SUBMISSION FOR DEADLINE 5 COMMENTS ON APPLICANT'S DL4 RESPONSES FROM LOCAL BUSINESS AND INTERESTED PARTY, FIVE10TWELVE LTD

Explanatory Note:

- 1. In response to Applicant's Comments on Written Representations with regards to tourism in which the Applicant asserts that Socio-economic impact upon tourism as a result of the proposed development ...is assessed as not having an adverse effect" 1 and/or "...effects on the local economy and tourism would be minor beneficial". 2
- 2. As we have stated in our own comments on Applicant's response to Written Questions, (socio-economic), we find the Applicant's conclusions regarding impact on tourism to be deeply flawed, unreasonable, irresponsible and "bordering on contempt" for an industry that is worth £319m to the local economy³.
- 3. In order to further illustrate the point beyond our own voice and understanding of these issues or that of the Applicant we have produced an online survey⁴ of local businesses in Ramsgate. The questions in this survey have been designed to explore responses to the following key themes:
 - How business owners feel the proposed develop will impact on their business
 - How well informed or otherwise the business owner is with regards to the proposed development and its impacts
 - Business owners understanding of any noise mitigation measures that may be required or their business and who may be responsible for providing such mitigation
 - Attitudes of business owners towards engaging with the DCO examination process and/or making their voices heard
- 4. At the time of writing the survey has been live for approximately 48hrs. We intend to file full responses at Deadline 6. Given the timetable for the ExA to ask further questions, however, we have presented overleaf summaries of responses received to date to help inform any additional interrogation of the Applicant's assumptions.






How important is this type of custom to your business - Inbound Tourists



How important is this type of custom to your business - Hospitality services (incl. F&B, cafe culture etc)




How important is this type of custom to your business - Inward Investment (incl. business and residential relocation)




How important is this type of custom to your business - Outdoor living and activities

e.g. beach, park, 'cafe culture', Active Ramsgate, playing fields etc




Do you feel you have been fully informed about the Developer's plans for the air cargo hub at Manston?



Do you feel fully informed about the potential impacts of the cargo hub on you and your business?




Have you been contacted by the air cargo hub developer, RiverOak Strategic Partners (RSP) about its plans?




Which of these cargo hub impacts do you think might affect you and your business? - Aircraft noise




Which of these cargo hub impacts do you think might affect you and your business? - Flight frequency




Which of these cargo hub impacts do you think might affect you and your business? - Impact on tourists

We have not had sufficient information even to begin to ascertain the impact. Can you help us with this? We have had no indication from either the Council or the parties to this application as to the impact on us.

I am extremely concerned that this will negatively impact upon my business. As my bed and breakfast is directly under the flightpath, my business would sustain significant losses over a short period of time. I would estimate that even as few as 1 or 2 flights per night would lose me revenue but if we end up with even more than that, I anticipate our business, that has been a bed and breakfast since the 60s (possibly even earlier), would close within months which would render us bankrupt. I currently turn over approximately £80,000 per year and I would expect that to reduce by at least 60%, probably more if we have regular night flights. If you can't sleep at a bed and breakfast, you are not going to return and if you are unhappy about your stay, you tell Trip Advisor, then any future customers will be immediately put off. My husband and I have invested over £600,000 in our business and I would expect after 13 years of ownership, to walk away in negative equity should a cargo hub be allowed at Manston.

We are Estate and Lettings Agents. Hard to quantify because we are also caught up in the realms of Brexit and have been to a lesser extent since two weeks before the 23rd June 2016. Previously, when the airport was a lot quieter than is anticipated if Manston reopens as a Cargo Hub, we could not hear as the planes went over our building, in fact, sometimes they were so low we had to duck, even though we were inside the building.





Who do you think will pay for any such mitigation that might be required?



The harbour surrounding area is hugely successful at the moment as a leisure area, enhanced by the renovated Royal Victoria Pavilion with it's open rooftop seating area. The planes will fly directly over this at less than 600feet - who is going to sit up there, with the noise and being showered with aviation fuel as the planes drop height as they are coming in to land?
