
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Good afternoon Mr Price,

In June you raised a <u>Relevant Representation</u> to the Planning Inspectorate regarding GTC Pipeline Ltd assets that are within the Order Limits for the A46 Newark Bypass Scheme.

I am producing the response you your representation and wished to reach out to update you on the interface between the asset and the scheme.

You kindly provided several plans with the representation which I have reviewed alongside the design proposals. My assessment concludes that the Scheme will not be affecting GTC assets, and I would like to share with you my findings and reassure GTC Pipelines Limited that the Scheme will not be impacting your assets.



Location 1: Maltkin Lane, Newark


<u>Asset</u>

90mm LP PE80 pipe located beneath the concrete access track at the northern end of Maltkin Lane at the junction with Trent Lane.

Interface with the A46 Newark Bypass Scheme

National Highways are seeking to use this land temporarily as an access road to part of the work site and obtain permanent rights to allow for maintenance access to the new assets that are to be constructed. Maltkiln Lane and Trent Lane currently provide access to the industrial estate and Nether Lock and are used by National Highways, and other asset owners. National Highways are not undertaking any permanent works at this location and will not be undertaking any excavation on the existing access road.



Location 2: Winthorpe Road and Robert Dukeson Avenue, Newark


<u>Asset</u>

125mm LP PE80, 90mm LP PE80 and 63mm LP PE80 pipes located within the highway.
