Surface Traffic submission on acute delays (Feb 1 -5) on the A1081 for the Inspectorate to consider. The images shown on the attached document demonstrate the delays and the exhaust pollution that was filling the local roads all day long.

This is just one example of road repairs that are an ongoing problem in the road network surrounding London Luton Airport.

Additionally the M1 from Junction 10 -13 is now undergoing repair work north and south for the next year.

## Feb 2024. Luton Airport Surface Traffic considerations need reviewing because...
