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#### 1 Introduction

#### 1.1 Introduction

- 1.1.1 This Statement of Commonality has been prepared in support of the examination phase for the proposed Gatwick Northern Runway Project (NRP). The Application was made by Gatwick Airport Limited (the Applicant) to the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 (PA 2008).
- 1.1.2 The Application comprises alterations to the existing northern runway which, together with the lifting of the current restrictions on its use, would enable dual runway operations. It also includes the development of a range of infrastructure and facilities which, with the alterations to the northern runway, would enable an increase in the airport's passenger throughput capacity. This includes substantial upgrade works to certain surface access routes which lead to the airport. A full description of the Proposed Development is included in **ES Chapter 5: Project Description** [AS-133].

#### 1.2 Purpose of Document

- 1.2.1 This document provides the Examining Authority ("ExA") with an overview of the position of each Statement of Common Ground ("SoCG") between the Applicant, local authorities and prescribed consultees, in relation to the Northern Runway Project at Deadline 1 (12/03/2024).
- 1.2.2 SoCGs are an established means in the planning process of allowing all parties to identify and focus on specific issues that may need to be considered during the Examination. The SoCGs provide a record of discussions to date and a summary of the matters that are either agreed, subject to ongoing discussion, or not agreed. The level of detail contained within each SoCG is contingent upon the nature, complexity, and positions of the parties involved.
- 1.2.3 This Statement of Commonality is provided at the request of the ExA in response to the Rule 6 letter dated 5 January 2024. The document offers a comprehensive overview of the structure and status of the SoCG between all relevant interested parties, including local authorities. Areas of commonality across the SoCGs are highlighted, demonstrating the specific matters with shared points of consensus.
- 1.2.4 The engagement between the SoCG parties across the breadth of matters is ongoing. As a result, the SoCGs and the Statement of Commonality are evolving documents and the detailed wording within remains subject to deliberation. Future iterations will be submitted at relevant deadlines; and parties reserve the



right to supplement the matters identified discussions progress, to ensure it is comprehensive and up to date.



#### 2 Statement of Common Ground Parties

- 2.1.1 The Applicant has entered into a number of SoCGs. These are iterative documents that will be updated throughout the course of the Examination with a view to submit final copies at or before Deadline 9.
- 2.1.2 The Interested Parties with which the Applicant has entered SoCGs with are listed in the Table 1.4.1.

- 2.2.2 This section will be updated at each deadline during the Examination to explain what has changed since the previous iteration of this document, and where new version of a SoCG has been submitted.
- 2.2.3 SoCGs have not been submitted with the CAA, Network Rail and the Joint Local Authorities (on Forecasting and Need, and Capacity and Operations matters) at Deadline 1. The Applicant is actively engaging with these parties and anticipates submitting SoCGs at Deadline 2.

### 3 Commonality

3.1.1 Table 3.1 lists out the topics covered across the SoCGs and the status of that matter to each party, with the position for each topic presented as follows. Within the matrix in the table, the colour coding represents (a) whether matters under the headings are broadly agreed, under discussion, or not agreed, or (b) whether the heading has not been a material matter in engagement. This is represented by the colour coding set as set out in Table 3.2.
