I write to you in connection to the above application & your e-mail sent to me advising me that a new deadline has now been set for this application to which I and others I am sure will be very disappointed to here.

However, could you please explain why PINs accepted a late submissions from 5-10-12 after the deadline that was set by yourselves.

As you yourselves set the Examination timetable and submissions were closed in July 2019.

I wanted to make further submissions as I suspect others did as well but was told the Examination was closed, so they were not sent.

It appears that some of what 5-10-12 questioned in connection with the CAA license could be arguable, but until all of the talks with the CAA and its consultations with the public have been conducted the answers will never be known, so does that mean that the Examiners will allow further submissions after every round of talks because if that is the case the timetable Examination could go on and on, which would not be an acceptable position for anybody.

I shall of course be mailing the Secretary of State and Susan Anderson Head of Transport Infrastructure Planning to register my displeasure at what I see as a flagrant breach of your own rules.
