Compensation Site

The Panel would be grateful if you would -

- (a) confirm the date on which the further Report by Black & Veatch on the proposed compensation site at Cherry Cobb Sands is to be produced;
- (b) state what if any consultation arrangements are proposed either during or after the production of this Report
- (c) clarify the nature and extent of any legal agreements you consider necessary to deliver the proposed compensation, the parties that would be involved and the means of enforcement.

The Panel would be grateful to receive this information by 28 September.

Section 106 or other agreements

The Panel notes the statement in paragraph 15.2.3 of the Local Impact Report submitted by North Lincolnshire Council that -

Accordingly, under Section 106 of the Town & Country Planning Act 1990 the council will, by agreement with Able UK, provide the Examining Authority with an Agreement which will only become effective in the event of the DCO being granted, before the end of the Examination Period to secure the sum of £1.32m or other suitable figure to be agreed for the specified highway works.

The Panel would be grateful if you would -

(a) state what s.106 or other agreements with local authorities you consider necessary to deliver the proposed development;

(b) set out the progress of negotiations, and specify the date by which you intend to conclude these agreements.

Rail Safety

The Panel would be grateful if you would -

- (a) explain what safety case you consider necessary to meet jointly the requirements of both the International Safety and Port Security Code (ISPS) and Network Rail;
- (b) how and when this is to be agreed.

The Panel would be grateful to receive this information by 4 October.
