## **Purpose of Hearings**

### Registration and requests to participate in Hearings

You must register by **Deadline 6, Monday 13 November 2023** if you intend to participate in the Hearings and provide all the information requested.

- The 'Submission item' will be DEADLINE 6 (Monday 13 November 2023).
- Please name your request appropriately e.g. 'Register to attend hearing'.

Any request to participate in a Hearing should include the following information:

- Name and unique reference number (found at the top of any letter or email from the Planning Inspectorate);
- email address (if available) and contact telephone number;
- name and unique reference number of any person/organisation that you are representing (if applicable);
- for blended events, confirmation of whether you will participate virtually or inperson;
- confirmation of the Hearing(s) you wish to participate in, the agenda item(s) on which you wish to speak and/or brief details of the topic(s) that you would like to raise: and
- the Examination Library reference number (with paragraph/page number where appropriate) of any documents you wish to refer to.

Joining instructions for Hearings will be issued by the Case Team via email shortly before the Hearing dates.



## Please contact the Case Team if you require any support or assistance to attend any Hearing, either virtually or in person.

If you simply wish to observe any of the Hearings then you can either:

- **1.** Watch a livestream of the event a link to the livestream will be made available on the project webpage shortly before the event is scheduled to begin; and/or
- **2.** Watch the recording of the event which will be published on the project webpage shortly after the event has finished.

Alternatively, you can attend the physical event at the venue to observe the proceedings; however, to ensure there is adequate seating capacity at the venue we request that you register your attendance to observe only by **Deadline 6, Monday 13 November 2023**. Please note that it may not be possible to participate on the day if you have not registered your wish to speak by **Monday 13 November 2023**.

## **Hearing Agendas**

The Agendas and any detailed arrangements for the Hearings will be published on the <u>project webpage</u> at least five working days before the Hearings. However, the actual Agenda on the day of each Hearing may be subject to change at the ExA's discretion. There may not be an Agenda for an Open Floor Hearing.

## **Procedure at Hearings and Post Hearing submissions**

The procedure to be followed at Hearings is set out in The Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010.

Participation in a Hearing will be subject to the ExA's powers of control. It is for the ExA to determine how the Hearing will be conducted, including the time allowed at the Hearing for the making of a person's representations. The Hearing will be managed in the interests of ensuring fair access to the Hearing for all parties, and to ensure that the submissions of all invited persons are fully heard within the allotted time. For Issue Specific Hearings Interested Parties (IPs) may be invited to make oral representations at the Hearing on the specific issues being examined at the Hearing as set out in the Agenda.



All Hearings are recorded. The recordings and transcripts will be made available on the <u>project webpage</u> as soon as practicable following the Hearing. The recordings allow any member of the public who is interested in the application and the Examination to find out what has been discussed at a Hearing. It is therefore important to note that anyone speaking at the Hearing will need to introduce themselves, including any organisation or groups that they represent, **each time they speak** to ensure that someone listening to the recording after the Hearing is clear who was speaking.

As the recordings are retained and published, they form a public record that can contain personal information to which the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) applies. Please refer to our <a href="Privacy Notice">Privacy Notice</a> for further information. Participants must do their best to avoid making public any information which they would otherwise wish to be kept private and confidential. If there is a need to refer to such information, it should be in written form. Although this will also be published, personal and private content can be redacted or removed before it is made publicly available. Any person who is unclear on this point should ask the Case Team for guidance before they place personal and private information into the public domain. The Planning Inspectorate's practice is to publish the recordings and transcripts and retain them for a period of five years from the Secretary of State's decision on the Development Consent Order (DCO). If you actively participate in the Hearing, it is important that you understand that you will be recorded and that the recording and transcript will be made available in the public domain.

The evidence presented orally at Hearings should be included in post Hearing submissions and submitted at the relevant deadline in the Examination timetable.

# Notice by Applicant of its intention to submit a request to make changes to the Application

The Applicant submitted a letter on 19 October 2023 notifying the ExA of its intention to submit a request to make changes to the application. That 'change notification' identifies the Applicant's intention to submit a request to make four changes to the originally submitted application, namely:

- 1) Realignment of the approach jetty and related works (Change 1);
- 2) Realignment of the internal bridge and consequential works (Change 2);
- 3) Rearrangement of UK Border Force facilities (Change 3); and
- 4) Enhanced management controls and options for the potential provision of additional impact protection measures (Change 4).

The submission of the previously mentioned letter satisfies Step 1 of the recommended procedure in the Planning Inspectorate's 'Advice Note 16: How to request a change that might be material' (AN16). Accordingly, the ExA has made the procedural decision to accept the change notification documents as Additional Submissions and those documents have been added to the Examination Library and allocated document numbers AS-026 to AS-035.



As set out in the letter of 19 October 2023, the Applicant considers that Changes 1 to 4 inclusive would not "... either alone or in-combination fundamentally change nor materially affect the nature or substance of the Proposed Development as originally submitted". Based on the Applicant's initial assessment and the summary information it has provided, most particularly that included in "The Proposed Changes Notification Report" and its Appendix 1, the ExA is minded to agree that the making of Changes 1 to 4 would be unlikely to result in a materially different project.

The ExA notes that the Applicant commenced a non-statutory "comprehensive consultation" exercise on 17 October expiring at 23:59 on Sunday 19 November. Any representations that the Applicant receives in connection with that consultation exercise should be taken account of prior to the submission of any formal request to make any changes to the submitted application.

It appears that the Infrastructure Planning (Compulsory Acquisition) Regulations 2010 will not apply to the changes identified in the Applicant's change notification. Nevertheless, the Applicant is reminded that should it be minded to submit a formal request to make changes to its submitted application that should be done with sufficient time left within the Examination period (expiring on 25 January 2024) and with adequate information to enable any changes to be examined by the ExA in an open, impartial and fair manner. In that regard the Applicant should ensure that it complies, as necessary, with the provisions of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 and the Conservation of Habitats and Species (Amendment) (EU Exit) Regulations 2019).
