.4 More details, including the result of the options consultation and how we decided to progress the preferred route are included in the Report on Public Consultation and the PRA brochure for the scheme, available to download from our scheme webpage at this address: <u>www.nationalhighways.co.uk/a46-newark-bypass</u>




5. Statutory public consultation

- 5.1 The public consultation will run from 24 October 2022 to 5 December 2022. During the public consultation period, we will be consulting on the following elements of the proposed scheme:
 - The scheme, including development of the design since the PRA
 - Environmental mitigation measures
 - Emerging arrangements for the construction stage of the scheme.
- 5.2 Anyone who is interested in this proposed scheme is welcome to take part. We will listen to everyone's views, and we will consider all opinions before we submit our DCO application.
- 5.3 In consultation with Newark and Sherwood District Council and Nottinghamshire County Council, we have developed a distribution area for our consultation materials, this can be seen in Figure 1.
- 5.4 This area is based on who we think will be interested in or affected by our proposals. We will communicate with people living and working in this area to let them know about our consultation by posting information directly to them.
- 5.5 Properties located within the inner distribution area will receive public consultation brochures and response forms directly in the post. Properties located within the outer distribution area will receive an information postcard providing them with details about the public consultation.

- 5.6 We have undertaken an Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA) for the proposed scheme. We have also consulted with Newark and Sherwood District Council and Nottinghamshire County Council for ways of identifying and engaging with local organised or demographic groups with specific needs. Information in the EqIA is used to inform our public consultation approach to make it as inclusive and accessible as possible to the local community.
- 5.7 The table below shows methods we will use to promote our public consultation and gather feedback on the scheme proposals. More information regarding public consultation documentation and information can be found in Section 6 of this document.



8. Next steps

- 8.1 Where we consider it appropriate, and before submitting our DCO application, we may choose to undertake further targeted consultation on certain changes to the proposed scheme, made in response to consultation feedback or updated technical information. Such consultation will be for a minimum of 28 days.
- 8.2 We will record and carefully consider all responses received during the consultation which will be taken into account when finalising our DCO application before we submit it to the Planning Inspectorate.
- 8.3 We will summarise our findings in a Consultation Report which will include a description of how our application was informed by the responses received, and outline any changes made as a result of consultation. The Consultation Report forms part of our application to the Planning Inspectorate, as required by Section 37(3) of the Planning Act 2008.
- 8.4 The Planning Inspectorate will decide whether the application meets the required standards to proceed to examination and will determine whether our public consultation has been adequate.

9. Your data, your rights

- 9.1 On 25 May 2018, the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) became law.
