	 Funding for local authorities to undertake certain activities with regard to the proposal A question was raised about funding for the local authorities to undertake certain activities in relation to the proposed development. A planning performance agreement (PPA) between the applicant and a relevant LA can be used to provide funding towards the LA undertaking certain agreed activities, such as considering pre-application s.42 consultation documents. The participants asked if planning performance agreements would be a tri-party arrangement between the promoter, the local authority and the Planning Inspectorate. The Planning Inspectorate would not be party to such an agreement.

Outreach The Planning Inspectorate would be willing to carry out outreach events in the area in the event of an application being submitted and accepted for examination by the Secretary of State. At this point, the Planning Inspectorate could arrange outreach events in the area to better enable public participation in an examination.
National Policy Statement (NPS) The participants asked about the policy context for this type of proposal. A key framework document for this type of proposal would be the Draft National Policy Statement on Hazardous Waste (July 2011). The NPS was available on the DEFRA website (http://www.defra.gov.uk/consult/2011/07/14/hazardous- waste/). The PA 2008, specifically s.14(1)(p) and s.30 cover hazardous waste proposals.
