



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Introduction and Purpose

Purpose of Statement of Common Ground

- This Statement of Common Ground ("SoCG") relates to an application made by RiverOak Strategic Partners Limited ("RiverOak") to the Planning Inspectorate under sections 14 and 35(2)(ii) of the Planning Act 2008 ("Act").
- The application is for a development consent order ("DCO"). The draft DCO is referred to as the Manston Airport DCO. The DCO, if granted, would authorise RiverOakto reopen and operate an airport on the site of the former Manston airport in the district of Thanet inKent and associated development ("Development").
- RiverOak submittedthe DCO application to the Planning Inspectorate on 17 July 2018and it was accepted for examination by the Planning Inspectorate on 14 August 2018.
- This SoCG has been prepared by RiverOak andthe Royal Air ForceManston History MuseumAssociationin respect of the Development.
- The purpose and possible content of SoCGs is set out in paragraphs 58-65 of the Department for Communities and Local Government's guidance entitled "Planning Act 2008: examination of applications for development consent" (26 March 2015). Paragraph 58 of that guidance explains the basic function of SoCGs:
 - "A statement of common ground is a written statement prepared jointly by theapplicant and another party or parties, setting out any matters on which theyagree. As well as identifying matters which are not in real dispute, it is alsouseful if a statement identifies those areas where agreement has not been reached. The statement should include references to show where those matters are dealt with in the written representations or other documentary evidence."
- SoCGs are therefore a useful and established means of ensuring that the evidence at the DCO examination focuses on the material differences between the main parties, and so aim to help facilitate a more efficient examination process.
- The purpose of the SoCG is to set out agreed factual information about the DCO application by RiverOak. It is intended that the SoCG should provide matters on which

RiverOak and theRoyal Air Force ManstonHistory Museum Associationagree. As well as identifying matters which are not in dispute, the SoCG may also identify areas where agreement has not been reached.

RiverOak and the Royal Air ForceManston History Museum Associationare collectively referred to in this SOCG as 'the parties'. The parties have been, and continue to be, in direct communication in respect of the interface between the proposed Development and the Royal Air Force Manston History Museum Association.

It is envisaged that this SoCG will evolve during the examination phase of the DCO application.

Subsequent drafts will be agreed and issued, with the version numbersclearly recorded in the 'Document Control' table at the beginning of the document.

The role oftheRoyal Air Force ManstonHistory Museum Association and the DCO application

The Royal Air ForceManstonHistory Museum Associationisa registered charity (charity number 1075396) and museum located at the historic airfield at Manston in Kent. The Association's objectives are to record the history of RAF Manston and its surrounding satellites at RAF Ash, RAF Sandwich and RAF Dunkirk, through increasing its collection of artefacts and through maintenance of existing exhibits, and providing an insight into the history through its museum and events. The museum has an interest in plot 47 as listed in the Book of Reference (application document reference TR020002/APP/3.3) and as shown on the land plans (application document reference TR020002/APP/4.2).

The RAF Manston Spitfire and Hurricane Memorial Museum(charity number 1159597) is located adjacent to the Royal Air ForceManston History Museum Association and does not form part of it.

The Development location and description

The Development site lies adjacent to the village of Manston, approximately 13 miles northeast of Canterbury and one mile north-west of Ramsgate. It is on the former site of Manston Kent International Airport which closed on 15 May 2014and is within Thanet District Council and Kent County Council boundaries.

The Development site comprises approximately 732 acres of land. The area in which the proposed Development would be located comprises land to the south and north of Manston Road.

The Proposed Development comprises all works to provide an integrated aviation services hub with the main feature being a major international centre for air freight that is capable of handling a minimum of 10,000 air freight Air Traffic Movements per year, and otherdevelopment that has a direct relationship with the main feature and which is required to support its construction and/or operation.

The Proposed Development comprises:

upgrade of Runways 10/28 to allow CAT II/III;

re-alignment of the parallel taxiway (Alpha) to provide European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) compliant clearances for runway operations;

construction of 19 EASA compliant Code E stands for air freight aircraft with markings capable of handling Code D and F aircraft in different configurations;

installation of new high mast lighting for aprons and stands;

construction of 65,600m² of cargo facilities;

construction of a new air traffic control (ATC) tower;

construction of a new airport fuel farm;

construction of a new airport rescue and firefighting service station;

complete fit-out of airfield navigational aids (nav-aids);

construction of new aircraft maintenance / recycling hangars;

development of the Northern Grass area of airport related businesses;

demolition of the redundant 'old' ATC Tower;

safeguarding of existing facilities for museums on the site;

highway improvement works; and

extension of passenger service facilities including an apron extension to accommodate an additional aircraft stand and increasing the current terminal size.

Consultation with the Royal Air Force Manston History Museum Association

- 09 June 2017: 2017 statutory consultation s.42 letter sent on behalf of RiverOak: no response received from the Royal Air Force Manston History Museum Association
- 12 January 2018: 2018 statutory consultation s.42 letter sent on behalf of RiverOak: no response received from the Royal Air Force Manston History Museum Association
- 7 February 2018: letter seeking to advance voluntary negotiations sent by Bircham Dyson Bell LLP on behalf of RiverOak to the Royal Air Force Manston History Museum Association
- 29 August 2018: representatives of RiverOak met with representatives of the Royal Air Force Manston History Museum Associationin person to discuss the DCO application.

Matters which are fully agreed between the parties

This section of the SOCG describes the 'matters agreed' in detail between the parties.

- The museum is located within the pink safeguarded area shown on plan RPS-MSE-XX-DR-C-2000 appended to this agreement;
- It is likely that if the DCO is granted that, due to the necessary and required road improvements at the junction of Manston Road and Spitfire Way, theRoyal Air ForceManston History Museum Association would be re-located within the safeguarded area;
- TheRoyal Air ForceManston History Museum Association trustees and board members are interested in a more modern facility for the museum;
- TheRoyal Air ForceManston History Museum Association has established a working group to act in the interest of the museum in relation to the DCO application;

Matters agreed in principle between the parties

This section of the SOCG describes the 'matters agreed' in principle between the parties.

RiverOak are committed to the museum being relocated to a new facility, in consultation between the parties.

Upon relocation, RiverOak will ensure that title to the freehold of the land to which the museum will move will be conveyed to the museum.

The parties will review the long term funding requirements of the Royal Air ForceManston History Museum Association;

RiverOak will offer support to the Royal Air Force Manston History Museum Association to carry out an options appraisal and feasibility study; and


RiverOak will provide business plan support to the museum.
