Development Consent for the Proposed Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange

Project ("the Proposed Development.")

I would like to register my objections to the proposed planning application above. I note that the secretary of state is currently minded to refuse this application, a decision which when confirmed I would welcome. My objections are as follows;

- The proposed National Rail Interchange at Hinckley would be a disaster not just for the town itself but also for Burbage Common, Earl Shilton, Barwell and Stoney Stanton. Indeed residents of Leicestershire and a wider area would also be impacted negatively on health and general wellbeing.
- 2. My concerns are for the environment as a whole with catastrophic damage being caused to areas of natural beauty and wild life.
- 3. The air quality in Earl Shilton and Barwell is currently poor and any development of this kind would be detrimental to residents.
- Air, noise levels and light pollution will all be negatively
  impacted significantly by huge increases of local traffic, both trains and
  vehicles on to already congested roads.
- 5. Earl Shilton was bypassed 15 years ago. Traffic estimates at the time did not take into account a development of this magnitude. There will therefore be a huge increase of traffic both along the bypass and through the town centre.
- 6. There is absolutely no justification for this development on employment grounds. There are plenty of jobs particularly in distribution locally. Magna Park has for a number of years struggled to fill vacancies and is currently expanding. Magna Park is less than 15 minutes from Hinckley. MIRA is another large employer as is DPD.
- 7. More employment in Hinckley would inevitably increase the demand for more

- homes as currently the labour market cannot support Magna Park from its local population. More houses, more people, more traffic, more pollution.
- 8. Increased population would put further pressures on local resources. In particular health and educational needs and policing.
- 9. The development itself takes green space and any additional housing attributed to this takes more green space, farming land and habitat.
- 10. The positioning of this development adjacent to Burbage Common a site of Special Scientific Interest is particularly callous. This is a much used much loved area which must be protected at all cost.

In conclusion I, and I know thousands of others are totally opposed to this potential monster in our midst. I look forward to the Secretary of State confirming the refusal of this application in due course
