I write on behalf of my client, Associated British Ports, (ABP), in relation to the above proposal by Able Humber Ports Ltd for a material change to the AMEP DCO 2014. I would be grateful if this letter could be placed before the Examining Body.

As Mr Novitzky is aware ABP, represented by Mr Thomas Jeynes, is participating in the Examination in its capacity as Statutory Harbour Authority (ABMC2-R19011).

As I explained to the Examining Body at the Preliminary Hearing held on 16 November 2021, this firm is separately instructed by ABP in its capacity as owner and operator of the Humber Ports of Immingham, Grimsby, Hull and Goole - effectively the commercial part of ABP.

My client is extremely grateful for confirmation (by email dated 17 November 2021) that ABP, as the owner and occupier of the above Ports may participate as an Interested Party in the NSIP examination process. That said, however, as I did explain at the Preliminary Hearing – and undertook to confirm in writing - whilst our client as the owner and operator of a number adjacent ports is naturally interested in the current proceedings, it has not submitted relevant representations and for the record, it neither objects to nor does it support the application now before the Examining Body.
