

Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange (HNRFI) is a proposed multi-purpose freight interchange and distribution centre located on land to the south of Elmesthorpe, between the Leicester to Hinckley railway to the north-west and the M69 motorway to the south-east.

Strategic Rail Freight Interchanges (SRFIs) are distribution centres which are connected to both the rail and strategic road network, optimising the use of rail in freight journeys. The Government supports the creation of a series of SFRIs across the UK, to reduce lorry movements from the roads and transfer them onto the rail network, reducing both road traffic congestion and carbon emissions.

Before construction can begin we need to apply for and obtain various permissions, including a Development Consent Order (DCO) from the Secretary of State (SoS) for Transport under the Planning Act 2008.

Consultation is a key part of the DCO process, which involves people living within the vicinity of a project to account for their views in preparing the application to be submitted to the SoS.

Our stage one consultations in 2018 introduced HNRFI to the local community, this was followed by a focused highways consultation in 2019. As part of these consultations, more than 75,000 notification letters were sent to residents and businesses in the local area. These consultations allowed us to present the findings of our early technical and environmental work to the local community.

Since 2019 we have undertaken significant further technical and environmental work on HNRFI. This consultation will therefore provide information on our more developed proposals, including infrastructure and mitigation requirements.

The scheme is being brought forward by Tritax Symmetry (Hinckley) Ltd (TSL) and we invite you to share your views on our proposed project in the upcoming stage of statutory consultation. The statutory consultation process runs from Wednesday 12th January until Wednesday 9th March 2022, which will be centred around nine public consultation exhibitions, two webinars and our online consultation, found at: www.hinckleynrfi.co.uk

The National importance of Strategic Rail Freight Interchanges (SRFIs)

In 2014 the Government issued the National Policy Statement for National Networks (NPSNN) which is the primary Policy provision for SRFIs like HNRFI. The policy confirms SRFIs to be Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects (NSIPs).

The Government believes it is important to facilitate the development of the intermodal rail freight industry because the transfer of freight from road to rail has an important part to play in the low carbon economy and in helping to address climate change


and improve the efficiency of the supply chain. For these reasons, a network of SRFIs is needed across the regions.

Co-location of SRFIs with warehousing can support a reduction in HGV movements. The users and buyers of warehousing and distribution services are increasingly looking to integrate rail freight into their transport operations to reduce costs of moving freight and to meet their commitments to net zero in freight transfer.

Government policy acknowledges that in all cases it is essential that developments such as HNFRI have good connectivity with the road and rail networks, in particular the strategic rail freight network to support the reduction in trip mileage of freight movements.

HIGHWAYS IMPROVEMENTS

- A northbound off slip and a southbound on slip would be added to Junction 2 of the M69
- A dedicated site access from Junction 2 of the M69
- 'A47 Link Road' between Junction 2 M69 and the B4668 Leicester Road
- Traffic modelling identifies necessary modifications to several junctions on the local road network, in response to the different traffic flow pattern resulting partly from the proposed HNRFI development and principally from the M69 Junction 2 upgrades as shown on the highways improvement plans:

Meetings were facilitated by the Leicestershire County Council Gypsy and Traveller Liaison Officer, Jacqui Green.

The Tritax team and Jacqui Green met with residents of Aston Firs outside of the Aston Firs site office. A number of visual aids were used in the form of plans as well as a selection of presentation boards used at the public exhibitions. Residents were able to raise concerns and ask questions. Two individual pitches were visited where residents were unable to attend the meeting adjacent to the site office.

The main points raised included:

- Nosie concerns
- Air quality concerns
- Views
- Traffic

Residents asked if Tritax Symmetry would build a new site in the district to replace the Aston Firs site.

Residents queried if the Community Benefit fund could be awarded to individual pitches on site rather than being passed to the District Council for distribution.

Residents of the two Burbages Lane Gypsy and Traveller sites confirmed to Jacqui Green that due to the distance of the HNRFI site from their site they did not feel the development would impact upon them and did not wish to attend the site meeting.

A representative of the Leicester Road Gypsy and Traveller site attended the meeting and did not have any concerns but welcomed the new roundabout onto Leicester Road in that it has the potential to improve access arrangements to the Leicester Road site.

A representative of Rosevale attended the site meeting and did not raise any concerns.

Attempts were made to contact the Irish Traveller site at Acorn Cottage to offer a meeting or telephone call and no response has been received.

Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange Order 202X

Tritax Symmetry (Hinckley) Ltd (TSH) is commencing the statutory consultation on proposals for the Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange (HNRFI).

HNRFI is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) and includes alterations to Junction 2 of the M69 motorway to provide south-facing slip roads and a new highway linking Junction 2 of the M69 motorway with the B4668 Leicester Road. As an NSIP the proposals are determined at a national level by the Government, rather than being determined by the local planning authority. TSH will apply for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to the Secretary of State for Transport.

The rail freight interchange is located on land to the north-east of Hinckley, south of Elmesthorpe, east of the Leicester to Hinckley railway and west of the M69 motorway. The main features of the proposed Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange are:

- New rail infrastructure providing access to the series of parallel sidings
- Intermodal freight terminal ('railport') capable of accommodating up to 16 trains per day of up to 775m in length
- Hard surface areas for container storage
- Up to 850,000m2 GIA of warehousing and ancillary buildings with a total footprint of 650,000m2 and up to 200,000m2 of mezzanine floorspace
- · Lorry park with HGV fuel filling station
- Energy services area incorporating an electricity substation connected to the local distribution network and a gas-fired heat and power plant (10MW generation capacity fed from solar PV including standby capacity (20MW) and battery (20MW)
- Terrain remodelling, hard and soft landscape works, amenity water features and planting
- Noise attenuation measures acoustic barriers up to 6m in height
- Pedestrian, equestrian and cycle access routes and infrastructure
- A new link road from M69 junction 2 to the B4668 / A47 Leicester Road including:
- New access road connecting to an internal road network serving the SRFI
- New rail bridge within the SRFI site
- New junction at B4668 / A47 Leicester Road
- Works to the M69 motorway at Junction 2 comprising:
- Reconfiguration of existing roundabout and approach lanes
- Additional southern slip roads

A DCO is the statutory process for obtaining planning permission for a NSIP. The application is Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development and TSH will submit an Environmental Statement with the Application.

The formal statutory consultation stage on HNRFI will run from 12th January 2022 to 9th March 2022. The deadline for responses to the consultation is 9th March 2022.

SETTLING INTO A NEW AREA!

I moved to Littlethorpe in November 2018. It was a BIG move for me, having grown up and lived most of my adult life in Oxford. But I wanted to be free of the corporate life, a home that was too big with a hefty mortgage. Moving nearer to my youngest daughter and her husband, who were about to start their family, made perfect sense. I stayed with them for a few weeks after selling my cottage and I soon found my perfect home in the perfect location of Littlethorpe; a village, close enough to the countryside walks I love, amenities and services I need and road links back to the family and friends in Oxford

I moved in to my house and started to plan some alterations, but within days I was joined by my daughter, her husband and their 3 week old daughter. Their house purchase had fallen through but the sale of their home had gone ahead. They had found another house in Whetstone and a completion date before Christmas had been promised, but they eventually moved into their new home in February 2019! Fortunately, we all get on ok and are still speaking. While they were with me I had familiarised myself with the area

by pushing my new granddaughter in her pram around the streets and lovely parks of Littlethorpe and Narborough, in vain attempts to get her to sleep!

I was getting to know the area physically but I was not getting to know the community or making new friends. I have always believed it is important to give back to the community where I live by volunteering. Previously, I had been a school governor but I wanted to do something different. So I investigated joining the Parish Council to simultaneously get to know and support the community where I now lived. Narborough Parish Council invited me to join them, by co-opting me, in June 2019. Parish councils are non-political but councillors are usually elected by the community every four years. I had just missed standing in the local elections in May.

Being new to South Leicestershire and Littlethorpe, and to the work of parish councils which are the foundation tier of local government, it took me a while to make sense of it all! Narborough is a large parish and includes Littlethorpe and the Pastures and looks after the parks, open spaces, cemetery, flower beds, Parish Centre, Christmas decorations

and some community events. All councillors are volunteers and some of my fellow councillors have been serving our community for up to 50 years and counting! But that doesn't mean they haven't welcomed my constant questioning about why things are done a certain way and whether the previous good practices still hold true. Nor does it mean that being a Parish councillor is a life sentence! All service, four years or four decades, is valuable.

The Coronavirus epidemic has obviously presented a new challenge for everyone and has delayed some of my plans to get more involved. Nevertheless, I feel I have started to make a real contribution through my involvement with Narborough Parish Council. The work is varied and interesting, ranging from planning community events to providing input on planning applications and trying to influence decisions made at district and county level that have an impact on local people and businesses. We are looking forward to making 2022 another amazing year at Red Hill Field.




PASTURES PINBOARD

NATURE NOTES

Time to begin a new year of nature-watching, so how did last year go? The first half of the year was good for bird-watching with more species than usual putting in an appearance. The highlight for me was 20 minutes spent watching a Barn Owl elegantly quartering a patch of rough ground just a mile down the road from my house. Although they were in serious decline for much of the twentieth century, they seem to have made something of a comeback over the last 25 years. They are very distinctive in appearance but due to their nocturnal habits they are not often recorded, which makes our sighting on a dull morning all the more appreciated. They eat mostly voles, mice and rats - often locating their prey by using their exceptional hearing.



Summer time is the main season for finding insects and last year produced sightings of more species of moths, butterflies, beetles and dragonflies for me than ever before. Many of these species have only recently started to show up in Leicestershire, with climate change enabling them to survive and breed further north than formerly. A recent study has shown that more than 50 species have moved measurably further north within the last decade. However, pleasant though it is to see these new species, the photograph that gave me the most pleasure was of one of our commonest beetles. The 7-spot Ladybird is found

in almost all gardens and is often found hibernating in homes and outbuildings during the winter. What made this photograph special for me was that it can clearly be seen eating the aphids on my plants. Both the adults and their larvae survive entirely on aphids and related insects and they do this so efficiently that I have never found the need to use chemicals in the garden to control the other insects.



As the year came to an end, sightings of animals decreased dramatically and it was the presence of fungi, mosses and lichens that brought a bit of interest to my daily walks. One exception to this in December was the arrival of this cheeky Wood Mouse that turned up to eat the seed spilled from the bird feeders. Families of this small rodent have lived in my garden for more than 40 years without causing a problem.

Altogether this year I have recorded over 1,000 species of wildlife, giving me many hours of pleasure and at the same time contributing to our knowledge of the distribution of our plants and animals. When I started recording, back in 2014, I found only 176 species (mainly in our back garden) and the numbers seen and identified have grown steadily since then. 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

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 -SECTION 14(1)(a) THE A5 TRUNK ROAD (WIBTOFT TO CHURCHOVER) (TEMPORARY RESTRICTION AND PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2022

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that National Highways Limited (Company No. 9346363) has made an order on the A5 Trunk Road, between Wibtoft and Churchover, in the Counties of Leicestershire and Warwickshire, to allow construction of an emergency access into a new industrial park to be carried out.

The effect of the Order will be to-

- (b) the southbound carriageway of the A5 from its junction with Cross in Hand Roundabout, to a point 1200 metres south of the centrepoint of Cross in Hand Roundabout: and
- (3) close-
- (a) the A5 between its roundabout junction with the A426 and Gibbet Lane (Gibbet Roundabout), at Churchover, and its junction with Woodway Lane near Wibtoft; and
- (b) any layby adjacent to the length of the A5 described in (3)(a) above.

The work is expected to start on Thursday 24 Februar 2022 and continue for a month. The closures will be carried out in two phases and are expected to be carried out overnight between 20:00 hours and 08:00 hours starting on Thursday 24 February 20:22 for two nights and then from Sunday 27 March 20:22 for two nights. The speed restrictions will be in operation from 06:00 hours on Saturday 26 February 20:22 for 24 hours a day and continue for the duration of the work. The Order will come into force on 21 February 20:22.

Vehicles being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes will be exempt from the speed restrictions and closures. Vehicles being used for special forces purposes will be exempt from the speed restrictions and vehicles being used in connection with the works or for winter maintenance purposes will be exempt from the closures. Access to properties will be maintained at all times.

Diversion routes via the A426, the A4303, the M1 and the M69 will be signed. Non-motorway traffic diversion routes via the B4114, the B581, Cooper Lane, the A426 and the A4303 and vice versa will be signed.

Extension to Statutory Consultation Period

Tritax Symmetry (Hinckley) Ltd (TSH) is extending the statutory consultation on proposals for the Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange (HNRFI) to the 8th April 2022.

HNRFI is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) and includes alterations to Junction 2 of the M69 motorway to provide south-facing slip roads and a new highway linking Junction 2 of the M69 motorway with the B4668 Leicester Road. As an NSIP the proposals are determined at a national level by the Government, rather than being determined by the local planning authority. TSH intend to make an application for Development Consent Order (DCO) to the Planning Inspectorate.

The rail freight interchange is located on land to the north-east of Hinckley, south of Elmesthorpe, east of the Leicester to Hinckley railway and west of the M69 motorway. The boundary of the DCO is shown edged red on the accompanying plan. The main features of the proposed Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange are:

- New rail infrastructure providing access to the series of parallel sidings
- Intermodal freight terminal ('railport') capable of accommodating up to 16 trains per day of up to 775m in length
- Hard surface areas for container storage
- Up to 850,000m² GIA of warehousing and ancillary buildings with a total footprint of 650,000m² and up to 200,000m² of mezzanine floorspace
- Lorry park with HGV fuel filling station
- Energy services area incorporating an electricity sub-station connected to the local distribution network and a gas-fired heat and power plant (10MW generation capacity fed from solar PV including standby capacity (20MW) and battery (20MW)
- Terrain remodelling, hard and soft landscape works, amenity water features and planting
- Noise attenuation measures acoustic barriers up to 6m in height
- Pedestrian, equestrian and cycle access routes and infrastructure
- A new link road from M69 junction 2 to the B4668 / A47 Leicester Road including:
 - New access road connecting to an internal road network serving the SRFI
 - New rail bridge within the SRFI site
 - New junction at B4668 / A47 Leicester Road
- Works to the M69 motorway at Junction 2 comprising:
 - Reconfiguration of existing roundabout and approach lanes
 - Additional southern slip roads

A DCO is the statutory process for obtaining planning permission for a NSIP. The application is Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development and TSH will submit an Environmental Statement with the Application.

The formal statutory consultation stage on HNRFI is extended from the 9th March 2022 to 8th April 2022. The deadline for all responses to the consultation is 8th April 2022.

The statutory consultation on the proposals for the Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange has now concluded. Thank you for taking part in our consultation and your interest in our proposals.

The Proposals

Tritax Symmetry is bringing forward proposals for the **Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange** (HNRFI) at Junction 2 of the M69. The scheme is considered to be a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP).

The Location

The site is located in what the UK logistics industry regards as the 'Golden Triangle'. The East Midlands is home to a fifth of the UK's manufacturing capability and 45% of British rail freight goes through the Midlands.

Tritax Symmetry's plans look to meet the needs of the logistics industry, including port operators, in serving manufacturers, distributors and retailers by capitalising on the site's locational strengths and connectivity to the railway and motorway networks.



Community Engagement

Tritax Symmetry is committed to engaging with the local community about its proposals. We have already held non-statutory consultations on the proposals between October and December 2018 and a series of exhibitions were held in six venues across the local area which were attended by around 1,500 people. A further focused highways consultation was then held 8th July – 6th September 2019. This included another six public consultation exhibitions which were attended by 1,200 people.

Informal Consultation: 22nd Oct – 7th Dec 2018

Tritax Symmetry undertook a first round of informal pre-application consultation in late 2018, both with statutory consultees, political representatives, community groups, persons with interest in the land, and the community within a zone approximately 3km around the proposed site boundary. The consultation was promoted with direct mail, site notices, public notices, press releases, and social media advertisements.

The consultation comprised eight public exhibitions at venues accessible to the local communities with a range of dates and times. Attendees could submit their feedback via a questionnaire on the website, a paper questionnaire at the public exhibition, via a Community Information Phone Line, dedicated email address, or via post.

The Process

12th January 2022 – 8th April 2022 (extension from 9th March 2022): Formal Consultation

Following formal consultation there will be a fully reasoned response to the feedback received which will inform the submission version of the application and will be recorded in a consultation report which will be submitted as part of the consultation documents.


