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Under section 47 of the 2008 Act, LLAL has a duty to consult the local community in accordance with a Statement of Community Consultation ("SoCC"), which sets out how LLAL will undertake its consultation. This notice publicises where and when the SoCC can be inspected, pursuant to section 47(6)(a). Additionally, LLAL has a duty to publicise the proposed application under section 48 of the 2008 Act in line with Regulation 4 of the 2009 Regulations. In accordance with those provisions, this notice also summarises the main proposals and explains where the consultation documents can be viewed.

Summary of Proposed Works

The proposed DCO application would, amongst other things, authorise the construction and operation of a new second terminal and associated facilities, including new aircraft stands, apron and taxiways, predominantly on the north side of the existing runway at LTN. This would allow LTN to make best use of the existing single runway, in accordance with government aviation policy. In addition to the new terminal, the DCO application would authorise adjustments to the existing terminal and its associated aircraft stands, to allow the expansion to be phased over time and in line with growing demand to 32 million passengers per annum ("mppa"). The current permitted capacity of the airport is 18 mppa.

To accommodate the expansion, a major earthworks operation would be required to the east of the existing airport to create the platform on which the new terminal and associated facilities would be located. The proposed DCO application would also include replacement open space to compensate for the area of Wiggmore Valley Park into which the airport would expand, along with environmental mitigation works in the vicinity of the airport. To achieve this increase in passenger numbers, associated improvements to surface access transport infrastructure, including connecting roads and off-site junctions would also be required.

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Fresh fears that pet killer has struck again

Owners warned as cat's head found

A CAT'S head has been found, sparking fears the UK animal killer has struck again.

The body of pet Dory was found in the Arkley area on Saturday - and two days later, her head was found nearby.

South Norwood Animal Rescue and Liberty (SNARL) says a vet has carried out an examination and stated the injuries were inflicted by a person using a bladed weapon.

SNARL has launched an investigation and is linking Dory's death to the infamous UK animal killer.

There have been reports all over the country of cats and rabbits in particular being mutilated over the past few years and SNARL is committed to finding the person or people it believes is responsible for the killings.

The Metropolitan Police initially launched an investigation in December 2015 under the name Operation Takahe after SNARL

raised concerns about the number of cats found dead and missing their heads and tails.

But SNARL continues to dispute findings by the Met in September last year that suggested that foxes were to blame for the mutilation.

After Dory's death in Arkley, SNARL said: "Do you know anyone who came to the Barnet EN5 area to carry out some work around the dates of Monday October 7 to October 14?"

"We are leafleting, making enquiries and looking for CCTV.

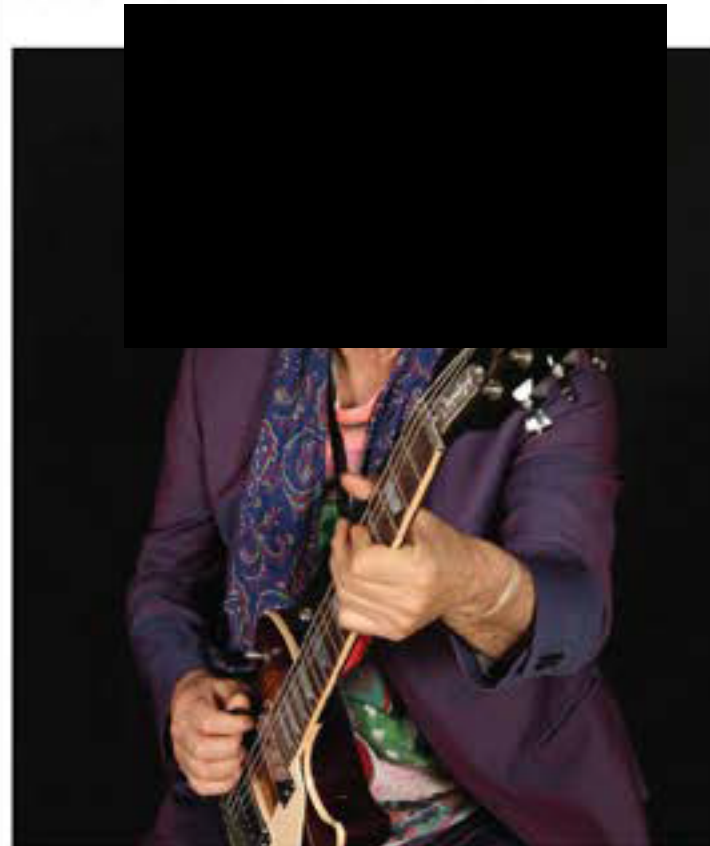
"If you live or work in the Mays Road or Quinta Road area and have CCTV or know anyone who does, please contact SNARL as soon as possible and we will let you know if it is of interest.

"Our advice remains to keep cats in at night if you can and ensure hutches are securely locked.

"RIP Dory and our condolences to her family."

Rock star joins bid to save historic arcade

ROCK legend Dave Davies has backed a campaign to save a historic shopping arcade from demolition.

The Kinks guitarist, who grew up in Fortis Green Road, Muswell Hill, called for the Grand Arcade in High Road, North Finchley to be preserved.

Built in the 1930s in the then-popular Art Deco style, the arcade is home to a range of small shops, including a jeweller's and a photo studio.

But it could be torn down to make

way for new flats and shops under regeneration proposals drawn up by Barnet Council.

Mr Davies tweeted his support for the arcade on October 8.

He said: "The Grand Arcade is definitely of historical value. We need to preserve places like this in England and in London. It's only going to benefit the area in the long term."

Mr Davies, who co-founded The Kinks in 1964 with brother Ray, used to buy guitar strings from a shop in the arcade as a youngster.

Plans to ease traffic problems revealed

A range of measures to help ease traffic and parking problems will be rolled out in one of the busiest parts of the borough.

Extensions to permit parking schemes and a new one-way system were among the measures agreed by councillors at Finchley and Golders Green Area Committee on Thursday (October 17).

Finchley Church End controlled parking zone (CPZ) will be extended to cover Templars Crescent, Cavendish Avenue, Stanhope Avenue, St Mary's Avenue and Lyndhurst Gardens.

A new CPZ will also be created

to cover Leslie Road and Leopold Road in East Finchley.

CPZs help to prevent commuter parking close to tube stations and other transport hubs by issuing residents with a permit allowing them to park in streets close to their homes.

At Castle Road, North Finchley - where residents raised fears that speeding motorists are putting their children's safety at risk - council officers will carry out a speed survey to gauge the extent of the problem.

Slow signs will be installed on Arden Road, Finchley Church End, in response to a request from residents fearing speeding and

dangerous driving could lead to a "tragic accident".

A width restriction and parking changes proposed for Somerton Road, Childs Hill, will not go ahead, after 88 per cent of residents who responded to a consultation objected to them.

But the council will investigate other ways of stopping the road from being used as a cut-through by heavy goods vehicles.

A one-way system will be introduced in Churchfield Avenue, North Finchley in a bid to ease congestion.

Councillors also discussed concerns raised by neighbours on Eversleigh Road, Finchley Cen-

tral, about their parking spaces being taken up by businesses and commuters.

Residents had called for a CPZ to tackle the problem.

Cllr Ross Houston (Labour), West Finchley, told the committee residential developments such as the one proposed by Transport for London (TfL) at Finchley Central Underground Station were likely to make the problems worse.

TfL wants to build more than 600 flats on the site - and the station's existing car park could be lost.

Councillors agreed to defer the matter until a meeting in June next year, when the committee will have more funding.

'Worst child abuse ever'

Police say case is vile and shocking

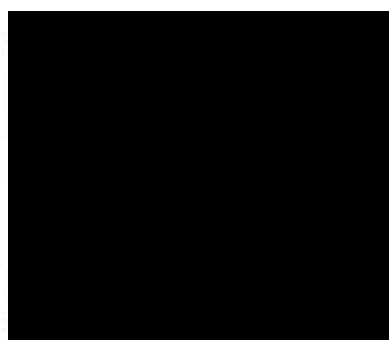
A vile 46-year-old predator will spend more than 20 years in prison after subjecting young children to sexual abuse on numerous occasions spanning a number of years.

Craig Howe, of Luffenham Place, Chicksands, pleaded guilty to a number of child sex offences at an earlier court appearance in May and was handed his prison sentence on Wednesday at Luton Crown Court.

Officers arrested Howe on March 19 after receiving information that he had been communicating with people on a social media platform and talking specifically about children in a sexual nature.

His phone and laptop were seized and a number of indecent images of children were discovered.

Howe was jailed for a

number of child sexual offences, including the rape and assault of a child, sexually exploiting a child and making and distributing indecent images of children.

He was given a sentence of 29 years - 21 years in prison and an extended licence period of eight years.

Det Con Kerry Smith from Internet Child Abuse Investigation Team (ICAIT), investigated the case, said: "This man is probably the worst child sex offender we have ever come across. He was an extremely vile and shocking case involving a level of offending rarely encountered by our team.

From looking at his devices, the sadistic conversations he was having with other sick individuals contained some extremely graphic descriptions and when we saw the images, it confirmed that the chat wasn't all fantasy.

"This man appeared to be a respectable man and held down a good job with a lot of authority. It goes to show that people aren't always as they seem and that there are a lot of individuals out there with a dark side and horrifying secrets.

"Although this jail sentence can't reverse the damage

Howe has done to his victims, at least he no longer poses a danger to children."

The full list of charges were:

- One count of the rape of a child under 13
- Five counts of assault by penetration of a child under 13
- One count of causing a child under 13 to engage in a sexual activity
- Two counts of causing sexual exploitation of a child
- One count of possession of a paedophile manual
- One count of distributing indecent images of children
- Three counts of making indecent images of children

An NSPCC spokesperson said: "Howe is a depraved sexual predator who subjected young children to sickening sexual abuse and then shared images of his crimes with other vile offenders.

"This case shows starkly

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that London Luton Airport Limited ("LLAL") of Hart House Business Centre, Kington Road, Luton, LU2 0LA intends to apply to the Secretary of State for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under section 37 of the 2008 Act to expand London Luton Airport ("LTN"), located to the south-east of Luton.

Under section 47 of the 2008 Act, LLAL has a duty to consult the local community in accordance with a Statement of Community Consultation ("SoCC"), which sets out how LLAL will undertake its consultation. This notice publicises where and when the SoCC can be inspected, pursuant to section 47(6)(a).

Additionally, LLAL has a duty to publicise the proposed application under section 48 of the 2008 Act in line with Regulation 4 of the 2009 Regulations. In accordance with those provisions, this notice also summarises the main proposals and explains when the consultation documents can be viewed.

Summary of Proposed Works

The proposed DCO application would, amongst other things, authorise the construction and operation of a new second terminal and associated facilities, including new aircraft stands, apron and taxiways, predominantly on the north side of the existing runway at LTN. This would allow LTN to make best use of the existing single runway, in accordance with government aviation policy. In addition to the new terminal, the DCO application would authorise adjustments to the existing terminal and its associated aircraft stands, to allow the expansion to be phased over time and in line with growing demand to 32 million passengers per annum ("mppa"). The current permitted capacity of the airport is 18 mppa.

To accommodate the expansion, a major earthworks operation would be required to the east of the existing airport to create the platform on which the new terminal and associated facilities would be located. The proposed DCO application would also include replacement open space to compensate for the area of Wignore Valley Park into which the airport would expand, along with environmental mitigation works in the vicinity of the airport. To achieve this increase in passenger numbers, associated improvements to surface access transport infrastructure, including connecting roads and off-site junctions would also be required.

The proposed project is Environmental Impact Assessment development ("EIA development"), as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which Environmental Impact Assessment is required. An Environmental Statement will therefore be submitted as part of the proposed application containing information about the environmental effects of the proposed development. 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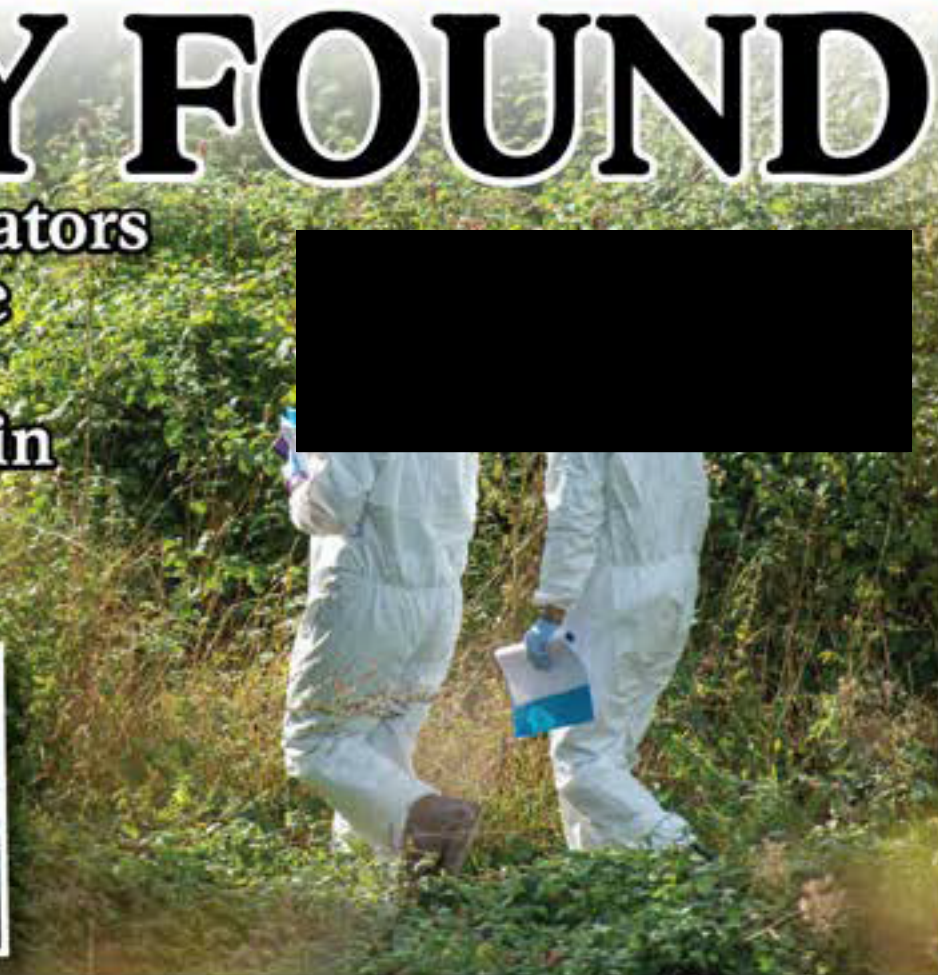
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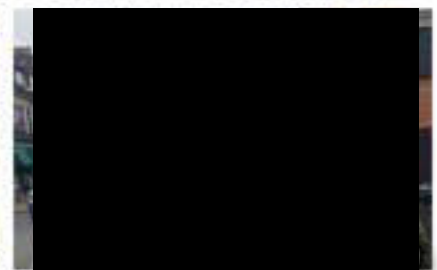

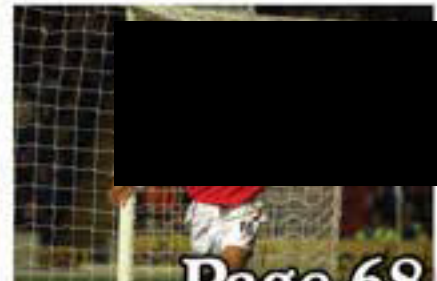

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that London Luton Airport Limited ("LLAL") of Hart House Business Centre, Kimpton Road, Luton, LU2 0LA intends to apply to the Secretary of State for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under section 37 of the 2008 Act to expand London Luton Airport ("LTN"), located to the south-east of Luton.

Under section 47 of the 2008 Act, LLAL has a duty to consult the local community in accordance with a Statement of Community Consultation ("SoCC"), which sets out how LLAL will undertake its consultation. This notice publicises where and when the SoCC can be inspected, pursuant to section 47(6)(a). Additionally, LLAL has a duty to publicise the proposed application under section 48 of the 2008 Act in line with Regulation 4 of the 2009 Regulations. In accordance with those provisions, this notice also summarises the main proposals and explains where the consultation documents can be viewed.

Summary of Proposed Works

The proposed DCO application would, amongst other things, authorise the construction and operation of a new second terminal and associated facilities, including new aircraft stands, apron and taxiways, predominantly on the north side of the existing runway at LTN. This would allow LTN to make best use of the existing single runway, in accordance with government aviation policy. In addition to the new terminal, the DCO application would authorise adjustments to the existing terminal and its associated aircraft stands, to allow the expansion to be phased over time and in line with growing demand to 32 million passengers per annum ("mppa"). The current permitted capacity of the airport is 18 mppa.

To accommodate the expansion, a major earthworks operation would be required to the east of the existing airport to create the platform on which the new terminal and associated facilities would be located. The proposed DCO application would also include replacement open space to compensate for the area of Wiggmore Valley Park into which the airport would expand, along with environmental mitigation works in the vicinity of the airport. To achieve this increase in passenger numbers, associated improvements to surface access transport infrastructure, including connecting roads and off-site junctions would also be required.

The proposed project is Environmental Impact Assessment development ("EIA development"), as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which Environmental Impact Assessment is required. An Environmental Statement will therefore be submitted as part of the proposed application containing information about the environmental effects of the proposed development. Preliminary environmental information can be found in the Preliminary Environmental Information Report ("PEIR"), which forms part of the consultation material.

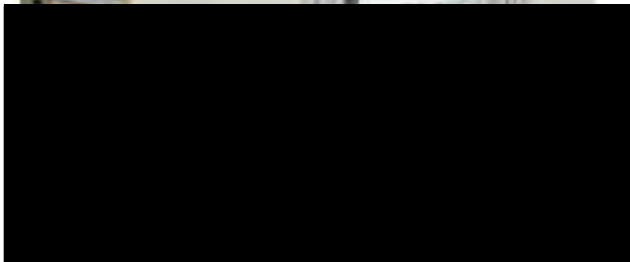

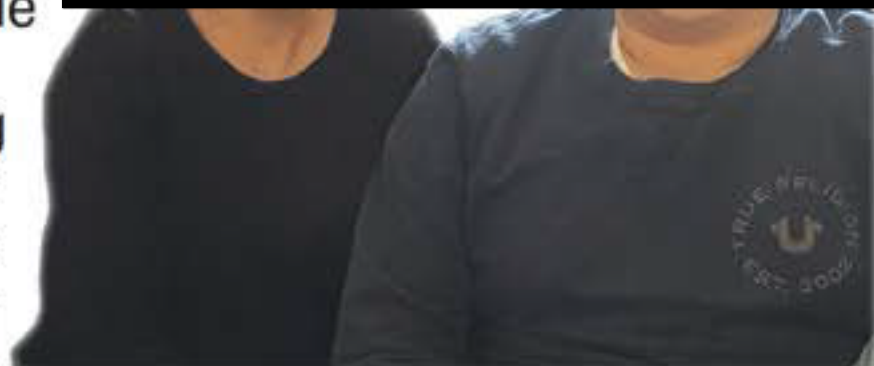

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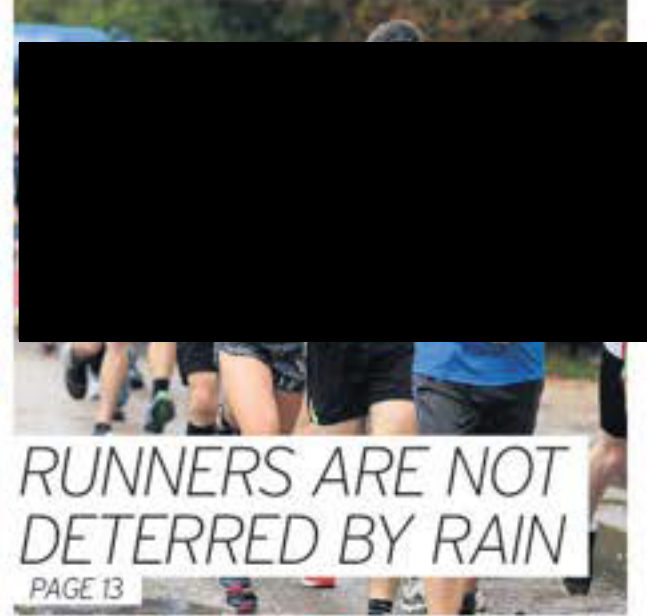

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that London Luton Airport Limited ("LLAL") of Hart House Business Centre, Kington Road, Luton, LU2 0LA intends to apply to the Secretary of State for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under section 37 of the 2008 Act to expand London Luton Airport ("LTN"), located to the south-east of Luton. Under section 47 of the 2008 Act, LLAL has a duty to consult the local community in accordance with a Statement of Community Consultation ("SoCC"), which sets out how LLAL will undertake its consultation. This notice publicises where and when the SoCC can be inspected, pursuant to section 47(6)(a).

Additionally, LLAL has a duty to publicise the proposed application under section 48 of the 2008 Act in line with Regulation 4 of the 2009 Regulations. In accordance with those provisions, this notice also summarises the main proposals and explains when the consultation documents can be viewed.

Summary of Proposed Works

The proposed DCO application would, amongst other things, authorise the construction and operation of a new second terminal and associated facilities, including new aircraft stands, apron and taxiways, predominantly on the north side of the existing runway at LTN. This would allow LTN to make best use of the existing single runway, in accordance with government aviation policy. In addition to the new terminal, the DCO application would authorise adjustments to the existing terminal and its associated aircraft stands, to allow the expansion to be phased over time and in line with growing demand to 32 million passengers per annum ("mppa"). The current permitted capacity of the airport is 18 mppa.

To accommodate the expansion, a major earthworks operation would be required to the east of the existing airport to create the platform on which the new terminal and associated facilities would be located. The proposed DCO application would also include replacement open space to compensate for the area of Wignore Valley Park into which the airport would expand, along with environmental mitigation works in the vicinity of the airport. To achieve this increase in passenger numbers, associated improvements to surface access transport infrastructure, including connecting roads and off-site junctions would also be required.

The proposed project is Environmental Impact Assessment development ("EIA development"), as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which Environmental Impact Assessment is required. An Environmental Statement will therefore be submitted as part of the proposed application containing information about the environmental effects of the proposed development. Campaign aims to save shop

Petition has hundreds of signatures

Customers are rallying round to save Martin's newsagents and Post Office, thanks to a determined Dunstable street trader who has started a petition.

Harvey Blake, who runs a menswear stall, created the campaign last Monday after hearing that the Ashton Square shop, which is run by McColl's, was planning to close early next year.

Upset at the thought of another shop going, Mr Blake handed the petition to staff at the newsagents and post office, and it has already attracted around 300 signatures

from customers.

Mr Blake claimed: "Another shop closing is not good for the town. It's struggling anyway.

"What about the staff who will be made redundant? And what about the elderly? It's not going to help.

"Why should people lose their jobs for all the service they have given to the community?"

"The elderly rely on the shop, as they can't walk very far.

"It will also be a devastating blow to the street traders in the area."

McColl's has the franchise for its Dunstable Post Office and also employs the staff who run it.

A source alleged that five or six jobs would be lost at Martin's newsagents and Post Office, claiming the closure was due to high rent and rates.

There is another Post Office at Queensway, near Asda, but Mr Blake claimed that this is too far for residents to walk, and could make them a vulnerable target of crime if they have to travel a longer distance by themselves.

He said: "Going down towards Asda is so dangerous, going over that main road.

"There is a crossing but it's too long for the elderly; they can't walk fast. Lots of people have been hit there.

"There's a crossing at the

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that London Luton Airport Limited ("LLAL") of Hart House Business Centre, Kington Road, Luton, LU2 0LA intends to apply to the Secretary of State for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under section 37 of the 2008 Act to expand London Luton Airport ("LTN"), located to the south-east of Luton.

Under section 47 of the 2008 Act, LLAL has a duty to consult the local community in accordance with a Statement of Community Consultation ("SoCC"), which sets out how LLAL will undertake its consultation. This notice publicises where and when the SoCC can be inspected, pursuant to section 47(6)(a).

Additionally, LLAL has a duty to publicise the proposed application under section 48 of the 2008 Act in line with Regulation 4 of the 2009 Regulations. In accordance with those provisions, this notice also summarises the main proposals and explains when the consultation documents can be viewed.

Summary of Proposed Works

The proposed DCO application would, amongst other things, authorise the construction and operation of a new second terminal and associated facilities, including new aircraft stands, apron and taxiways, predominantly on the north side of the existing runway at LTN. This would allow LTN to make best use of the existing single runway, in accordance with government aviation policy. In addition to the new terminal, the DCO application would authorise adjustments to the existing terminal and its associated aircraft stands, to allow the expansion to be phased over time and in line with growing demand to 32 million passengers per annum ("mppa"). The current permitted capacity of the airport is 18 mppa.

To accommodate the expansion, a major earthworks operation would be required to the east of the existing airport to create the platform on which the new terminal and associated facilities would be located. The proposed DCO application would also include replacement open space to compensate for the area of Wignore Valley Park into which the airport would expand, along with environmental mitigation works in the vicinity of the airport. To achieve this increase in passenger numbers, associated improvements to surface access transport infrastructure, including connecting roads and off-site junctions would also be required.

The proposed project is Environmental Impact Assessment development ("EIA development"), as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which Environmental Impact Assessment is required. An Environmental Statement will therefore be submitted as part of the proposed application containing information about the environmental effects of the proposed development. MP seeks answers on academy 'disruption'

South West Beds MP Andrew Selous has voiced concern over reported disruption to lessons at a troubled secondary school in Houghton Regis.

Last month Greenwood Academies Trust announced it had sought permission from the Department for Education to shut down Houghton Regis Academy.

The school was said to be undersubscribed with falling pupil numbers due to slow progress in the housing expansion of the town, as well as a financial deficit of £1.1m.

Mr Selous says he has spoken to Greenwood Academies Trust chief executive officer

Wayne Norrie at length about the future of the secondary school.

Mr Selous said: "I am very concerned by reports I have had from parents about lessons being disrupted and children not being able to learn."

"Wayne Norrie has told me that he will be visiting the school again himself next week and will report back to me on what action the headteacher, deputy head and the senior leadership team are taking to make sure that no lessons are disrupted and that children are able to learn well in lessons.

"I understand that specialist subject teachers are being provided to the school through the Redborne Teaching School Alliance and Greenwood Academies Trust is

making a further IT investment in the school to benefit the children's learning.

"I will continue to keep a very close eye on the quality of education throughout the period up to the creation of the new secondary school in Houghton Regis which was unanimously approved for funding by Central Bedfordshire Council on Tuesday evening and is excellent news.

"I am also working to try to make sure that there is a seamless transition from the closure of Houghton Regis Academy to the new secondary school."

Murderer targeted 'vulnerable' shopkeeper

A BURGLAR has been found guilty of killing a shopkeeper in his own shop during a "one-man crimewave".

Alex Gunn, 31, was caught on CCTV fatally stabbing 64-year-old Ravi Katharkamar at Marsh Food and Wine in Pinner, early on March 24, shortly after the trader had opened up.

Gunn could be seen on camera holding a knife to Mr Katharkamar's throat and grappling with him before stabbing him in the chest.

A jogger discovered the victim collapsed and alerted emergency services, who pronounced him dead at the scene.

The shopkeeper, who lived in Watford, had suffered two knife wounds, one of which fractured a rib and punctured his lung and heart.

The masked assailant made off with the till and drove away in a stolen black Vauxhall Astra.

The Old Bailey heard that Gunn had visited Marsh Food and Wine twice in the stolen car before the fatal robbery, including one visit a week earlier, almost to the minute.

He was driving the Astra when he was arrested five days later, having changed the number plates to evade detection, jurors were told.

Prosecutor Bill Emlyn Jones QC said Gunn was "sufficiently savvy" to cover himself with a balaclava and gloves during the attack on Mr Katharkamar, but his build, movements and other CCTV footage gave him away.

Describing Gunn as a "one-man crimewave", he told jurors he was also responsible for a string of

burglaries and thefts all to his drug habit.

Gunn, of Pinner Grove, Pinner, denied being responsible for the killing but the jury found him guilty of murder, robbery, five burglaries, three thefts, and counts of possession of a bladed article.

He was remanded into custody to be sentenced on Friday.

Devi Kharran, senior crown prosecutor within the CPS London homicide team, said: "This was a pattern of offending that escalated in March 2019 which tragically resulted in the death of an innocent family man."

"Gunn targeted Mr Katharkamar, who was alone and vulnerable inside his shop. The murder was caught on CCTV, and although Gunn used every effort to conceal his identity, the police were able to use reports of local burglaries and CCTV footage to piece together his movements and eventually track and arrest him."

"This case has had a real impact on the local community - particularly those who knew Ravi Katharkamar and were regular customers to his shop. I hope today's conviction provides some reassurance."

Cinema developer has grand designs

THE man behind the redevelopment of a Bollywood cinema believes it will help restore a sense of community.

Cinema group ArtHouse wants to revive the Safari Cinema site, in Station Road, Harrow.

A planning application has been submitted to Harrow Council to build 78 flats in a block up to 11 storeys high, retaining a cinema.

The developer also plans to restore the building's 1936 art deco facade, which has been covered by metal cladding for decades.

Sam Neophytou, who founded ArtHouse cinema in Crouch End, believes the project is the perfect opportunity to breathe new life into Harrow town centre.

"We've convinced the developer that it would be a brilliant fit," he said.

"There's this sense that the high street is dying and it's important to have places that everyone can go to.

"And there's a desperate need to invest in our creative industries - particularly in London.

"We want to encourage people to start making things and putting them out there."

This will include a series of workshops for budding filmmakers. Sam believes this is at the heart of ArtHouse, giving people a chance to tell their stories.

The cinema will house four screens, each one accommodating around 100 people.

As well as offering mainstream

pictures, he plans to show independent films and National Theatre productions.

"Things are changing in cinema - the things coming out are more about humanity and the struggles people have," Sam said.

"It's not as if people don't want

to hear these minority stories. They are some of our most popular screenings and have won loads of awards."

The concept of affordability is a criticism that is often levelled at cinemas, but Sam sees the cost of around £10 during peak hours as

reasonable and pointed out that there are regular discounts for students and seniors.

"It's important to have somewhere that appeals to everyone, somewhere where they can go to, feel safe and comfortable and enjoy themselves," he said.

CONMAN FAKED TICKET TO CLAIM £2.5 MILLION JACKPOT

Lottery fraudster jailed for nine years

A conman from Kings Langley has been jailed after cashing in a fake Lottery ticket to claim a £2.5 million jackpot.

Edward Putman, 54, from Station Road, conspired with a Camelot insider to cheat the system and present a counterfeit slip to claim the outstanding top prize in 2009.

The builder hatched the plot with friend Giles Knibbs - who then worked in the securities department at the Lottery operator - with the pair submitting a deliberately damaged forgery just before the 180-day limit to stake claims expired.

But the fraud unravelled after Mr Knibbs confessed to friends that he had "conned" the Lottery before taking his own life after an angry row about how the winnings were divided.

Putman appeared at St Al-

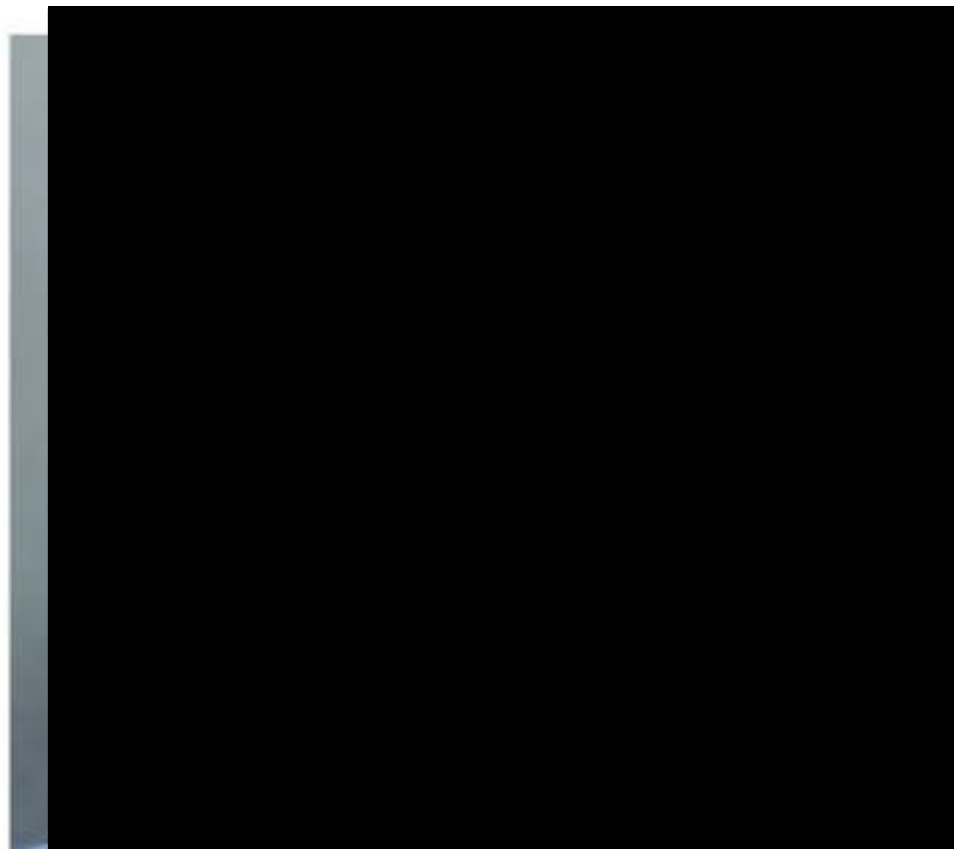
bans Crown Court after being found guilty of fraud by false representation and was sentenced to nine years in prison.

Detective chief inspector Sam Khanna, from Hertfordshire Constabulary's Serious Fraud and Cyber Unit, said: "This has been a very complex investigation, which only came to light after new information was received in 2015.

"Until that point the claim was assessed to be valid. The original ticket that was submitted was badly damaged but the defendant was able to provide sufficient information around the purchase of the ticket to enable the prize to be paid.

"In 2015 new information was received that the ticket had been faked and at this stage it was reported to Hertfordshire Constabulary. The investigation was long and complicated and opportunities to obtain evidence were minimal.

"The case hinged upon whether the ticket was genuine or not."

Now they need to raise cash to support the legal fight.

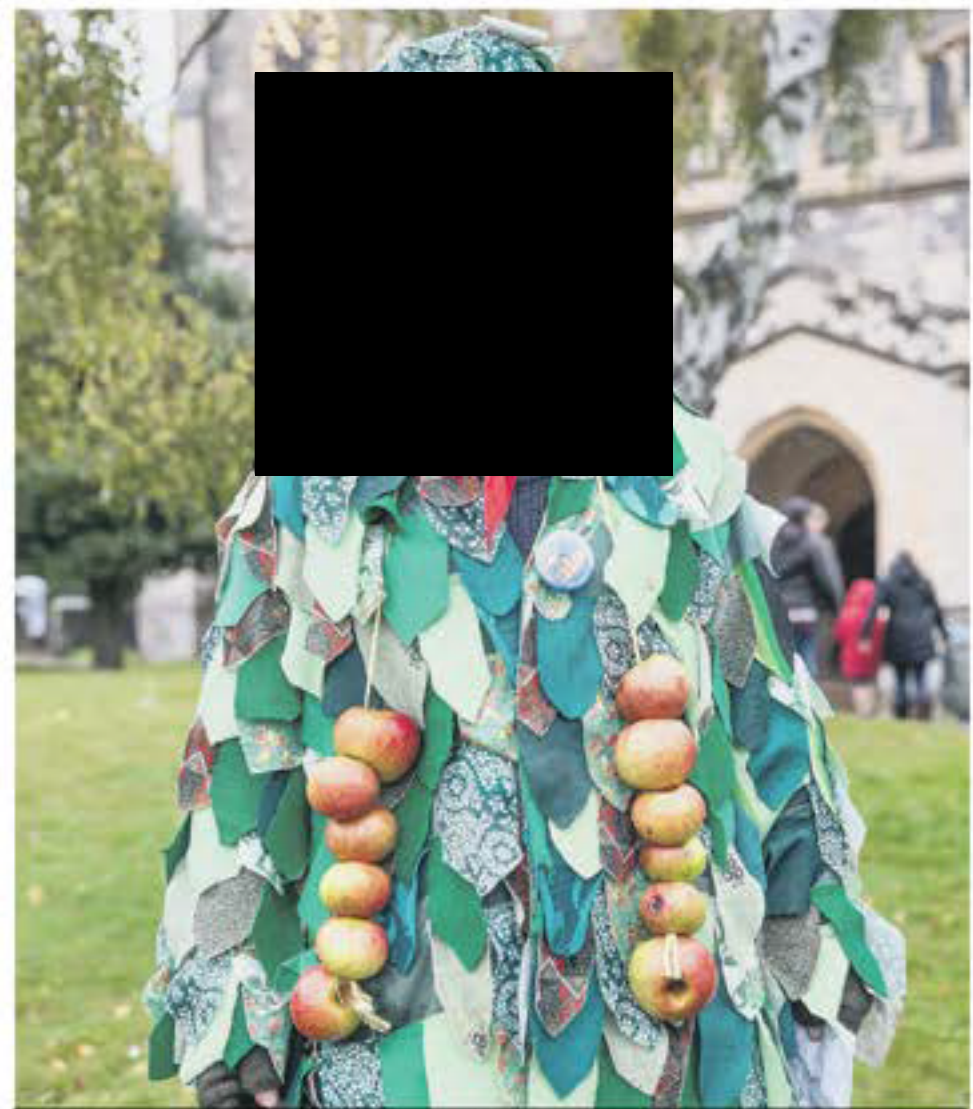

SADLY NO PASSION FOR PEOPLE POWER

The legacy of Luton Borough Council's poorly attended People Power Passion events has been questioned amid claims the money could have been better spent.

A one-off cost of £450,000 was invested in staging several events for 'People, Power, Passion' throughout 2019, as part of Luton's pilot year of culture.

The initiative was designed to commemorate 100 years since the Peace Day riots – when the town hall was burnt down – by showcasing local artists and performers reflecting Luton's fascinating history of people power.

The £450,000 is on top of the £235,000 currently spent on six annual popular events in the town, including St Patrick's Day and St George's Day celebrations, Luton International Carnival, Luton Mela,

the town's fireworks display and Lighting up Luton for Christmas.

These six annual events are funded through London Luton Airport contributions, and will include a Windrush event from next year.

Of the £450,000 spent on People Power Passion, £350,000 came from Luton Borough Council, £80,000 from Arts Council England and £20,000 from the People's Postcode Trust.

"I think that money could be better spent," Liberal Democrat Wigmore councillor Peter Chapman told the council's overview and scrutiny board.

"We've now got someone employed to assess how successful the event was," he said.

"It happens to be that person is the one who put the event on, so I can guess what they're going to come up with."

That person, the council's cultural enabler Michaela Nutt replied: "I directed and delivered the programme.

"We commissioned a national outside agency to eval-

uate it. The consultancy fees were £15,000. Their work will continue for many more months.

"They will be working with our skills development programme and looking at audiences, and really looking at what we can learn in terms of our low audience numbers, which have definitely been disappointing this year."

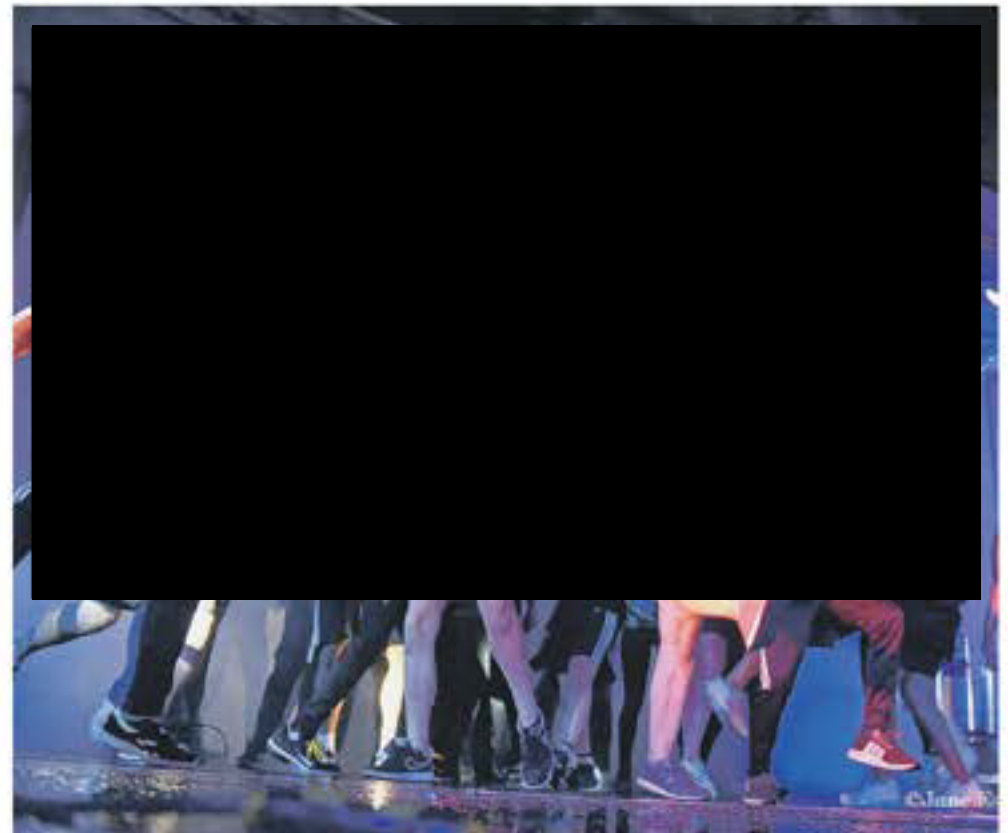
Councillor Chapman added: "That's the thing we need to take on board. My view is no way did that £450,000 have the impact that your £235,000 does.

"As an efficiency of spending money to get people involved, I think we've got something to learn from it.

"I would rather you add an extra £100,000 for the next four years and do something less ambitious short-term, but more ambitious long-term."

Cultural enabler Ms Nutt responded: "It's the only place I have worked in the world which has such a socially

ANTI-KNIFE CRIME MUM WINS AWARD

A mother whose son was brutally killed in a gang knife attack in Luton won the top prize at an emotion-filled awards night in the town.

Roseann Taylor turned her unimaginable grief, after the incident which took her son Azaan Kaleem's life in March 2018, into action by turning her energy into combating knife crime.

Roseann, who has spoken out at a national and local level, received the Winner of Winners Award, and Parent in a Million Award in recognition of her bravery at the Tenth Annual Community Awards.

Event host Sufian Sadiq spoke for the audience of 600 people at Venue Central, in Leagrave Road, on Friday, when he said: "Roseann is the most impressive person I have ever met.

"There is nothing more

powerful than hearing from a mother who has lost a son through knife crime."

Roseann was given a standing ovation by the crowd which included Lord Lieutenant Helen Nellis, the town's two MPs, and new Bedfordshire Police Chief Constable, Garry Forsyth.

The awards created by Mostaque Koyes, director of Community Interest Luton, a decade ago are headline sponsored by Pictons Solicitors.

They are the public face of an organisation that is changing lives in Luton.

The LETS Hub has helped more than 150 people into employment; the Curry Kitchen has served 22,800 hot meals in 228 weeks.

The awards themselves have seen more than £350,000 handed over to various charities.

This year's charity is the Luton and Dunstable Hospital Charitable Fund Helipad appeal, and they received not only a cheque for £15,000

PM fails to give support to new hospital campaign

The Prime Minister has snubbed a campaign for a new west Herts hospital by backing plans to spend millions renovating Watford General.

During a tour of Watford on Monday, Boris Johnson announced his support for plans to maximise investment in the hospital, saying it would result in "world class facilities".

West Herts Hospitals Trust (WHHT) and Herts Valleys Clinical Commissioning Group (HVCCG) have been given a £350 million budget to spend on hospital services, the bulk of which would go towards Watford General, with some renovations at St Albans City and Hemel Hempstead.

But the New Hospital Campaign has long maintained that a new, central A&E hospital is the best

option for west Herts, and hired building consultant Robert Scott to prove that the trust's plans are not workable.

Campaigner Edie Glatter said: "It seems the Prime Minister has only listened to one side - he has not had the chance to take note of the massive opposition to the Watford scheme.

"There needs to be fresh thinking, public consultation, and a new hospital on a central, accessible site. Surely the Prime Minister wouldn't want to condemn the people of west Herts to sub-standard, inaccessible hospital provision for generations to come, while at the same time

approving the plans for Princess Alexandra Hospital in Harlow to use their funding to build a brand new state-of-the-art hospital?"

Fellow campaigner, Andy Love, has written a letter to the PM arguing that the hospital's site in Vicarage Road, Watford is unsuitable for further development.

He said: "Watford General Hospital is in the back streets of Watford, right next door to a Premier League football ground and built on a very steep gradient.

"Not the best location to be undertaking a major redevelopment of an A&E hospital over the next five to 10 years."

WHHT recently received additional government funding to renovate buildings and improve mental health care at local hospitals over the next five years.

Airport consultation reaches final phase

Time is running out for the district's residents to have their say on Luton Airport's expansion plans to accommodate more passengers.

Luton Borough Council's airport company, London Luton Airport Ltd (LLAL) started its latest consultation yesterday, with a series of 34 consultation events taking place across the region.

The events will take place between October 25 and December 7, and members of the public will have the opportunity to look at the plans, speak with members of the project team and provide their views, before the consultation closes on December 16.

Following feedback received during the first consultation in summer 2018, LLAL is proposing sustainable, phased growth of the airport to 32 million passengers per annum (mppa) by 2039.

This will involve providing a second terminal north of the runway and extensive new airfield infrastructure.

Also proposed are a third station and extension for the Luton DART fast transit from Luton Airport Parkway station to the new terminal, plus on and off-site highway improvements.

LLAL is also proposing a new incremental funding package, which would provide up to an additional £14 million a year at 32 mppa for the local communities most impacted by airport operations.

They are not proposing any changes to the existing single runway, or any increase in the number of night flights currently permitted between 11.30pm and 6am.

Chief executive of Luton Borough Council Robin Porter

said the airport is a key driver for economic growth and prosperity in the region.

He said: "The proposed development would deliver enormous benefits, including an estimated 16,000 new jobs, with around a third of those directly employed at the airport."

St Albans MP Anne Main opposes the expansion plan, describing the situation as "intolerable".

She said: "The judge and jury

arrangement between Luton Borough Council and the airport has meant that residents feel they have no voice and whatever they do doesn't make a difference.

"Luton has quickly exceeded their previous passenger number estimates and they will no doubt do that again if this expansion is granted."

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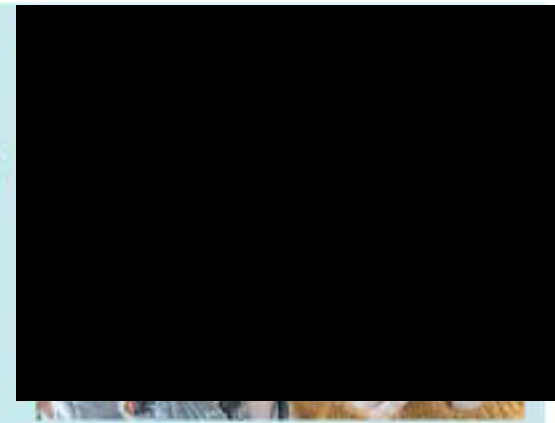

Body found in woodland could be murdered Joy

The family of a murdered student have been contacted after a body was found in woodland near Stevenage at the weekend.

Police were called by a member of the public at 7.43am on Saturday, who found what they believed to be a body in woodland off of Chadwell Road, in the Norton Green area just outside Stevenage.

Formal identification is likely to take place tomorrow, but Herts police are pursuing a line of inquiry that it could be the body of murdered University of Hertfordshire student Joy Morgan.

The 20-year-old – who had been studying midwifery at the Hatfield uni – was last seen alive at a church event in Ilford, East London, on Boxing Day 2018, and was reported missing by her

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mother on February 7.

Two weeks later, on February 22, the Comet accompanied a group of police officers with sniffer dogs who scoured grassland and woodland in the Norton Green area in the search for Joy.

Despite the absence of a body, Shofah El-Israel – of Cricklewood, North London – was found guilty of Joy's murder and sentenced to a minimum of 17 years in prison on August 5 this year, when Judge Michael Soole referred to the 40-year-old's "cruel and cowardly silence about Joy Morgan's final resting place".

El-Israel had met Joy at the

Israel United in Christ Church in Ilford, where they were both worshippers.

Following the new line of inquiry, police have confirmed that Joy's family is being supported by specially-trained officers and have asked for their privacy to be respected at this difficult time.

A post-mortem took place on Tuesday in which it was established the body is a female, and police expect to be able to confirm the identity tomorrow.

Doctor service is 'inadequate'

An out-of-hours doctor service operating from surgeries in Huntingdonshire has been branded "inadequate" by the Care Quality Commission and put in special measures.

Alconbury Weald-based West Cambs Federation Community Interest Company, which offers services from local surgeries, has been told to take action to put matters right by the watchdog.

The CQC rated services it offered from premises at the Acorn Surgery, Huntingdon, Cromwell Place Surgery, St Ives, and Buckden Surgery, as inadequate overall, together with a fourth premises in March.

All three, which are separate from the surgeries they are based at, were given individual inadequate ratings for safety of services, effectiveness of services and being well-led. They were all given "good" ratings over

whether services were caring and responsive to people's needs.

The federation, an independent provider, offers evening and weekend services to around 200,000 patients from 28 GP practices. It was founded in 2015 and started offering routine GP services from surgeries it uses, last September.

Dr Rosie Benneyworth, chief inspector of primary medical services, said in her CQC report: "I am placing this service in special measures. Services placed in special measures will be inspected again within six months.

"If insufficient improvements have been made such that there remains a rating of inadequate for any key question or overall,

we will take action in line with our enforcement procedures to begin the process of preventing the provider from operating the service."

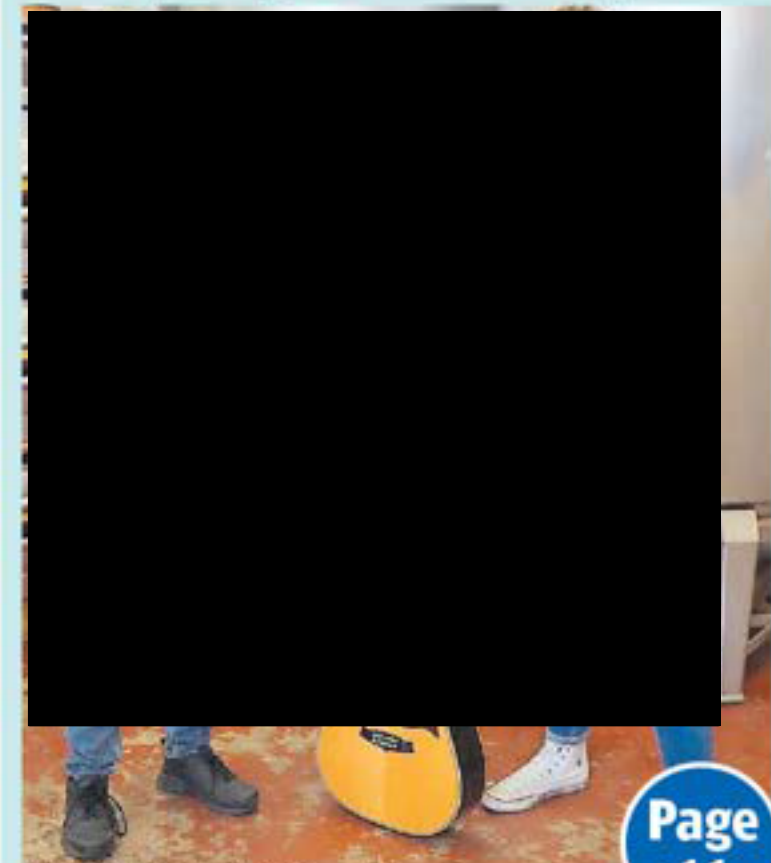
The CQC said there had been "multiple breaches" of the regulations and that the service had not ensured care and treatment was always provided in a safe way to patients and that patients were not adequately protected from avoidable harm and abuse.

It said the provider must make improvements to ensure patients received safe care, to establish effective governance systems, to ensure staff were suitably qualified.

A spokesman for the federation said they delivered the improved access service for evening and weekend, non-urgent clinical appointments from four hubs.

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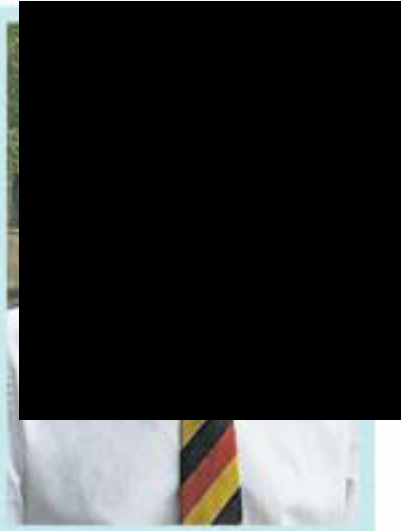

Murder investigation is launched after stabbing

Police have launched a murder investigation after a man was stabbed in St Neots.

A man in his 30s was arrested on suspicion of murder on Sunday and was taken to Colindale police station, in London, before being transferred to custody at Thorpe Wood police station, in Peterborough, while questioning continued.

Four people were also arrested on suspicion of assisting an offender on Sunday but have since been released.

A 68-year-old man and a 64-year-old woman from Eaton Socon were released under investigation while a man and a woman from London were released with no further action.

Emergency services were called at about 5.25pm on Sunday with reports that a man, aged in his 30s, had received serious injuries following an incident in Prince

Close, Eaton Socon.

Despite efforts from paramedics to save him, the man died at the scene and a murder investigation was launched.

Detective Chief Inspector Mike Branston, who is investigating, said the death was being treated as an isolated incident.

He said: "We will be continuing enquiries in and around the Eaton Socon area while our investigation into the death continues."

Witnesses reported seeing six police cars alongside paramedics at around 6pm on Sunday with a police cordon in place in Prince Close.

On Sunday, police were also seen at an address on Darrington Close, just under a mile away, in

connection with the incident.

A spokesman for the East of England Ambulance Service said: "We were called at 5.23pm on October 13 with reports that a man had been stabbed in Eaton Socon.

"We sent one ambulance, two ambulance officers and the Magpas Air Ambulance.

"Despite our best efforts, the man died at the scene."

A spokesman for the Magpas Air Ambulance said: "The Magpas Air Ambulance advanced medical team were called to the incident, they landed via the Magpas Air Ambulance at 5.45pm."

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that London Luton Airport Limited ("LLAL") of Hart House Business Centre, Kington Road, Luton, LU2 0LA intends to apply to the Secretary of State for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under section 37 of the 2008 Act to expand London Luton Airport ("LTN"), located to the south-east of Luton. Under section 47 of the 2008 Act, LLAL has a duty to consult the local community in accordance with a Statement of Community Consultation ("SoCC"), which sets out how LLAL will undertake its consultation. This notice publicises where and when the SoCC can be inspected, pursuant to section 47(6)(a).

Additionally, LLAL has a duty to publicise the proposed application under section 48 of the 2008 Act in line with Regulation 4 of the 2009 Regulations. In accordance with those provisions, this notice also summarises the main proposals and explains when the consultation documents can be viewed.

Summary of Proposed Works

The proposed DCO application would, amongst other things, authorise the construction and operation of a new second terminal and associated facilities, including new aircraft stands, apron and taxiways, predominantly on the north side of the existing runway at LTN. This would allow LTN to make best use of the existing single runway, in accordance with government aviation policy. In addition to the new terminal, the DCO application would authorise adjustments to the existing terminal and its associated aircraft stands, to allow the expansion to be phased over time and in line with growing demand to 32 million passengers per annum ("mppa"). The current permitted capacity of the airport is 18 mppa.

To accommodate the expansion, a major earthworks operation would be required to the east of the existing airport to create the platform on which the new terminal and associated facilities would be located. The proposed DCO application would also include replacement open space to compensate for the area of Wignore Valley Park into which the airport would expand, along with environmental mitigation works in the vicinity of the airport. To achieve this increase in passenger numbers, associated improvements to surface access transport infrastructure, including connecting roads and off-site junctions would also be required.

The proposed project is Environmental Impact Assessment development ("EIA development"), as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which Environmental Impact Assessment is required. CCTV released after food donations theft

Volunteers at Leighton Linslade Food Bank were left dumbstruck after a devious impostor stole two trolley loads of food donations from Tesco.

The brazen theft took place last Thursday (September 26), when two volunteers from Leighton Linslade Community Food Bank arrived at the Vimy Road store, only to be told that the donations had already been taken.

Now, Beds Police has released CCTV stills of a woman they believe can assist with their enquiries.

"For somebody to do this is appalling," said the food bank's co-ordinator, Paul Latimer, who runs Leighton Linslade Homeless Service.

"Whoever was behind it knew what time we usually come to pick up the donations, and they had phoned the shop



to say they were coming early.

"We have a mum and daughter who usually go on a Thursday lunchtime to unload the trolleys, and they were dumbstruck.

"They couldn't imagine why anybody would do this, especially at this time and in this economy when we're feeding more and more families."

Mr Latimer said he and vol-

unteers were shocked to learn that the alleged thief had come back to the store to continue shopping and to leave their car with the donations.

Following the theft, Mr Latimer said he was grateful to the community for its ongoing support for the town's homeless.

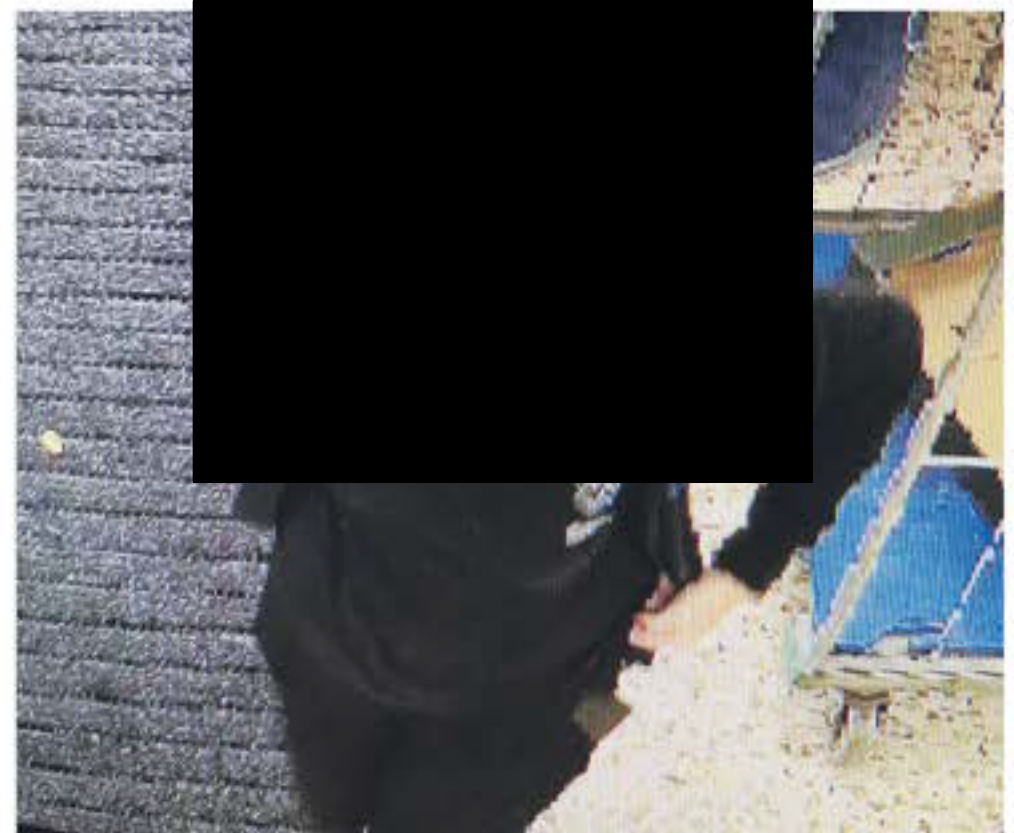
"We're very grateful for allowing us to leave those trolleys there.

"We feed an average of ten families with two to five children each and every week, but we've lost a lot of donations as a result of this theft.

"Anything that anyone can do to help us will always be greatly appreciated."

PC Jim Maden, from the Leighton Buzzard community policing team, said: "We believe the woman pictured can help us with our enquiries.

Showdown over police numbers

Leighton-Linslade Town Council is ramping up its challenge to Beds Police over the "thinly scattered" number of police officers keeping people safe in the south west of the county.

Last month, the town council wrote to Chief Constable Garry Forsyth to air its concerns over the perceived lack of local policing.

In response, the force has announced Detective Chief Superintendent David Boyle will attend the next full town council meeting on January 27, 2020, to discuss the police model for the town.

News of the visit comes amid rumours Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) Kathryn Holloway plans to step down from her role at next year's election, with the local Conservative Party already said to be profiling po-

tential candidates.

The LBO has been given a summary of the town council's letter.

The town council commended the community policing team for its "outstanding" work.

Residents have lost confidence in the police service given the perceived lack of visibility of officers.

The community policing team are expected to cover a huge geographical area from Barton-Le-Clay to Caddington and over to Leighton-Linslade. Overstretched resources are to the public so "thinly scattered to the point of being ineffective", with "a significant proportion of a shift having to go to custody in Luton".

In the opinion of the parish, policing numbers are not enough for an ever-expanding population which has increased by over a third in the past 10 years and will continue to grow as more houses are built.

The parish shares the same concerns as the outlying parishes regarding rural crime issues.

The town council will continue to do what it can to lobby for additional policing resources.

Accessing a point of police presence - currently housed in the fire station - is not acceptable and does little to foster public confidence.

In response, Beds Police stated that the policing model they currently operate works within the financial constraints they have to operate.

The force said it remained committed to community policing and it is expected that policing resources will increase over the coming three to four years as more officers are recruited and subsequently trained.

Last week, the commissioner announced the force had been given government funding to recruit an extra 54 officers in Bedfordshire.

The recruits will join during 2020-21, and are in addition to the 40 new officers which will be funded by an increase in council tax, as well as

those being hired to fill existing vacancies.

London Luton Airport Limited (LLAL) is writing to consult you on its proposals to expand London Luton Airport (LTN). This is a statutory pre-application consultation under the Planning Act 2008 (the 2008 Act).

The proposals include a new terminal and supporting facilities and infrastructure predominantly on the north side of the existing runway. Alongside adjustments to the existing terminal, this would allow expansion to be phased over time in line with demand, increasing capacity from the current permitted cap of 18 million passengers per annum (mppa) up to 32 mppa. The proposals also include: new public open space to compensate for the loss of part of Wigmore Valley Park; earthworks to the east of LTN to create the platform for expansion; and improvements to highway infrastructure serving LTN.

LLAL's expansion proposals are classified as a 'Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project' (NSIP). This means that an application for a Development Consent Order (DCO) is required to authorise our proposals. The application would be submitted to the Planning Inspectorate, which is responsible for examining DCO applications and making a recommendation to the Secretary of State, who then takes the decision on whether the proposals are approved.

Prior to making an application, LLAL is required under section 42 of the 2008 Act to consult certain specific people and organisations about our proposals. You are receiving this letter because we believe you fall into one of the categories of people or organisations that we are required to consult before submitting an application.

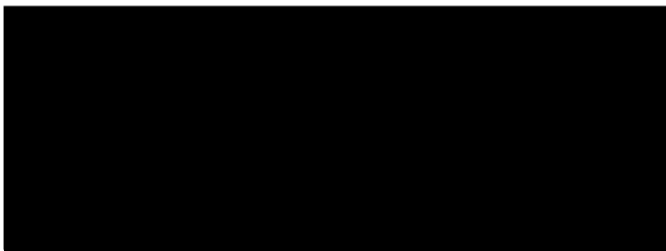

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that London Luton Airport Limited ("LLAL") of Hart House Business Centre, Kimpton Road, Luton, LU2 0LA intends to apply to the Secretary of State for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under section 37 of the 2008 Act to expand London Luton Airport ("LTN"), located to the south-east of Luton.

Under section 47 of the 2008 Act, LLAL has a duty to consult the local community in accordance with a Statement of Community Consultation ("SoCC"), which sets out how LLAL will undertake its consultation. This notice publicises where and when the SoCC can be inspected, pursuant to section 47(6)(a).

Additionally, LLAL has a duty to publicise the proposed application under section 48 of the 2008 Act in line with Regulation 4 of the 2009 Regulations. In accordance with those provisions, this notice also summarises the main proposals and explains where the consultation documents can be viewed.

Summary of Proposed Works

The proposed DCO application would, amongst other things, authorise the construction and operation of a new second terminal and associated facilities, including new aircraft stands, apron and taxiways, predominantly on the north side of the existing runway at LTN. This would allow LTN to make best use of the existing single runway, in accordance with government aviation policy. In addition to the new terminal, the DCO application would authorise adjustments to the existing terminal and its associated aircraft stands, to allow the expansion to be phased over time and in line with growing demand to 32 million passengers per annum ("mppa"). The current permitted capacity of the airport is 18 mppa.

To accommodate the expansion, a major earthworks operation would be required to the east of the existing airport to create the platform on which the new terminal and associated facilities would be located. The proposed DCO application would also include replacement open space to compensate for the area of Wigmore Valley Park into which the airport would expand, along with environmental mitigation works in the vicinity of the airport. To achieve this increase in passenger numbers, associated improvements to surface access transport infrastructure, including connecting roads and off-site junctions would also be required.

The proposed project is Environmental Impact Assessment development ("EIA development"), as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which Environmental Impact Assessment is required. An Environmental Statement will therefore be submitted as part of the proposed application containing information about the environmental effects of the proposed development. Request for information regarding interests in land in connection with proposed development

In December 2017, London Luton Airport Limited (LLAL) launched our 'Vision for Sustainable Growth 2020 – 2050' and in 2018 and 2019 we carried out public consultations on our proposals to increase the capacity of London Luton Airport. The proposals consulted on are set out in our scoping report, which can be found on the Planning Inspectorate's website:

LLAL plans to make an application for a Development Consent Order (DCO) under the Planning Act 2008 to obtain permission for the proposed expansion of London Luton Airport (the "proposed development"). As part of this application, we have a duty to identify all parties with a legal interest in land which is not required for the development itself, but is in area which may be affected by the proposed development. Examples of this may include land being within certain noise contours or being in close proximity to highway works associated with the development.

The purpose of this exercise, known as 'Land Referencing', is to identify those parties who will be statutory consultees on the proposed application before it is submitted. Those parties will also be notified when the DCO application is submitted. LLAL has engaged specialist firm WSP UK Limited (WSP) to conduct the Land Referencing exercise. A Land Referencing guidance sheet can be found at [REDACTED] which provides further details on the Land Referencing process.

You may have received a similar letter to this one last year. We are getting in contact with you again to confirm that the information we have, including information you may have previously provided, is still correct. This is a statutory obligation required of us by the DCO process and it allows us to keep you informed as our plans progress. Importantly, it also means that you are able to continue to help

us shape our vision for an expanded London Luton Airport. It is likely that we will need to contact you again before we submit our application.

Enclosed with this letter is a Land Interest Questionnaire (LIQ) which sets out our understanding from information that you may have previously provided to us and publicly available information, such as HM Land Registry, your interest in land relevant to the proposed development. We wish to confirm that we have correctly identified your details, your interest and the details of other parties that you understand may also have an interest in the land.

I would be grateful if you would complete the LIQ to confirm the information that we currently hold is correct and to identify any other people who may have relevant interests in the land so that we may contact them regarding the proposals.

Once completed, please sign the document and return it to WSP in the stamped addressed envelope provided with this letter, or alternatively you may e-mail a scanned copy to [REDACTED]. If you have any queries regarding the land referencing process or the LIQ, please contact WSP by email at [REDACTED] or by telephone on 0808 168 9105.

As part of our duty to identify those with an interest in the land, it is normal practice to visit land owners who have not returned the questionnaire, in order to seek information in person. If we do not receive a completed response we may therefore visit the property(ies) in the enclosed questionnaire, at a date later this year. Should we need to visit we will do so following any guidance applicable at the time relating to relevant Covid-19 safety precautions.



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that London Luton Airport Limited ("LLAL") of Hart House Business Centre, Kimpton Road, Luton, LU2 0LA intends to apply to the Secretary of State for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under section 37 of the 2008 Act to expand London Luton Airport ("LTN"), located to the south-east of Luton.

Under section 47 of the 2008 Act, LLAL has a duty to consult the local community in accordance with a Statement of Community Consultation ("SoCC"), which sets out how LLAL will undertake its consultation. This notice publicises where and when the SoCC can be inspected, pursuant to section 47(6)(a).

Additionally, LLAL has a duty to publicise the proposed application under section 48 of the 2008 Act in line with Regulation 4 of the 2009 Regulations. In accordance with those provisions, this notice also summarises the main proposals and explains where the consultation documents can be viewed.

Summary of Proposed Works

The proposed DCO application would, amongst other things, authorise the construction and operation of a new second terminal and associated facilities, including new aircraft stands, apron and taxiways, predominantly on the north side of the existing runway at LTN. This would allow LTN to make best use of the existing single runway, in accordance with government aviation policy. In addition to the new terminal, the DCO application would authorise adjustments to the existing terminal and its associated aircraft stands, to allow the expansion to be phased over time and in line with growing demand to 32 million passengers per annum ("mppa"). The current permitted capacity of the airport is 18 mppa.

To accommodate the expansion, a major earthworks operation would be required to the east of the existing airport to create the platform on which the new terminal and associated facilities would be located. The proposed DCO application would also include replacement open space to compensate for the area of Wigmore Valley Park into which the airport would expand, along with environmental mitigation works in the vicinity of the airport. To achieve this increase in passenger numbers, associated improvements to surface access transport infrastructure, including connecting roads and off-site junctions would also be required.

The proposed project is Environmental Impact Assessment development ("EIA development"), as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which Environmental Impact Assessment is required. 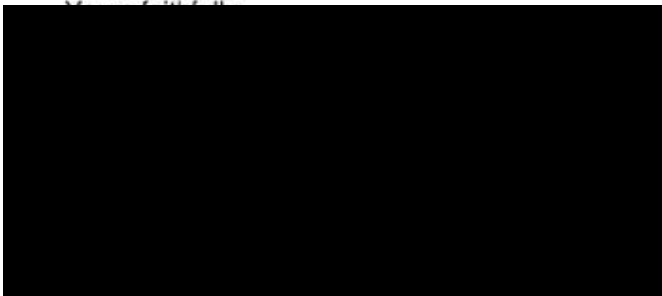

We act for London Luton Airport Limited ("**LLAL**") which is seeking to increase the capacity of London Luton Airport ("**LTN**") to accommodate 32 million passengers per annum ("**mppa**") ("**the Proposed Development**") as part of their Vision for Sustainable Growth 2020 to 2050 published in 2017. LTN currently has planning permission for a capacity of 18mppa.

LLAL proposes to apply for a Development Consent Order ("**DCO**") under the Planning Act 2008 as the Proposed Development is a nationally significant infrastructure project under section 23 of that Act. This is because:

- under section 23(1)(b) the Proposed Development involves the alteration¹ of an airport in England, the effect of which to increase by more than 10 million per year the number of passengers for whom the airport is capable of providing air passenger transport services; and
- under section 23(1)(c) the Proposed Development involves an increase in the permitted² use of an airport in England of more than 10 million per year in the number of passengers for whom the airport is currently permitted to provide air passenger transport services.

In accordance with regulations 8(1)(b) and 10(1) of the EIA Regulations, LLAL hereby:

¹ For the purposes of section 23(6), "alteration" is satisfied in this case because the Proposed Development includes (amongst other things) the construction of a new terminal building.

² "Permitted" means permitted by planning permission or development consent (section 23(7)). The current planning permission is capped at 18mppa.

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- a) notifies the Secretary of State that it proposes to provide an environmental statement in respect of the Proposed Development with its application for a DCO; and
- b) requests the Secretary of State to state in writing their opinion as to the scope, and level of detail, of the information to be provided in the environmental statement (a scoping opinion).

The information required by regulations 8(3A) and 10(3) of the EIA Regulations and Advice Note Seven: *Environmental Impact Assessment: Process, Preliminary Environmental Information and Environmental Statements* is set out in the enclosed EIA Scoping Report.

We enclose with this letter a hard copy of the EIA Scoping Report. An electronic copy, as agreed, is provided via Sharefile, the login details to which have been provided to the Planning Inspectorate by email. Advance notice of the application and a GIS shapefile was submitted to the Planning Inspectorate by email on 15 March 2019.

The Applicant

As stated above, the applicant of the proposed DCO is London Luton Airport Limited of Hart House Business Centre, Kimpton Road, Luton, LU2 0LA.

Plan to identify the land

In accordance with regulations 8(3A) and 10(3)(a) of the EIA Regulations, a plan sufficient to identify the land affected by the Proposed Development is set out at Figure 2.1 of the enclosed EIA Scoping Report.

Description of Proposed Development

The Proposed Development is described at section 3 of the EIA Scoping report. In summary, the Proposed Development includes the following:

- Creation of an airfield platform: earthworks from on-site excavation;
- New terminal with boarding piers;
- Additional taxiways and aprons (aircraft stands);
- Vehicle forecourt and multi-storey short-stay/mid-stay car parking adjacent to the terminal. Additional mid and long-stay surface parking, including replacement where the existing facilities are disturbed;
- Airfield facilities: Relocated engine run-up bay, compass swing bay and de-icing area, and fire training facilities;
- Landside facilities: Airport associated support buildings such as snow base, energy centre, logistics centre and service yard, and new fuel line connection and storage facilities;
- Surface access: Road and infrastructure provision and adjustments. Bus station, taxi ranks and extension of Luton DART to the new terminal;
- Surface water and foul management, including drainage, interceptors, surface water attenuation and treatment, foul water collection and treatment, effluent storage and discharge to ground; and
- Landscaping: Improvement or replacement of existing and planned public open space and amenities.

Likely significant effects of the Proposed Development on the Environment

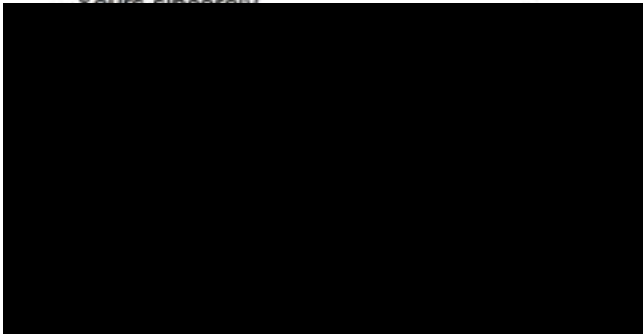

The role of the Planning Inspectorate in the application process is to provide independent and impartial advice about the procedures involved and to have open discussions with potential applicants, statutory bodies and others about the processes and requirements of the new regime. It is important that you keep us accurately informed of your timetable and any changes that occur.

We will publish advice we give to you or other Interested Parties on our website and, if relevant, direct parties to you as the Applicant. We are happy to meet at key

milestones and / or provide advice as the case progresses through the Pre-application stage.

Once you have prepared draft documents we are able to provide technical advice, in particular on the draft Development Consent Order, Explanatory Memorandum, the Consultation Report and any draft HRA. You may therefore wish to build this into your timetables.

In the meantime, you may wish to have regard to the guidance and legislation material provided on our website including the Infrastructure Planning (Fees) Regulations 2010 (as amended) and associated guidance, which you will need to observe closely in establishing the correct fee to be submitted at the successive stages of the application process.

When seeking to meet your Pre-application obligations you should also be aware of your obligation under the current data protection legislation to process personal data fairly and lawfully.
