At the Hearing we are looking for clarity on the Applicant's strategic approach on the matters listed in the agenda, and parties' views on that approach. We expect the representations at the Hearing to set the scene for the more detailed responses to the ExA's First Written Questions (WQ1) [PD-006].

The ExA will not accept representations at the Hearing in the form of video or audio recordings.

The virtual event will be open 30 minutes prior to the start of the Hearing to enable a prompt start. Hearings will finish as soon as the ExA deems that all those present have had their say and that all matters have been covered.

The agenda is for guidance only. It is not designed to be exclusive or exhaustive. The ExA may add other issues for consideration, may alter the order in which issues are considered and will seek to allocate sufficient time to each issue to allow proper consideration of them. Any lack of discussion of a particular issue at a hearing does not preclude further examination of this issue, including the asking of further written questions.

2. Procedure for running the ISH1

3. Overview and Operation of the Proposed Development

The ExA requests the Applicant to deliver a presentation using visual aids, such as a slide deck, that provides an overview of the Proposed Development. The presentation should cover the individual components of the Proposed Development and how they would operate. It should also include a flow process from the beginning of the supply chain (ammonia processing in the Middle East) to the end of the supply chain (despatch of Hydrogen to end users), explaining the green credentials at each stage.

As an example, the structure of the presentation might include, but should not necessarily be limited to, the following:

- Reliable information and market data to demonstrate the need for the Proposed Development, including the demand for additional liquid bulk port capacity, both generally and specifically for low carbon energy products, with reference to relevant policy positions in the National Policy Statement for Ports (NPSfP);
- ii. Components of the Proposed Development that comprise the Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP), including reference to the relevant criteria under Section (s)24 of the Planning Act 2008 (PA2008);
- iii. Comparisons with other liquid bulk port developments within the UK, to help contextualise the nature and scale of the Proposed Development;
- iv. Components of the Proposed Development that comprise the Associated Development, including why each component is necessary to deliver the principal development (the NSIP);
- Step by step description of the operation of the Proposed Development (NSIP and Associated Development) during operations, including the flow process of the supply chain;
- vi. Forecast of other users and jetty related activity that are expected to be accommodated to fully use the port capacity; and
- vii. The construction programme, including the intended approach to the phasing of construction, commencement of operation and decommissioning and any influence market forces might have on timescales.
