This is the third Issue Specific Hearing to be held in this Examination. It is being held because the Examining Authority (ExA) wishes to question the Applicant and hear from Interested Parties about environmental matters arising from the documentation submitted with the application documents, together with any updates and responses at the preceding submission Deadlines.

All Interested Parties are invited to attend the Issue Specific Hearing, but as this is a virtual event you need to let the Inspectorate's Case Team

The event will also be livestreamed and a link for watching the livestream will be posted on the project page of the National Infrastructure website closer to the event date.

Interested Parties may be invited to make oral representations at the Hearing (subject to the ExA's power to control the Hearing). The ExA may ask questions about written representations or ask the Applicant or other parties to comment or respond. Questioning at the Hearing will be led by the ExA.

However, should consideration of the issues scheduled for day 1 take less time than anticipated then the ExA may choose to start consideration of some of the items that are on this agenda. **Consequently, can participants therefore please make themselves available for both days.** Should the consideration of these issues take less time than anticipated, the ExA may conclude the Hearing as soon as all relevant contributions have been made and all questions asked and responded to.

If there are additional matters to be dealt with or there are submissions that take a considerable amount of time, there may be a need to continue the session for longer on the day. Alternatively, it may be necessary to prioritise matters and defer others to further written questions.

In order to ensure timely publication of the agenda, this has been drafted before the receipt of submissions for Deadline 3. As a consequence, the ExA may need to adjust the agenda at the meeting to allow for responses received at this deadline.

The main purpose of the third Issue Specific Hearing is to undertake an examination of various environmental matters. In particular to examine:

- The Habitats Regulations Assessment, biodiversity and protected species, and the natural environment in general, including proposed mitigation of any likely significant effects.
- Potential pollution from noise, vibration, light, air quality and emissions.
- Flood risk and drainage issues including consideration of climate change allowances and contamination of the water environment.

General planning policy matters will also be examined.

- Applicant and Environment Agency (EA) to provide an update on progress with regards to the updates and additional information requested in the EAs Deadline 2 response [REP2-040].
- Applicant and EA to provide an update on the extent of progress towards a statement of common ground.
- Discussion with EA as to why flood mitigation proposed as work No 16D would no longer be required.
- Discussion with EA and Applicant regarding the implications for flooding and drainage as a result of climate change and what measures are proposed to ensure that the scheme is as resilient as possible.
- Potential for contamination of the water environment, likely significant effects on the Severn Estuary and necessity for a verification plan.

- Consideration of whether the proposal would comply with the National Policy Statement for National Networks.
- Consideration of whether the proposal would be inappropriate development in the Green Belt and if it is whether a case of Very Special Circumstances exists.
 Consideration of the issue of safeguarded land and the weight that can be given to the loss of this land.
- Update on emerging policy including Neighbourhood Plans.
