CAGNE request of the Planning Inspectorate concerning the Gatwick Airport development consent order application for a new runway to change the proposed hearings and agendas to –

- Expand hearing timing - the timing of the hearings is very narrow as such we ask that they be extended as Gatwick Airport has highly skilled teams working on this project 24/7 whereas residents/communities are endeavouring to keep pace and understand the process, we therefore request to ensure that we have a full opportunity to respond that more time between hearings be permitted.

- The visits to date by the inspectorates to the sites of impact/development are not far-reaching enough to allow inspectors to evaluate the full impact of this new runway application.

- We request specific hearings be held on -

- Policy – the application is not compliant with policy – Making best use of existing runways. Two runways can't be used concurrently today
