Statement of Commonality for the matters included in the SoCGs

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1. Introduction

- 1.1 This Statement of Commonality for the matters included in the Statements of Common Ground (this "Statement of Commonality") has been provided in connection with an application that has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport by Associated British Ports ("ABP") under the provisions of section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 ("PA 2008") for a Development Consent Order.
- 1.2 ABP is seeking development consent for the construction and operation of the Immingham Eastern Ro-Ro Terminal Development ("IERRT"). This will comprise a new three berth Ro-Ro facility, with hinterland cargo storage, at the Port of Immingham, which is owned and operated by ABP.
- 1.3 This Statement of Commonality has been prepared in accordance with the Examining Authority's ("the ExA") Procedural Decision made under Rule 8 of the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 dated 2 August 2023 [PD-009], which requires ABP as the Applicant to submit an updated Statement of Commonality for the matters included in the Statements of Common Ground from the Applicant at Deadline 7 (Monday 11 November 2023).

2. Purpose of the Statement of Commonality

- 2.1 The purpose of the Statements of Common Ground ("SoCGs") is to identify and summarise any agreement, disagreement or matters outstanding between the Applicant and the various Parties prescribed by the ExA in its Procedural Decision dated 26 May 2023 [PD-009], so as to assist the ExA in its consideration of the Application.
- 2.2 Where possible, the Applicant has submitted final agreed versions of the SoCGs at Deadlines 5 and 6. Where this has not been possible, the Applicant has submitted draft SoCGs, and recorded the latest position with the relevant Interest Party in the Statement of Common Ground Tracker submitted at Deadline 7.
- 2.3 The purpose of this Statement of Commonality is to provide the ExA with the positions reached between the Applicant and relevant Interested Party as recorded within the SoCGs.

3. Structure of the Statement of Commonality

- 3.1 Section 1 of this Statement of Commonality is designed to act as a general introduction to the IERRT project and to the parties concerned.
- 3.2 Section 2 of this Statement of Commonality summarises the purpose of the SoCGs and this Statement of Commonality.
- 3.3 This Section 3 of this Statement of Commonality describes the structure of this document.
- 3.4 Section 4 of this Statement of Commonality lists the SoCGs which were prescribed in the ExA's Procedural Decision dated 26 May 2023 [PD-005] and which have subsequently been prepared. Section 4 also summarises the position of each SoCG as at Deadline 7.
- 3.5 Section 5 of this Statement of Commonality provides a summary of the principal issues covered in the SoCGs and demonstrates where there is commonality in the topics or matters.

4. Statements of Common Ground with Latest Position

- 4.1 The ExA's Procedural Decision dated 26 May 2023 [PD-005] required that ABP and the Interested Parties listed in that letter should prepare SoCGs which, as a minimum, included the topics identified.
- 4.2 A list of the Interested Parties which the 26 May 2023 Procedural Decision identified is included in Table 1, along with a summary of the position of each SoCG as at Deadline 7.
- 4.3 During the Course of the Examination, the ExA requested that two further SoCGs be prepared. The first of these is a Terrestrial Traffic and Transport SoCG between ABP, CLdN Ports (Killingholme) Limited and DFDS Seaways Plc, and the second is a Dwell Times SoCG between ABP, Stena Line, CLdN Ports (Killingholme) Limited and DFDS Seaways Plc. These additional SoCGs have also been included in this Statement of Commonality.
