

Application by Able Humber Ports Ltd for a Material Change to the Able Marine Energy Park Development Consent Order 2014

Examining Body's Record of Unaccompanied Inspection of Sites to Which the Application or Specified Matters Relates

Examining Inspector, Alan Novitzky (the person appointed as the Examining Body for the application for a Material Change to the Able Marine Energy Park Development Consent Order 2014), undertook the inspections on 15 & 16 November 2021.

Monday 15 November 2021 - 11:30 to 13:30

Weather – clear, bright sun, good visibility.

Walk from Haven Road, crossing the railway track, calling in at the North Killingholme Haven bird hide, then south along sea wall public footpath to the South Killingholme lighthouses. Return following the same route.

Tuesday 16 November 2021 - 13:00 to 14:30

Weather – overcast, poor visibility

Drive northwards across the Humber Bridge then eastwards, stopping at Church of St Andrew, Paull. On to Keyingham, stopping occasionally to seek views south across the estuary towards the site but this was very difficult because of the weather conditions.

As part of the ASI, a guided tour of principal viewpoints, including a visit to Cherry Cobb Sands would be helpful.
