1 Welcome, introductions, arrangements for the Hearing

2 Construction noise and vibration

The Applicant will be asked to justify aspects of their reasonable worst-case assessment, including assumptions regarding, methods and hours of working, use of hoardings, types of plant used and the approach to assessment of works at Junction 10 of the M1.

3 Surface access noise

Aspects of the surface access noise assessment including modelling approach, assumptions and the model validation process will be discussed. The Applicant will be asked to explain how upgrades to the existing road network have informed the traffic noise model for future scenarios.

4 Fixed plant noise

The Applicant will be asked to justify its approach to control of fixed plant noise (including for non-residential receptors) and confirm how this satisfies the requirements of the Airports National Policy Statement (ANPS) to provide a description of noise sources and an assessment of the likely significant effects of predicted changes on any noise sensitive premises. The Applicant will be asked to explain how the approach would avoid 'creep' in light of evolving baseline noise conditions due to the Proposed Development.

5 Aviation noise assessment (including ground noise)

The Applicant will be asked to provide a brief explanation of the Aviation Environmental Design Tool (AEDT) noise model and the noise model validation process, including commentary on its ability to assess cumulative noise.

The following matters will also be discussed:

- the use of the 2019 actuals baseline and consented baseline
- Fleet mix assumptions and the assumption of guieter planes

- The approach to model validation and modelling assumptions
- The level of detail provided in respect of noise impacts on non-residential receptors
- The implications of phasing and limits of deviation for the conclusions of the operational noise impact assessment

6 Green Controlled Growth (GCG) and wider noise mitigation approach

Noise controls and mitigation will be considered including:

- Night noise controls and whether a ban on scheduled night flights should be imposed on the airport to provide predictable periods of respite
- Whether noise controls from the existing planning permission should be retained
- The use of the faster growth scenario and the noise controls proposed in the APP-218 GCG framework (as amended by REP2-032), where not already discussed as part of the ISH1 on the draft Development Consent Order (DCO)
- The principle of increasing aviation noise up to 2027 prior to delivering noise
 mitigation to all eligible properties and whether this can be deemed to satisfy the
 ANPS (or Noise Policy Statement England (NPSE)) requirement to make particular
 efforts to avoid significant adverse noise impacts of the scheme
- Other mitigation measures including details of any flight operational procedures to be applied under the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) balanced approach such as steeper descent approaches, keeping landing gear up as long as possible, minimum altitude requirements, measures to reduce go-arounds, adherence to continuous descent approach and incentives such as differential landing charges, noise violation charges and noise quotas.
- The status of the London Luton Airport Noise Action Plan 2024-2029.

All Interested Parties are welcome to attend the hearing. However, the ExA considers that representatives for the following parties should consider attending because the ExA believes that the material that they have submitted raises issues that may need to be explored at the hearing:

- The Applicant
- Luton Borough Council in its role as Local Planning Authority
- Any other public authority affected by the proposed development
- The Civil Aviation Authority
- LADACAN

The Applicant is requested to have people with the following expertise to assist the hearing:

- Construction methods and assessment
- Noise and vibration assessment and modelling
- Aviation noise policy

This list may also assist other Interested Parties in preparing for the hearing.

Conduct and Management of Hearings

The Planning Act 2008 and the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 provide that the ExA that will probe, test and assess the evidence at hearings through direct questioning of persons making oral representations. Questioning at this Hearing will therefore be led by the ExA. Cross questioning of the person giving evidence by another person will **only** be permitted if the ExA decides it is necessary to ensure representations are adequately tested or that a person has had a fair chance to put their case. Parties wishing to make a representation will be invited to do so at the ExA's discretion.

The ExA will begin the Hearing with opening comments and introductions, then will run through housekeeping matters and explain how the Hearing will be conducted. The ExA's expectation is that each hearing session will typically last for one to two hours. However, the actual duration will depend on the progress made on the day and will be subject to the ExA's powers of control over the conduct of the Hearing.

The agenda may be amended by the ExA at the start of the Hearing or throughout its course. Furthermore, the ExA may wish to raise matters arising from oral submissions, Relevant Representations and Written Representations, and pursue lines of inquiry that are not listed on the agenda in the course of the discussion.

The Hearing is being held at the discretion of the ExA to consider matters that it considers to be important and relevant to the effective and robust examination of the application. Consequently, the business of the Hearing will be limited to the matters identified in the agenda or otherwise raised by the ExA.

Active participation is at the invitation and discretion of the ExA. Oral submissions must address the matters and questions identified on the Hearing agenda or raised by the ExA at the hearing. Oral submissions on other subject matters or from persons who have not been invited to speak by the ExA may only be heard at the discretion of the ExA, who may decide that such matters are not heard in the interests of relevance, efficiency or fairness.

A recording and transcript of the Hearing will be published by the Planning Inspectorate on the project page of the national infrastructure website³ and any Interested Party may make a written submission on the specific matters either included in the agenda or arising at the Hearing by **Deadline 3, 5 October 2023**.
