This is the second Issue Specific Hearing to be held in this Examination. It is being held because the Examining Authority (ExA) wishes to question the Applicant and hear from Interested Parties about environmental matters arising from the documentation submitted with the application documents, together with any updates and responses at the preceding submission Deadlines.

The event will also be livestreamed and a link for watching the livestream will be posted on the project page of the National Infrastructure website closer to the event date.

Interested Parties may be invited to make oral representations at the Hearing (subject to the ExA's power to control the Hearing). The ExA may ask questions about written representations or ask the Applicant or other parties to comment or respond. Questioning at the Hearing will therefore be led by a member of the Panel, supported by other Panel members.

However, should consideration of these issues take less time than anticipated, in order to make an efficient use of time the ExA may choose to start consideration of some of the items that are on the agenda for day 2. **Consequently, can participants therefore please make sure that they are available for both days.** Equally, if there are additional matters to be dealt with or there are submissions that take a considerable amount of time, there may be a need to continue for longer on the day or to continue discussions on day 2. Alternatively, it may be necessary to prioritise matters and defer others to further written questions.

#### Agenda

The main purpose of the second Issue Specific Hearing is to undertake an examination of various environmental matters. In particular to examine:

- Design of the railway stations, Trinity footbridge and other associated development and their visual effects on landscape, the urban environment and living conditions of nearby occupiers.
- Operational effects on transport, highways and public rights of way.
- The proposed construction practices and the effects that they would have on land use, traffic and transportation and communities.
