#### Good Afternoon

Please find below Northampton Borough Council's response in respect of Action Point 3 for ISH4 relating to commuting patterns.

The NOMIS analysis of travel to work flows from the 2011 Census is helpful in this regard:

It shows a significant net inflow for Northampton of 12,103 (consisting of a gross inflow of 39,545 and a gross outflow of 27,442). On the basis of this, it is not true to say that, for Northampton, there is a general trend of "out-migration" in terms of commuter flows. The biggest net outflow from Northampton is to Milton Keynes at 2,128. This may be a function of the housing market as the prices of properties in Northampton are significantly lower than those in Milton Keynes.

Attached is an analysis using the same data done for each of the Northants boroughs and districts plus Milton Keynes. It is correct to note that there is a net outflow for South Northants in excess of 11,000 people- the figure is 11,462.

In practical terms, the application site is closer to the centre of Northampton than some of the outer suburbs that fall within Northampton Borough. The distance of the Gateway site from Northampton town centre (measured to All Saints Church) is 5.7km, whereas the distance from Cluniac Court in the east of the borough to the town centre is 7.2km. So whilst it might be argued that the Gateway proposal could in some way be seen as potentially "improving" the balance between inflows and outflows for South Northants, it could argued that the practical impact would be to increase the commuter inflow to the Northampton area.
