Overview of Global Airlines

Core Feedback:

- 1. Global Airlines shares the applicants' ambition to develop an additional Northern runway.
- 2. The airline is an on the record supporter of increasing airport capacity in the South-East and believes this to be an important pre-requisite for creating a more competitive marketplace that benefits passengers and meets future demand.
- 3. We support increased facilities at LGW to improve operators on-time performance, reduced delays and disruptions and increase overall customer satisfaction.
- 4. We recognise the additional runway would enhance much needed capacity and remove the risks associated with operating a single runway at such a busy, important and growing airport.
- 5. We support the move to make London and the South-East more accessible for tourism and trade.
- 6. We support the notion for growth in the Gatwick area bringing more jobs and resources.
- 7. Whilst we fully endorse the proposal for an additional runway at LGW, we also recognise the need to develop further infrastructure to support this increased capacity namely new departure gates capable of supporting A380 movements.
- 8. Global Airlines would like to base future operations from LGW and therefore additional runway capacity is essential, along with the infrastructure required to support such an operation.
