

Also I'm sure that the highly important aviation fire training school would not be able to continue fire exercises so close to a large housing estate, and would therefore be lost.

Encouraging General Aviation to return to Manston is another facility which we have missed, and could easily increase the usage of the airport and could accommodate both light aircraft and business flights with High Speed rail links to London making Manston a very attractive prospect for travellers.

Whilst it proved difficult to get passenger carriers to set up at Manston, KLM showed that it was possible and with the proposals put forward by Riveroak, I believe that Manston Airport would be a successful and important addition to the country's aviation needs



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
