WRITTEN REPRESENTATION IN RELATION TO THE PROPOSED IMMINGHAM GREEN ENERGY TERMINAL DEVELOPMENT CONSENT ORDER

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This Written Representation is submitted on behalf of CLdN Ports Killingholme Limited (Company Registration Number 00278815) of 130 Shaftesbury Avenue, 2nd Floor, London, W1D 5EU (**CLdN**). This submission is further to CLdN's Relevant Representation [**RR-005**] (**CLdN's RR**) which provides full details of CLdN's background and its interest in the development consent order (**DCO**) application for the Immingham Green Energy Terminal (the **Proposed Development**).

2. SUMMARY OF CLDN'S POSITION

- 2.1 CLdN wishes to reiterate the points made in CLdN's RR and in CLdN's Written Summary of Oral Submissions and Post Hearing Notes for Issue Specific Hearing 3 (**ISH3**) (the latter being a document that has been submitted into the examination at Deadline 1), all of which still stand.
- 2.2 Most specifically, whilst CLdN does not have an in principle objection to the Proposed Development, it is seeking to ensure the continued effective and efficient operation of its harbour facility and the scheduled Ro-Ro shipping lines that it serves. As a statutory undertaker, CLdN should benefit from appropriate protection for its harbour undertaking on the face of the DCO. This would be most appropriately achieved through protective provisions between CLdN and the Applicant.
- 2.3 CLdN has begun engaging with the Applicant on the form of protective provisions and, as agreed during ISH3, CLdN will provide a first draft of these to the Applicant's legal representatives imminently after Deadline 1.
- 2.4 Subject to the agreement of protective provisions for CLdN's benefit being included in the DCO, CLdN will be in a position to withdraw its objection to the Proposed Development. Until agreement is reached, CLdN will maintain its interest in the examination and reserves its position with regard to any matters arising from submissions during examination.
