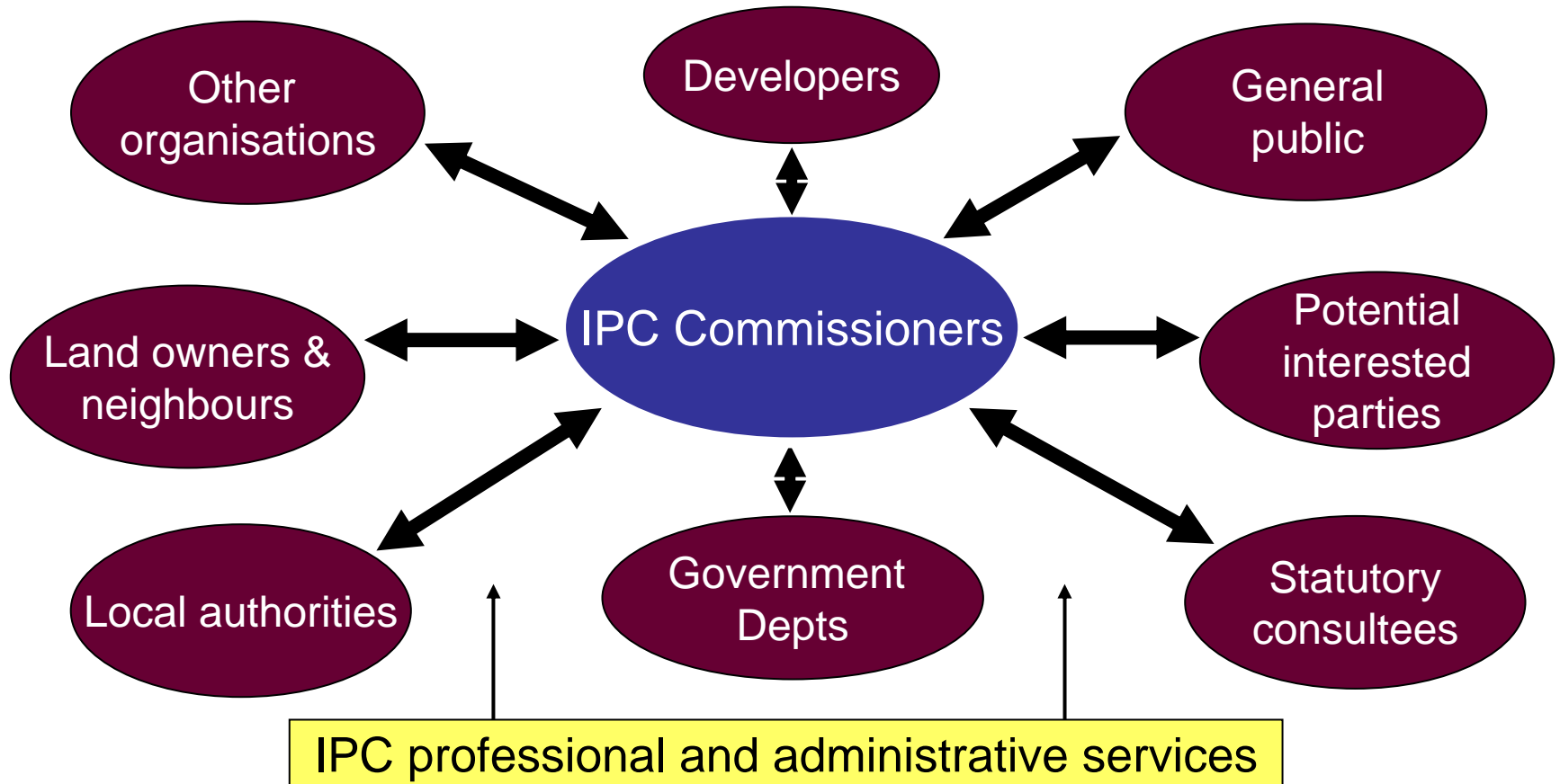
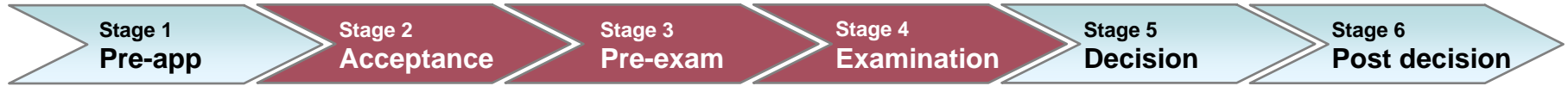


The North Doncaster Rail Chord proposal is at the pre-examination stage of the process.
