As notified in my letter of 21 September 2012, the Panel will hold Specific Issue Hearings on the Local Impact Reports and on Road Transport matters on 22 October at the Humber Royal Hotel, Grimsby.

Registration for the Local Impact Reports hearing will be open from 0930 with the hearing commencing at 1000.

Registration for the Road Transport hearing will be open from 1330 with the hearing commencing at 1400.

Parties intending to participate should be present from the start of the respective hearing.

The agenda for the Local Impact Reports hearing is at **Annex A**, and for the Road Transport hearing at **Annex B**.

After the Panel has asked its own questions there will be an opportunity for those parties who have notified the Panel of their wish to ask questions of other parties to do so.

Parties should assume that they or their expert witnesses will be allowed a maximum of fifteen minutes on any one topic for this purpose.

The Panel will be seeking written statements from participants after the hearings. In the case of the hearing on Local Impact Reports, the Panel will be asking the local authorities concerned whether they wish all or part of their statements to be treated as addenda to the Reports.

Annex B

Road Transport Issues

The Panel will base its examination on the various written submissions made so far – the applicant's original and supplementary submissions, submissions from local authorities, Associated British Ports and Royal Mail.

The Panel will ask each of these parties to summarise their current position in the light of all other evidence put forward, in not more than ten minutes.

The Panel will then ask questions of each party as appropriate.

The Panel will then allow the parties to ask questions of each other. Each party should expect to be kept to a maximum of fifteen minutes for questioning.
