1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This document is submitted as part of an application made by *Tritax Symmetry* (*Hinckley*) *Limited* ("the Applicant") to the Planning Inspectorate under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended) for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") to authorise the construction, operation and maintenance of a rail freight interchange including railway sidings and freight transfer area alongside the two-track railway between Hinckley and Leicester ("the Application").
- 1.2 In March 2015 the Department for Communities and Local Government (now the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government) published Planning Act 2008: Guidance on the pre-application process. The guidance offers the following advice on Statements of Common Ground:
 - "47. A statement of common ground is a written statement prepared jointly by the applicant and another party or parties, setting out any matters on which they agree. A statement of common ground is useful to ensure that the evidence at the examination focuses on the material differences between the main parties.
 - 48. Local authorities are encouraged to discuss and work through issues raised by the proposed development with applicants well before an application is submitted. Agreements reached between an applicant and relevant local authorities can be documented in a statement of common ground. This will contain agreed factual information about the application and can accompany the application. The statement of common ground can also set out matters where agreement has not been reached. This can then be looked at during examination.
 - 49. Applicants will also need to identify and consult people who own, occupy or have another interest in the land in question, or who could be affected by a project in such a way that they may be able to make a claim for compensation. This will give such parties early notice of projects, and an opportunity to express their views regarding them."
- 1.3 This purpose of this document is to give a preliminary view of the parties with whom the applicant expects to draft a Statement of Common Ground (SoCG), outlined in Section 2. Further, in Section 3, this document seeks to give a preliminary outline of the anticipated topic commonalities between SoCGs, i.e. matters that are common to more than one SoCG.
- 1.4 This document should be read alongside the other Application documents, in particular the Environmental Statement (ES) (Document reference 6.1-6.3) and the draft protective provisions contained in the draft Development Consent Order (Document reference 2.1).
