Thank you for your response and happy new year!

We note the reference to the Planning Inspectorate's customer privacy notice and that it explicitly states that any "potentially libellous" content is required to be redacted.

We would also like to bring to your attention that in relation to planning applications, local authorities are advised, in the latest Planning and GDPR guidance (22 June 2021), to "not spend their time redacting or summarising this type of comment and should instead refuse to publish or even accept" inappropriate responses which are "defamatory, inappropriate or just rude". We consider that a similar approach of non-publication is suitable here as the NNF submission in its entirety is an inappropriate, personal attack and, at the very least, is "potentially libellous". Due to the extent of the required redaction, we do not consider a published, redacted version of the document to be meaningful to Interested Parties. As previously mentioned, if this submission were to be published as it stood, Dr Dixon would consider bringing legal proceedings against both the writer and publisher of the libellous content.

We appreciate your duty to transparency in the decision-making process and if the DfT considers it appropriate, the Applicant would be amenable to the DfT requiring NNF to re-submit their submission to remove the lengthy personal attack on one of the Applicant's consultants. Kind regards
