

As you may have seen in our earlier correspondence, Associated British Ports ("ABP") intend to submit an application for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") to authorise the construction and operation of a new multi-user green energy terminal to be located on the eastern side of the Port of Immingham (the "Project"). The Project includes a green hydrogen production facility to be constructed and operated by Air Products.

Statutory Consultation on the Project was undertaken from 9 January to 20 February 2023 (the "first Statutory Consultation"). Pursuant to the first Statutory Consultation, properties in the area were consulted on the Project as members of the local community under Section 47 of the Planning Act 2008 ("the 2008 Act"). ABP has since been progressing the design work on the Project and refining the proposals taking into account the responses received to the first Statutory Consultation. As a result of that further design work, ABP is carrying out a second Statutory Consultation on the proposed changes to the Project, which are summarised in the enclosed brochure.

The proposed changes include some refinement to the proposed red line boundary for the Project. These changes include the incorporation of four sections of Kings Road and adjoining land within the proposed redline boundary for the Project (as shown on Plan enclosed) to undertake temporary construction works on Kings Road (temporary removal and replacement of street furniture and adjustment of overhead cables) in order to accommodate wide loads to transport parts of the Development to the site. Any works undertaken to facilitate these deliveries would be carried out in a way that aims to minimise service disruptions. As you own, occupy or have a legal interest in land that could be affected by the Project, we are now consulting with you as a statutory consultee on the Project under Section 42(1)(d) of the 2008 Act.

We invite you to comment on the Project and the changes to our proposals for the Project ahead of the submission of our proposed application for a DCO to the Secretary of State for Transport (the "Secretary").

#### Statutory Consultation and your role as a Statutory Consultee

Prior to submitting the DCO Application, ABP is required to undertake a comprehensive consultation exercise with a variety of persons and bodies as required under the 2008 Act before submitting the DCO Application ("Statutory Consultation"). In January and February 2023, ABP carried out a first Statutory Consultation to meet this requirement.

This letter is notice of ABP commencing a second Statutory Consultation process to consult specifically on changes to the proposals since the first Statutory Consultation earlier this year. This Statutory Consultation will run from **Wednesday 24 May 2023 until 23:59 on Friday 30 June 2023**. During this period, you will have the opportunity to speak to the Project team, view the changes to the proposed Project designs and submit your questions and comments ahead of the submission of the DCO Application.

After the second Statutory Consultation period is completed, we will consider the feedback in finalising the proposals for the Project. The DCO Application will then be made to the Secretary of State via the Planning Inspectorate who will appoint an Examining Authority to examine the DCO Application on behalf of the Secretary of State. After examination, the Examining Authority will report its recommendation on the DCO Application to the Secretary of State, who will make the final decision on whether or not to make a DCO authorising the Project. We intend to submit the DCO Application to the Secretary of State via the Planning Inspectorate in Summer 2023.

During the second Statutory Consultation we must consult with a variety of persons and organisations about the DCO Application in accordance with Sections 42(1)(d) and 44 of the 2008 Act. Those persons include those who have an interest in the land or are otherwise affected by the Project, as set out in the 2008 Act. As explained above, we are writing to you as a statutory consultee for the Project because you own, occupy or have a legal interest in land that we believe could be affected by the Project.

#### **Environmental Impact Assessment Development**

The Project is an Environmental Impact Assessment development ("EIA development"), as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. As such, ABP will be submitting an Environmental Statement as part of the DCO Application for the Project.

As part of this second Statutory Consultation, ABP has prepared an addendum to the Preliminary Environmental Information Report ("PEIR"), which was originally published in January 2023 for the first Statutory Consultation. The PEIR addendum sets out the proposed changes to the Project which have been identified following further design development and feedback from the first Statutory Consultation and considers the likely significant environmental effects of those changes to the Project and identifies any





amendments to the conclusions on significant effects reached in the PEIR for the first Statutory Consultation.

ABP has also prepared an updated Statement of Community Consultation, which outlines the approach to this second Statutory Consultation and any subsequent consultation on the Project. From 9 January to 20 February 2023, ABP carried out a first Statutory Consultation with the local community on the Project, which adhered to a Statement of Community Consultation ("SoCC") published at the time (the "First Statutory Consultation"). Since the First Statutory Consultation, ABP has been progressing the design work on the Project and refining the proposals taking into account the responses received to the First Statutory Consultation. As a result of further design work ABP has identified some changes to the proposals which they wish to consult on in a second round of Statutory Consultation (the "Second Statutory Consultation").

The purpose of this notice is to draw the attention of those with a legal interest in the land shown edged [blue] on the plan attached to this notice that ABP have commenced the second Statutory Consultation process required under the Planning Act 2008 (the "2008 Act") before submitting the DCO Application for the Project. This second Statutory Consultation will run from **Wednesday 24 May 2023 until 23:59 on Friday 30 June 2023**. During this period, you will have the opportunity to speak to the Project team, view the proposed Project designs and submit your questions and comments ahead of submission of the DCO Application.





ABP is taking forward proposals to develop the IGET and will be submitting an application for a development consent order.





### The planning process

The size and scale of our proposal for a new terminal means that IGET is defined as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project, or 'NSIP'. NSIPs can include projects like building electricity lines, wind farms, transport infrastructure, or pipelines.

To get consent for an NSIP, we need to make an application for a Development Consent Order, or 'DCO'. The application would be determined, and if granted, would include all the main consents required, comprising planning and other powers to deliver the project, including rights to enter and acquire land and rights to undertake works to public highways. The DCO for this project would be determined by the Secretary of State for Transport, but before a decision is made, we must complete the process shown below.

### Changes to the proposals

### Since the first Statutory Consultation, we have reviewed feedback and continued developing the proposed designs.

As a result of this work, we have refined our proposals and made several modifications to the project. Although these are changes that we feel we need to share with you for feedback, the original objectives of the project and key benefits it would deliver if successful have not changed since the first Statutory Consultation.

This consultation focuses on the following eight changes for the proposed site:

- Amendments to the proposed site boundary
- Marine design changes including jetty alignment and length; berth arrangement and associated requirements
- Routing of the pipe-rack and Jetty Access Road in the Long Strip woodland
- West Site illustrative layout, elevation and drainage
- Construction vehicle numbers increasing to deliver additional fill materials for the West Site
- Permanent adjustment to speed limits on Laporte Road
- Public Rights of Way diversion (Public Bridleway 36) and removal of informal access in two areas
- Temporary removal of Kings Road street furniture and overhead line works.

### Changes to the proposed site boundary


The site boundary has changed in response to the design evolution of the project. The map below shows where the six most notable changes have been made and provides a key noting what each change entails.

The area of land south of Queens Road was removed from the site boundary as design development has meant it is no longer required for the proposed pipeline corridor linking the West and East Sites. Changes A, and changes C-F are explained in further detail below.






In the first Statutory Consultation, we presented a design that included up to two berths in order to accommodate a wide range of vessel sizes. However, further design work has been undertaken to refine the design of the jetty and a single berth design has been confirmed as being able to accommodate the full range of vessels expected.

Alongside this, we have looked at several options for where to position the jetty in relation to existing infrastructure and the navigation channel in the Humber. A new illustrative design has been developed to show where this could be (above). However, as before we continue to seek development consent for a jetty to be built within the site boundary area. As such this does not create a formal change to the works we are seeking approval for.

## Pipe rack and Jetty Access Road in Long Strip

At the first Statutory Consultation, the PEIR reported that the woodland area known as Long Strip would be impacted as a result of the proposed pipe rack and Jetty Access Road.

However, with further assessments we have been able to re-design the route for these components and reduce the impact on the woodland and retain the most important tree within the Tree Preservation Order in the area. This updated design reduces the impact of the proposals on the Long Strip woodland as far as possible.


### لم West Site layout

An illustrative layout of the West Site was provided during the first Statutory Consultation. Since then, further work has been undertaken to add more detail to the layout and better reflect operational requirements of green hydrogen production and distribution. The layout remains illustrative, but the key changes are as follows:

- Location of Hydrogen Production Units and Hydrogen Liquefier Units
- Location of the control building
- Hydrogen compressors have been added
- Temporary maintenance contractor officers, and temporary vehicle maintenance areas have been added
- Order of when different components of the site will be built


The finished ground level on the site will also be raised slightly to improve drainage for the site.

### Construction vehicle numbers



With the change in elevation to the West Site, the project will now need more fill material delivered throughout construction. This has resulted in an increase to the estimated HGV movements around the site throughout construction, however this is not expected to have a significant effect.


## Permanent adjustment to speed limits



The diagram above shows in detail where the proposed speed limit change would begin and end

At the moment the speed limit on Laporte Road varies between 40mph and the national speed limit. To ensure the safety of road users throughout both construction and operation of the site, we have proposed a permanent adjustment to the speed limit, reducing it to 30mph on Laporte Road as shown in the image above.

As explained at the first Statutory Consultation, part of the Public Bridleway Number 36 would need to be either closed or diverted. Based on consultation feedback, we have decided to propose diverting the Bridleway temporarily around the main construction area during the construction period.

Additionally, we are proposing to put appropriate fencing and signage around construction areas to ensure public safety. There are two areas of ABP land around the construction site which currently have some low level recreational use, though are not formal Public Rights of Way.

We are proposing the following changes to these:

- Sea Wall between Immingham Oil Terminal and where Bridleway 36 meets the wall: it is understood that this area is sometimes accessed and used for sea angling. To ensure public safety and facilitate construction and operation of the jetty, access along the seawall will need to be closed.
- Southern part of Long Strip woodland: it is understood that some access occurs through this woodland to Laporte Road and Bridleway 36 to the coast. Access to this will need to be temporarily removed during Phase One of the construction process to limit access to the construction area.

This image shows areas where overhead line works may be needed to facilitate delivery of construction materials

We anticipate that this project will use modular methods of construction to reduce on-site works where possible. As a result, some oversize loads will need to be delivered to the construction site.

To facilitate these deliveries, we propose to temporarily remove street furniture and overhead cables in four areas along Kings Road. These areas have been included in the red line boundary.

Any works to facilitate these deliveries would be carried out in a way that minimises any service disruptions or impacts to residents. If you are a resident in this area, please speak

Associated British Ports (ABP) is seeking to construct, operate and maintain the Immingham Green Energy Terminal (IGET) – a new multi-user liquid bulk green energy terminal located on the eastern side of the Port of Immingham. Air Products would be the first customer to use the new facility for the production of green hydrogen.

The development proposals will constitute a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) as per the Planning Act 2008, and therefore require an application for a Development Consent Order to be made to the Secretary of State for Transport.

### Second Statutory Consultation: 24 May to 20 July 2023

Between Monday 9 January 2023 and Monday 20 February 2023, ABP undertook a first Statutory Consultation on the proposals. Since then, several changes have been made to the proposals for the project as a result of the development of the design of the project and how it will be constructed, and also to respond to relevant feedback from the first Statutory Consultation.

### **Second Statutory Consultation - Our Proposals**

Since consulting on the project between 9 January and 20 February this year, ABP has made a number of changes to the proposals.

### The new facility at the Port would comprise:

### On the marine side (the NSIP):

- A jetty, consisting of an approach trestle, approximately 1.2km in length, leading to a single berth, including loading platforms and berthing and mooring dolphins with link walkways; and
- Topside infrastructure on the jetty for the handling of bulk liquids, including loading arms and pipelines.

### On the land side:

- · A jetty access road and related infrastructure;
- Two operational sites supporting hydrogen production facilities (an East Site and a West Site);
- Pipework, pipelines and utilities (i) between the jetty and the green hydrogen production facility on the East Site and (ii) between the two green hydrogen production facility sites and (iii) between buildings and plant within the production operation facilities:
- · Refrigerated ammonia storage tank (on the East Site);
- Hydrogen production units that convert ammonia to produce the green hydrogen (on both East and West Sites);
- Hydrogen liquefiers to liquify the hydrogen for temporary storage on the West Site;
- Loading bays to fill road tankers with liquified hydrogen which would then be distributed to hydrogen filling stations throughout the UK (on the West Site)
- A hydrogen refuelling station and bulk hydrogen trailer filling station:
- Ancillary buildings and works;
- Access from the public highway to the two hydrogen production sites;
- Temporary construction areas; and
- Various works (connections, diversions, protective works) to utilities including works on highways land.

### **Changes to the project**



Following our engagement so far, the IGET team has made several changes to the proposals. These are a result of both responding to feedback, and design evolution as we move towards submitting the DCO application.

To ensure local stakeholders and the community have the opportunity to understand and comment on these changes prior to submission, we are running a second Statutory Consultation from **Wednesday 24 May to Thursday 20 July 2023**, focusing on the following changes:

- Amendments to the proposed site boundary;
- Marine design changes including jetty alignment and length; berth arrangement and associated requirements;
- Routing of the pipe-rack and Jetty Access Road in the Long Strip woodland;
- West Site illustrative layout, elevation and drainage;
- Construction vehicle numbers increasing to deliver additional fill materials for the West Site;
- Permanent adjustment to speed limits on Laporte Road;
- Temporary removal of Kings Road street furniture and overhead line works.
