

Description:

Remnant of larger ancient semi-natural Pedunculate Oak (Quercus robur)/Hornbeam (Carpinus betulus) with birch (Betula spp.) woodland. The northern part of the wood is predominantly old Hornbeam coppice with occasional mature Ash (Fraxinus excelsior) and Field Maple (Acer campestre) coppice plus scattered Wild Cherry (Prunus avium), birch and Pedunculate Oak. At either end of the site and further to the south the wood is dominated by mature birch with scattered Pedunculate Oak, Ash and Hazel (Corylus avellana), particularly to the central area. Along the southern edge the wood is quite open with Bracken (Pteridium aquilinum) dominant. Below the canopy the field layer is dominated by Bluebell (Hyacinthoides non-scripta), with Dog's Mercury (Mercurialis perennis), Yellow Archangel (Lamiastrum galeobdolon), Wood Melick (Melica uniflora) present in the assemblage. Wildlife Site criteria: Ancient woodland with a semi-natural canopy and field evidence suggesting an ancient origin; >1 ha; shown on Bryant's map (1822). woodland indicator species.
