Proposal

IMMINGHAM GREEN ENERGY TERMINAL. A multi-user liquid bulk terminal which would be located on the eastern side of the Port of Immingham ("the Port"), as well as associated development (collectively termed "the Project"). The associated development would comprise the construction and operation of a green hydrogen facility and landside works for the production of green hydrogen from imported green ammonia on site.

Representation

We have had constructive pre-application engagement. Necessary further assessment to inform avoidance / mitigation of impacts upon potentially sensitive peat deposits and similar (which may span the current shore line) and interaction with unknown wrecks etc in the marine environment, should be secured under staged DCO requirements such that the results of investigations (carried out to approved methods including; reporting, archive and dissemination) inform subsequent phases of work whose methods and outputs are likewise subject to approval.
