Thank you for your e-mail and the following are my further comments.

With regard to No. 18 of the communication:-

(a) So far as I was aware, the Applicant, RiverOak Strategic Partners, had applied for permission to operate a "cargo hub" in which case why does the proposed wording quoted in your communication only mention "passenger" flights? What is the purpose of the times mentioned – on the face of it they are meaningless? If the airport is given consent to proceed it would appear that arrival and departures of "cargo" flights could go on at any time of the day and night with no restrictions whatsoever - and I assume future passenger flights at any time of the day and night outside the restricted times. It just does not make sense.

(b) It is a few years since all these proposals were put forward. In recent months the political and ecological climates have changed. Global warming is a fact and the government has said that we must now act on the warnings. How on earth can a "new" airport be allowed to operate in the face of these warnings. We are all being urged to cut down on air travel which is among the highest polluting forms of transport and switch to other more environmentally friendly If the government is serious about tackling this problem they wavs of travel. have the perfect opportunity to demonstrate that by refusing this application. As I have already mentioned in former submissions, the pollution will not stop at the aircraft arriving and leaving Manson but will have a knock on effect when the cargo is then decanted into lorries to be driven elsewhere. I believe the majority of those lorries will travel north of the Thames, needing to cross at the pinch point at Dartford. Anyone who travels that route knows what the hold ups and air pollution are already like on a daily basis. There are airports already up and running further to the north of Manston and which have spare capacity which should be utilised negating the need to have another airport in the southeast and more lorries on already packed roads.
