Submissions prior to Hearings

- 1.1 In its Further Written Questions and Requests for Information of 8 May 2018, the Examining Authority requested Port of Tilbury London Ltd (PoTLL) to submit a number of documents one week prior to the hearings scheduled for 27 and 28 June 2018.

Changes		It is not yet in final form as discussions with landowners and stakeholders are continuing on the details of the proposals.
		As such Requirement 5 of the DCO has not yet been updated to refer to the EMCP.
		PoTLL will keep this position up to date as the EMCP is further developed and the Examination continues. However, I can confirm that PoTLL is considering drafting which refers to the EMCP as it will stand at the end of the Examination, but which also provides for it to be updated and approved once the detailed design is known, prior to construction beginning.
Statements of Common Ground Update Report		Statements of Common Ground have been updated since Deadline 4 to take into account on-going discussions with stakeholders.
		PoTLL would highlight that updated versions of the SoCG with the PLA, Historic England and the Environment Agency are not included in this submission. However, I can confirm that extensive discussions have been taking place with these parties and that all parties involved are endeavouring to reach a position that will enable revised SoCGs to be submitted before the hearings.
		The SoCG with Natural England is not submitted with this update. A draft has been provided to NE and PoTLL is submitting a substantially updated EMCP (PoTLL/T2/EX/113) at this deadline. It is hoped that this will allow significant progress in discussions with NE prior to the 28 June hearing.
Highways England Resume Paper	PoTLL/T2/EX/116	As indicated in its letter of 17 May 2018 (PoTLL/T2EX/87), PoTLL is aware of the Examining Authority's concerns in relation to Highways England's oral and written Examination submissions to date.
		PoTLL can confirm that on-going detailed discussions are being held with Highways England, but that three issues remain outstanding, i.e.
		 the potential need for mitigation at M25 J30, and Highways England's proposal for a traffic restriction; scope of works at Asda Roundabout; and

		Further meetings with Highways England have been organised for this week in the hope of reaching agreement on the Asda roundabout works, and to make progress on the DCO drafting, and PoTLL hopes to report progress with these matters at the hearing on 28 June, with the possibility that a joint statement between the parties may be able to be submitted prior to the 28 June hearing.
		In relation to J30, PoTLL has undertaken modelling work at Highways England's request to further demonstrate (as already set out in the Transport Assessment) that Tilbury2 traffic would not cause an impact to the junction.
		However as these matters are still outstanding, and to assist the Examining Authority in preparing for the June hearings, this paper is submitted to set out:
		 that sufficient time is available for discussions to reach a conclusion; the results of this modelling (which have been shared with Highways England) and an explanation as to why no works to M25 J30 have been shown by Highways England to be necessary; an explanation of why the proposed Asda roundabout works are appropriate, and how PoTLL's consideration of that junction has adequately taken account of the adjacent Amazon development an explanation of why Highways England's proposed Tilbury2 traffic restriction is not necessary and thus does not meet the tests for a DCO requirement; and PoTLL's position on DCO drafting.
