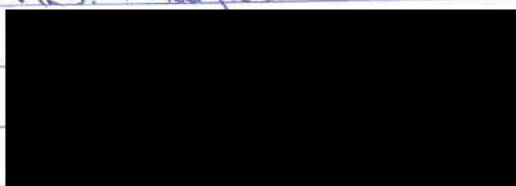

Information for Constituent:

Thank you for your recent letter in relation to the proposed Oikos Marine and South Side Development (OMSSD) project, which is currently in the Pre-Application stage and for which an application for development consent has not yet been submitted. An application is expected to be submitted to the Planning Inspectorate in Quarter 3, 2021.

As you may be aware, the Applicant (OMSSD) has recently carried out its statutory consultation period. It is understood, from the developer's website (<https://oikos.co.uk/omssd/>), that the deadline for consultation responses was 18 May 2021. However you can make general enquiries about this project with the developer or register for their project updates via the following contact details:

Please note that the Pre-Application consultation process is entirely led by the Applicant, who are responsible for ensuring that they comply with the legislative requirements surrounding consultation, which are set out in the Planning Act 2008. This includes a legal requirement for the developer to consult with Statutory Bodies such as the Health and Safety Executive (HSE). Your letter provides your comments on the merits of the Proposed Development, which the Applicant sought during its consultation. The Planning Inspectorate would advise you to make these comments directly to the Applicant if you have not already done so. If you are not satisfied that the Applicant is taking them into account you should raise this with the Local Authority also.

Information about the Planning Inspectorate's remit once the Application is submitted

If the Application has been accepted for Examination, you will be able to register as an Interested Party and make Relevant Representations for the Examining Authority to consider. Please read the Planning Inspectorate's advice note on How to Register to participate in an Examination (<https://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/wp-content/uploads/2013/04/Advice-note-8-2v3.pdf>) for further information.

The Examining Authority will make an initial assessment of the issues arising from the submitted application as well as from the Relevant Representations, which will inform their Examination of the proposed development.

In order to assist parties in understanding the Planning Act 2008 process, the Planning Inspectorate has prepared a suite of Advice Notes (<https://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/legislation-and-advice/advice-notes/>), which are available on our website (<https://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/>).
