We have previously submitted comments about the possibility of Manston Airport re-opening as a cargo hub. We again are absolutely opposed to this. Apart from the fact that we live under the flight path which would cause us considerable noise and vibration, there is the important view to take of the regeneration of Ramsgate itself.

- It is now becoming a thriving seaside town with lots of exciting building projects, particularly the Ramsgate Sands site with over 100 properties - all of which would be under the flight path.

- There is the largest Wetherspoons in the country with a wonderful outside balcony overlooking the beach - again under the flightpath.

These properties would suffer significantly if the airport was allowed to open - as would the majority of properties in the town which are mostly in conservation areas with a high proportion of Victorian and Edwardian properties that cannot have double glazing, and in particular would suffer from intense vibration which cannot be resolved. Visitors would not come to the town to sit at Wetherspoons with low flying aircraft travelling over the top.

We totally support the Report which has decided that the airport is not needed in this area.
