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1 Record of Environmental Engagement

1.1 Introduction

- 1.1.1 This document provides a record of the environmental engagement that has been undertaken with statutory environmental bodies following the preferred route announcement, in advance of the Development Consent Order (DCO) application submission. This document forms an appendix to Chapter 4 (Environmental Assessment and Methodology) of the Environmental Statement (ES) (TR010065/APP/6.1).
- 1.1.2 Details of the wider engagement and consultation undertaken as part of the scheme is contained within the Consultation Report of (TR010065/APP/5.1) including details on consultation with statutory stakeholders identified in the Planning Act 2008, as well as non-statutory stakeholders.

1.2 Engagement with environmental bodies following the preferred route announcement

- 1.2.1 Following the announcement of the preferred route in February 2022, the Applicant has engaged with the following statutory and non-statutory environmental bodies:
