The location of the Preliminary meeting is distant and difficult to access from the location of the project particularly from the village of Elmesthorpe. We hope that future meetings will be held at a location within the immediate area - there are several options available. The time of the meeting is also not ideal - early on a weekday morning in the centre of Leicester. As an organisation Save Burbage Common has a presence on social media with over 2K followers and 1.9K likes on Facebook, have had regular meetings and attended the Burbage Common Open Day. There is a lot of concern about how this proposal will effect the Common and its surroundings, including the footpaths and bridleways, we feel this should:
